Grow Group Discussion Questions

A grow group is 8-16 people who get together weekly to study God's word and the previous Sunday's message. There is a time of discussion, support, encouragement, and learning how the message applies to daily life. **PCC uses the ESV (English Standard Version).**

Point #1

- a) Read Acts 2:13-15. How did the Holy Spirit provide a Gospel opportunity? How did Peter respond? Be specific.
- b) In what way was this a different Peter? (c.f., John 20:19) Why? How does Pt #1 relate? Why is this important to recognize?
- c) Why is this a key requirement when it comes to being an unstoppable church? How does Point #1 encourage you to step up?

Point #2

- a) Read Acts 2:16-21. Why did Peter quote the prophet Joel? In what way did this keep the crowds focused on God?
- b) Why is this important when talking about Jesus? What will it prevent? How does Point #2 challenge your approach?
- c) In what way can Friday's daily devotion help you? How can your Grow Group keep you accountable? Be specific.

Daily Devotions

These are provided for mid-week personal spiritual growth. Prayerfully writing out your answers will help you experience real life transformation as you dig deeper into the spiritual truths of God's word and today's message.

MONDAY // Read Acts 2:6-14, Acts 1:8

- Explain the two ways the Holy Spirit demonstrated its arrival? Why did the crowd think the disciples were drunk?
- In what way was this a set-up for Acts 1:8 to take place? (c.f., Acts 2:12) How has this been misinterpreted today?
- What does this highlight about the Holy Spirit's role in evangelism? How does this encourage you to share your faith?

TUESDAY // Read Acts 2:14, Matthew 26:69-75, John 20:19, Matthew 10:32

- Describe Peter's response to the arrest and crucifixion of Jesus. Why did he end up hiding in a room with the disciples?
- What was the primary change that took place once Peter rec'd the Holy Spirit? How was it supernatural and not learned?
- In what way is this a reminder to all Christians when it comes to sharing the Gospel? How does it challenge you?

WEDNESDAY // Read Acts 2:14, 4:1-31

- Describe the political landscape when the disciples were sharing the good news of Jesus publicly? Be specific.
- How did the disciples respond? What does this highlight about taking risks & the required steps of faith to share Jesus?
- Why is this important to recognize? How does this help motivate you or adjust your expectations for Gospel opportunities?

THURSDAY // Read Acts 2:16-21, Joel 2:28-32, Matthew 24:27-30, 1 Peter 3:15

- How did Peter set the stage for sharing the Gospel? Be specific. How did this relate to his Jewish audience?
- In what way did he model the same approach Jesus used? (c.f., Mt. 24:27-30) Why is this important to remember?
- How will this keep people focused on God and prevent your personal opinions from getting in the way?

FRIDAY // Read Acts 2:16-21, Romans 3:23, 6:23, 5:8, 10:9-10

- Given Peter pointed the crowd to an Old Testament passage, what does this highlight about God's word and the Gospel?
- How can today's passages help you share the Gospel? Write out each Romans passage & summarize its application.
- Take time this week to pray and memorize today's passages from Romans. Have a friend keep you accountable.

SATURDAY // Read Acts 2:13-21, Luke 10:2, Romans 10:14-15

- Given this is the first time the Gospel has been preached without Jesus present, how did the Holy Spirit help?
- Why will an unstoppable Gospel lead to an unstoppable church? In what way will this be an answer to Luke 10:2?
- How has this week's focus encouraged you to be bolder in your faith? As a result, what practical steps will you take?
