Grow Group Discussion Questions

Point #1

- Read Acts 4:34-5:5. Explain the difference between Barnabas and Ananias when it came to giving to God. Be specific.
- How does God's response highlight Pt. #1? Given this was the first problem in the church, how is this a warning to you?
- In what way does this challenge your perspective about giving? How do you need to rethink your giving at PCC?

Point #2

- Read Acts 5:6-11. In what way did Sapphira have an opportunity to repent that wasn't given to Ananias?
- How does her response highlight Point #2? What has been your experience with Point #2 in your tithes and offerings?
- What does a minimalist approach reveal? Given God's promise (c.f. 2 Cor. 9:6-8), how will you be more generous?

Daily Devotions

These are provided for mid-week personal spiritual growth. Prayerfully writing out your answers will help you experience real life transformation as you dig deeper into the spiritual truths of God's word and today's message.

MONDAY // Read Acts 4:34-5:2

- How did the 1st century church members handle their finances with regard to God? (c.f., Acts 4:34)
- How was the land deal with Barnabas different than the land deal with Ananias? Be specific.
- In what way was this a departure from the commitment of the overall church? How is this different today?

TUESDAY // Read Acts 5:1-4, Joshua 7:1-13

- What did Peter accuse Ananias of doing? How does Joshua 7:1-13 also highlight this truth?
- What does this imply about how you should view your finances, assets, etc. in terms of ownership?
- In what way have you processed this truth in light of giving to PCC? How does this challenge or encourage you?

WEDNESDAY // Read Acts 5:1-5, Matthew 6:24, 1 Timothy 6:10

- What does the immediate death of Ananias highlight about God's view toward greed and materialism? Be specific.
- In what way was God both disciplining Ananias and also protecting the church? How have you minimized this issue?
- Given mishandling of money was the first problem to occur in the 1st Christian church, how is God speaking to you?

THURSDAY // Read Acts 5:6-10

- Describe the difference between Ananias and Sapphira when it comes to an opportunity to repent.
- What does this highlight about spiritual challenges and being honest with yourself about tithes and offerings?
- How can you fall into the Ananias and Sapphira trap? Give an example. What growth steps will you take this week?

FRIDAY // Read Acts 5:6-10, 2 Corinthians 9:6-8

- Given the warning that both Ananias and Sapphira provide, how does God also encourage Christians in giving?
- What promise is provided for those who are generous in their tithes and offerings? What has been your experience?
- In what way can you be more generous in your giving and trust God for His provision? Be specific.

SATURDAY // Read Acts 5:1-11, Matthew 16:13-23

- Who did Peter blame when it came to confronting Ananias with his greed? How did Peter have experience with this?
- How does this provide all of us a spiritual warning when it comes to tithes and offerings in the church? (i.e., Satan)
- What strikes you as the most significant truth in this week's story? What will be your personal application?
