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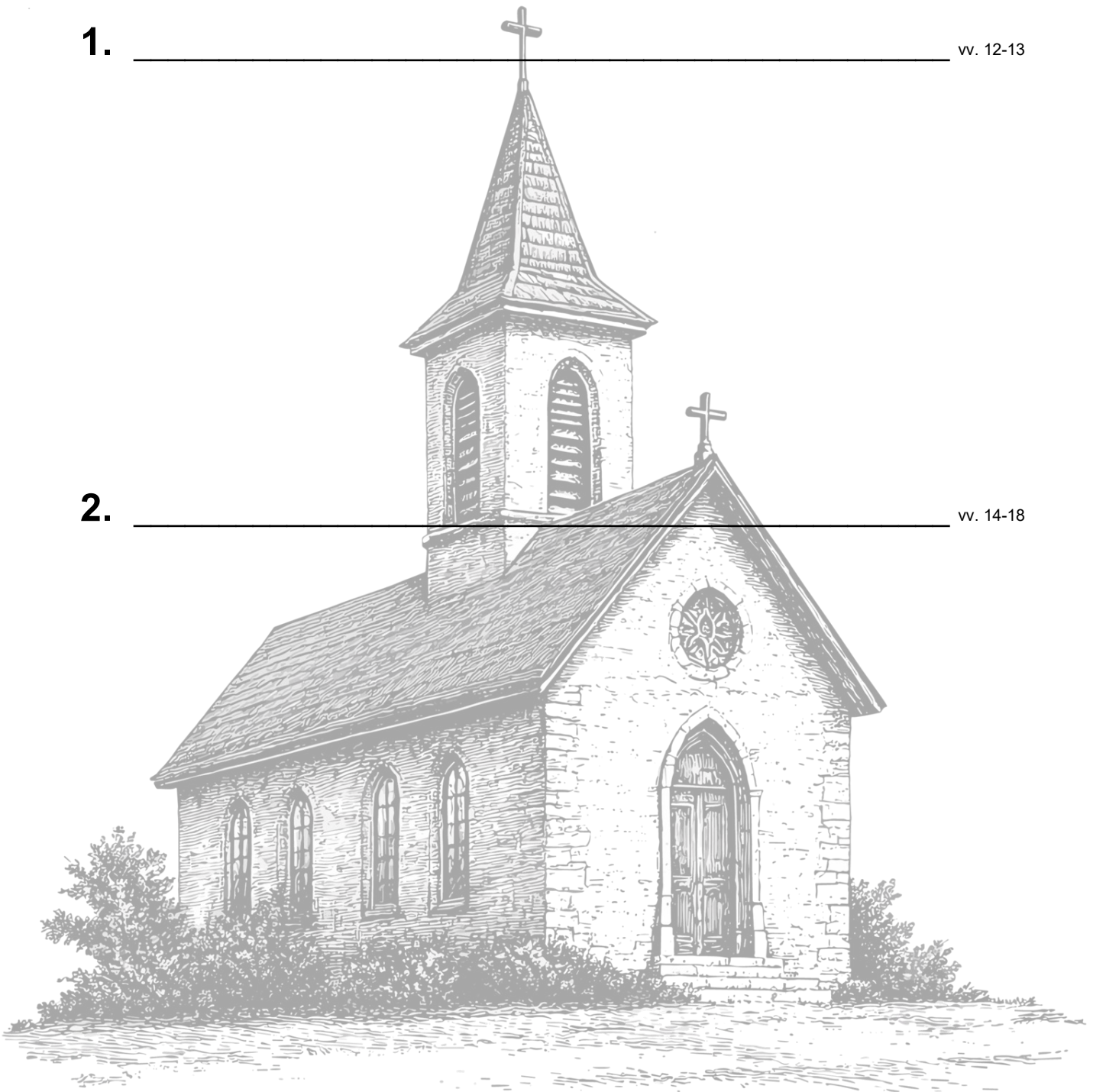

A grow group is 8-16 people who get together weekly to study God's word and the previous Sunday's message. There is a time of discussion, support, encouragement, and learning how the message applies to daily life. **PCC uses the ESV (English Standard Version).**

Point #1

- a) Read 1 Corinthians 12:12-13. What does a physical body highlight about a Christian's relationship to the church?
- b) How does Point #1 relate? What does this imply about an attendance only attitude? How can it happen today?
- c) How does Point #1 challenge your perspective? Be specific. What difference does this make for you?

Point #2

- a) Read 1 Corinthians 12:14-18. What is Paul addressing when it comes to insecurity in the Corinthian church?
- b) In what way were they missing the entire purpose of God's gifting? How does Point #2 highlight this truth?
- c) Explain the difference between attending and participating at PCC. Describe your approach.

Daily Devotions

These are provided for mid-week personal spiritual growth. Prayerfully writing out your answers will help you experience real life transformation as you dig deeper into the spiritual truths of God's word and today's message.

MONDAY // Read 1 Corinthians 12:12-13, 6:5-8, Romans 16:1, Ephesians 5:22-27, 1 Peter 5:1-4

- List the four metaphors scripture uses to describe the church. What is the same between all four?
- What does this imply about church being a building? Why is this important for Christians to understand?
- How does this challenge your current perspective on church? What difference does this make for you?

TUESDAY // Read 1 Corinthians 12:12-13, John 17:20-23, 26, Acts 9:1-5, Ephesians 1:22

- In what way did Jesus describe His relationships to Christians? How would this also apply to the church?
- What does this highlight about the role of "the church" today? (i.e., hands and feet of Jesus)
- Why is it important for Christians to embrace this truth? How can you do a better job of embracing it?

WEDNESDAY // Read 1 Cor. 12:12-13, Matthew 3:11, John 3:5, 2 Corinthians 5:17, Gal. 3:26-28 Titus 3:5-6

- What two things happen spiritually when someone becomes a Christian? How does this relate to church?
- In what way does this highlight the difference between attending and participating in church?
- How does it make you feel knowing you have a spiritual role at PCC? How does it challenge you?

THURSDAY // Read 1 Corinthians 12:14-17, Galatians 3:28, Philippians 2:3

- Why do you think Paul addressed the issue of jealousy when it came to roles in the church?
- How would this mindset have hurt the church? Be specific. How is this a non-Christian mindset?
- In what way have you personally experienced this dynamic? What has been the result?

FRIDAY // Read 1 Corinthians 12:14-17, 12:4-7, Romans 12:3-5, 1 Peter 4:10

- Why does God give Christians spiritual gifts? What can happen if the "purpose" is misunderstood?
- In what way will this negatively impact the effectiveness of a church? How have you seen this happen?
- How have you been blessed by others using spiritual gifts? How does this encourage you to use yours?

SATURDAY // Read 1 Corinthians 12:14-17, 1 Thessalonians 5:11, Hebrews 3:13, 10:25

- What is the foundational truth God wants Christians to understand about treating one another?
- How is this the ultimate goal of going to church? How will this help when using your gifts at PCC?
- How does this perspective challenge your current perspective? Be specific. How can you change?
