Point #1

- a) Read 1 Timothy 3:11-12. Why would it be unique for there to be qualifications for a Deacon's wife? (i.e., not Elder)
- b) Given "wife" could be interpretated as "woman", how does it change things? How does Romans 16:1-4 help?
- c) Explain the two ways Point #1 could be applied. Be specific. How do you see this playing out at PCC?

Point #2

- a) Read 1 Timothy 3:13. What will be the result of a Deacon who "serves well"? How does this relate to Point #2?
- b) Why is this important to understand? Be specific. In what way can a Deacon's role lose the spiritual focus?
- c) How can this ultimately impact the health of a church? How does Point #2 help you remember the focus?

Daily Devotions

MONDAY // Read 1 Timothy 3:11, Romans 16:1-4

- Given the footnote in your Bible states "wives" could be interpretated as "women", how does this change things?
- In what way does Romans 16:1-4 help clarify two options for the role of a Deaconess? Be specific.
- How does this challenge or confirm your current view of a Deacon being either male or female?

TUESDAY // Read 1 Timothy 3:11, 5:14-15, John 8:42-44

- In your own words, define "slander". Given the Bible defines slander as the "devil", what does this reveal?
- Why is this an important qualification for a Deaconess and wasn't mentioned for a Deacon? Be specific.
- Knowing that it is sinful to slander others, how is God speaking to you about the way you talk about others?

WEDNESDAY // Read 1 Timothy 3:2-10, 12, 1 Peter 5:1-4

- When you compare and contrast the qualifications for an Elder with a Deacon, list what is different or the same.
- In what way does this relate to the different roles they play in the church? Why is this important?
- How does this also relate to accountability to the Lord? Explain how you see this happening at PCC.

THURSDAY // Read 1 Timothy 3:13, Matthew 13:18-23, John 15:5-8

- What will be the result of a Deacon who "serves well"? What is implied about a Deacon who doesn't serve well?
- What does it mean to be in "good standing for themselves"? How does this also relate to a growing faith?
- In what way does the parable of the vine and branch illustrate this truth? Be specific.

FRIDAY // Read 1 Timothy 3:13, 2 Timothy 4:7-8, Matthew 25:14-30

- How does the Apostle Paul describe the Christian life? (i.e., race) What is implied about winning and losing?
- How does the parable of the talents also highlight this same truth? How does this apply to the role of a Deacon?
- How would you rate your progress with Jesus? Be specific. What steps can you take to "serve well"?

SATURDAY // Read 1 Timothy 3:8-13

- As you review the overall Deacon qualifications, how far would you get in the vetting process? Be specific.
- What spiritual qualification would be the most challenging for you? How can this become a growth goal for you?
- In what way does this elevate your respect for PCC Deacons? How can this help PCC become a beautiful church?
