

Daily Devotions

These are provided for mid-week personal spiritual growth. Prayerfully writing out your answers will help you experience real life transformation as you dig deeper into the spiritual truths of God's word and today's message. MONDAY // Read Matthew 2:10-13

- Explain how Joseph might have felt when he heard the angel's instructions to escape to Egypt.
- How was God working and providing for Joseph and Mary even in the midst of challenging times?
- What does this teach you about your expectations in the upcoming year? How does it encourage you?

TUESDAY // Read Matthew 2:13-15, 1 Peter 1:1-7, Romans 5:1-5

- In your own words, explain the truth presented in today's scriptures.
- How can challenging times help with spiritual growth? Why is this counterintuitive for daily living?
- What Egypt experience do you need to bring before the Lord? Take time now to pray about it.

WEDNESDAY // Read Matthew 2:13-14, Acts 16:16-34

- How do you respond when you feel hurt, pain, or struggle? How are you tempted to medicate?
- What can happen to your spiritual life when you don't have a biblical view of pain? Be specific.
- How were the experiences of Joseph, Mary, Paul and Silas a testimony to this truth?

THURSDAY // Read Matthew 2:14-18, Psalm 1:1-2, 119:105, 2 Timothy 2:15, 3:16

- How was God encouraging Joseph and Mary by referencing the Old Testament?
- In what way can this same encouragement occur with Christians today? Be specific.
- Describe your experience with the study of God's word in 2025. How can you step it up in 2026?

FRIDAY // Read Matthew 2:17, Jeremiah 31:10-17

- How is Jeremiah 31 both a message of warning and of hope? (Hint: Israel's exile and restoration)
- What was Matthew highlighting about King Herod's murderous actions by referring to Jeremiah 31?
- How was this also a message of warning and of hope? (i.e., sinful actions of man and redemption)

SATURDAY // Read Matthew 2:15, Hosea 11:1, Exodus 12:31-42

- Why was it always important for the Jews to remember the days when they were slaves in Egypt?
- In what way does this relate to Joseph and Mary bringing Jesus out of Egypt after Herod died?
- How would this have been an encouragement? How does this encourage you heading into 2026?
