Point #1

- a) Read Acts 2:1-4a. What metaphors did Luke use to describe the Holy Spirit? Why was this important?
- b) What was the result of the Holy Spirit coming? (i.e., "filled") How does this relate to Point #1? Be specific.
- c) Why will Point #1 happen to every believer? In what way have you experienced this truth? (i.e., before and after)

Point #2

- a) Read Acts 2:4b-12. What was the response of non-believers to the arrival of the Holy Spirit? Why?
- b) In what way did the miracle of tongues (i.e., languages) set-up an opportunity for the Gospel? (c.f., Acts 2:13)
- c) How did this also fulfill Acts 1:8? Given the truth of Point #2, how does this challenge you? Why?

Daily Devotions

These are provided for mid-week personal spiritual growth. Prayerfully writing out your answers will help you experience real life transformation as you dig deeper into the spiritual truths of God's word and today's message.

MONDAY // Read Acts 1:7-8, 12-15, 2:1-4a, Exodus 23:16

- Why did Jesus tell the disciples to stay in Jerusalem? How many disciples were present? What did Pentecost refer to?
- What were the disciples doing in the upper room? What does this highlight about what proceeds the work of the Holy Spirit?
- In what way can you apply this truth this week? How does this also encourage you to be mindful of the Holy Spirit?

TUESDAY // Read Acts 2:1-4a, Exodus 3:2, Matthew 3:11, John 3:8

- What imagery did Luke use to describe the arrival of the Holy Spirit? Why would this have been familiar to Jews?
- In what way does this also highlight the power and presence of the Holy Spirit? Why is this important? Be specific.
- As you consider the trinity and work of the Spirit in your life, how does this adjust your current perspective?

WEDNESDAY // Read Acts 2:1-4a, John 3:1-3, Ephesians 1:13-14, 2 Corinthians 5:17, Titus 3:5

- Why is it important to understand that every person (120) were "filled" with the Holy Spirit?
- How does this apply to Jesus' discussion with Nicodemus? What does this reveal about every true Christian today?
- In what way have you experienced this truth? Be specific. Why is this critical to live the victorious Christian life?

THURSDAY // Read Acts 2:4a, John 14:16-17, 17:17, Galatians 5:22, 2 Corinthians 13:5

- Given the Holy Spirit is God's promise to every believer, what are some ways this can be measured? (i.e., fruit)
- In what way should the spirit of "truth" impact the way you read the Bible and convict you of sin?
- Why is it important for every Christian to self-examine themselves? How does this challenge or encourage you?

FRIDAY // Read Acts 2:4-12, 10:45-48, 19:1-7, Mark 16:17, 1 Cor. 12:8-10, 13:1-2, 8, 14:4-6, 18-19, 22

- As you read about the miracle of "tongues" (i.e., languages) what was the context for its first appearance?
- In what way did non-believers experience this miracle? How did this ultimately relate to evangelism?
- How do you see this different than today's definition and expression of tongues? What does this teach you?

SATURDAY // Read Acts 1:7-8, 2:12-13a, John 16:8-9, 13-14, Matthew 28:19-20, Romans 10:15

- In your own words, explain the ministry of the Holy Spirit as it relates to Jesus? How does Mat. 28:19-20 apply?
- What does this highlight about the priority of the Holy Spirit in fulfilling this mandate? (i.e., "I am with you always")
- How does it make you feel knowing the Holy Spirit is an evangelist, missionary, ambassador for Jesus? How about you?
