### Point #1

- a) Read 1 Timothy 6:12b. Explain what it means to "take hold" of eternal life. How does "good confession" relate?
- b) How does this relate to Point #1? Why would this principle be transformative in the Christian life? Be specific.
- c) What has been your experience with Point #1? What practical steps will you take to apply Point #1 in your life this week?

### Point #2

- a) Read 1 Timothy 6:13-16. In what way did Paul elevate Timothy's view of Jesus? Be specific. Why?
- b) How does this relate to Point #2? Why is this perspective important for every Christian to keep in place?
- c) In what way does this adjust your perspective of Jesus? How does Point #2 help you be more accountable?

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## Daily Devotions

### **MONDAY // Read 1 Timothy 6:12b, John 14:1-4, 1 Corinthians 15:19, Titus 1:1-3, 1 John 2:24-25**

- Why did Paul tell Timothy to "take hold of eternal life"? What was he trying to prevent from happening?
- In what way was this also a priority check for Timothy? Be specific.
- How is this a priority check for you when it comes to your walk with Jesus? How will you change?

### **TUESDAY // Read 1 Timothy 6:12b, 2 Timothy 1:8, Romans 10:13-15, Matthew 9:36-38**

- In what way does taking hold of eternal life actually point to spreading the Gospel? Be specific.
- Why is this a transformative principle in the Christian life? What does this highlight if you don't share your faith?
- As you think about sharing your faith/inviting people to church, what does this reveal? How will you step it up?

### **WEDNESDAY // Read 1 Timothy 6:13, John 18:28-38**

- Why did Paul relate the "good confession" of Jesus to Timothy's situation? Be specific.
- As you review Jesus standing before Pilate, what confession did He deliver? How does this relate to the Gospel?
- In what way did Paul provide this backdrop as a motivator to Timothy? How does this motivate you?

### **THURSDAY // Read 1 Timothy 6:13-15a, Romans 14:10-12**

- Why did Paul charge Timothy in the "presence of God" and remind him about the return of Jesus?
- How could Timothy have lost sight of that given all his daily challenges? Give an example.
- Explain how a busy life can throw off priorities when it comes to your walk with Jesus. How does his help you?

### **FRIDAY // Read 1 Timothy 6:15b-16, Revelation 5:13-14, 17:14, 19:16**

- Explain what it means that Jesus is King of Kings and Lord of Lords? (i.e., authority, deference, etc.)
- Why was Paul elevating Timothy's perspective toward Jesus? How would this have kept him accountable?
- In what way does today's reading elevate your view of Jesus? Why is it important to keep this perspective in place?

### **SATURDAY // Read 1 Timothy 6:13-16, Acts 9:1-19**

- In what way did Paul experience the truth of 1 Timothy 6:13-16 on his way to Damascus? (i.e., blinded)
- How did this provide both a foundational commitment and accountability in his walk with the Lord?
- Given most people don't have a road to Damascus, how can Paul's perspective still help? Be specific.
