



On a sabbath, a kind teacher named Jesus went to have dinner at the home of a very important man. The other guests watched Jesus closely, wondering what he would do.




Jesus watched as the guests arrived. He noticed how they all hurried to choose the best seats, the places of honor right next to the host.




Seeing this, Jesus decided to tell them a story. "When someone invites you to a wedding feast," he said, "do not sit down in the most important seat."




"What if," Jesus continued,

seat."




"How embarrassing it would be to have to move to the lowest place in front of everyone!"




"Instead, when you are invited, go and sit in the lowest place. Be humble."




"Then, when your host comes, he may say, 'My friend, move up to a higher position!' You will be honored in front of all the other guests."
