Introduction



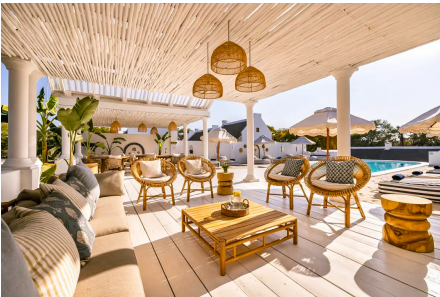
Botswana's famed Kalahari Desert holds some of the largest natural salt pans on the planet—some so large they're even visible from space. Most of the year, the pans are a dry savanna studded with thorn trees. But for a few weeks following the rainy season, the entire landscape transforms into a sea of fresh-sprouted grass, acacia-dotted islands, and rain-fed waterholes. A host of wildlife is attracted to this seasonal feast, including tens of thousands of zebra. The zebra walk more than 150 miles from the Chobe River to reach the Kalahari's Nxai Pans and Makgadikgadi Pans—making the longest documented land-mammal migration in southern Africa. We've crafted a WT-style mobile-camping safari to witness this epic migration and we'll also find the zebras' predators, including lion, hyena, and cheetah, and species not found elsewhere in Botswana, including springbok and gemsbok. We even have a special opportunity to see meerkats as they emerge from their burrows to scan the horizon and begin foraging for the day. Our private Hemingway-style mobile camps are set up for our groups alone, and we've included a night in a special "sleep out" camp with open-air beds under the African sky. Our camps provide solitude and comfort in the wild, great meals, and custom-built 4WD vehicles for exploration. The wide-open plains of the salt pans make for incredible game viewing, and at night, the sky above is a symphony of stars. Join us for a fascinating wildlife adventure!

DAY 1 MAUN, BOTSWANA / GRAYS EDEN

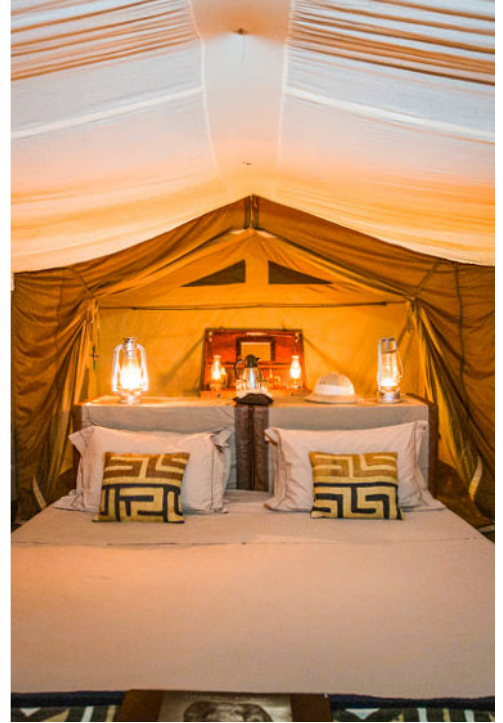
Upon arrival in Maun, Botswana, you'll be met for a transfer to Grays Eden, set near the Thamalakane River. The lodge's villas and cottages offer a wonderful welcome to Botswana. The rest of the day is free to rest and recover after the long flight, or enjoy some of the lodge's amenities including their outdoor pool. We gather for our trip orientation and Welcome Dinner in the evening.

Overnight: Grays Eden

With its five villas and seven cottages set on property facing the Thamalakane River, Grays Eden is the perfect place to unwind (or acclimate) for your Botswana safari. Stylish guest rooms feature high ceilings and light-filled interiors with modern, minimalist design. Relax by the outdoor pool or indulge in a soothing treatment at the spa. There is also an onsite restaurant.

Overnight: Botswana Mobile Safari Camping

Our private safari camps, set up for our groups alone, put you in the prime spot for phenomenal game viewing and direct access to pristine sections of the parks. You'll camp in a wonderful variety of locations, all far from the lodges, and be surrounded by Botswana's most magnificent terrain in absolute comfort. Driving Time (Day 2): Approximately 5 hours (3 on paved roads, 2 on sand tracks)

DAYS 2-4 BAINES' BAOBABS / NXAI PAN NATIONAL PARK / MOBILE CAMP

We head to our first mobile camp in Nxai Pan National Park, set within the northern area of Makgadikgadi Pans National Park. En route we'll stop to visit Baines' Baobabs, a photogenic grove of ancient trees named for the artist-geographer Thomas Baines, who accompanied Livingstone on his second African expedition. Makgadikgadi has a dramatic lunar landscape that is a complete contrast to Botswana's verdant Okavango and Linyanti regions. But from November to March, the seasonal rains transform the Makgadikgadi into a world of powder-blue lakes that become a hub of wildlife activity, including the impressive zebra migration. We'll explore the surrounding area of Nxai Pan by vehicle on the lookout for species such as the dainty springbok and desert-adapted gemsbok (or southern oryx). We'll also be watching for the zebra herds that move through here in search of fresh grazing.

Itinerary



Overnight: Makgadikgadi Sleep-Out Camp

When was the last time you slept in a bed with a million stars overhead? Our special sleep-out camp features all the amenities of our regular mobile camps but instead of tents, we have comfortable outdoor beds under the stars. While there are no walls to your room, no animals will bother us here in the middle of the salt pans. A bucket shower and toilet are secluded behind a canvas screen. Warm water is available for showers and dinner and breakfast are served alfresco. Lightweight tents are also available in the very unlikely event of rain.

Driving Time: Approximately 4 hours (2 on paved roads, 2 on sand tracks)

DAY 5 MAKGADIKGADI PANS NATIONAL PARK / SPECIAL SLEEP OUT

A morning drive brings us to a lunar landscape for an unforgettable adventure—a wilderness sleep-out under a blanket of stars—and an authentic experience of the natural world. Camping in the wild in the Makgadikgadi Pans National Park offers total immersion in this unique wilderness in safety and seclusion. Our special sleep-out camp features all the amenities of our regular mobile camps but instead of tents, we have comfortable outdoor beds under the stars (we'll have lightweight tents available in the very unlikely event of rain).

Itinerary



Overnight: Botswana Mobile Safari Camping

Our private safari camps, set up for our groups alone, put you in the prime spot for phenomenal game viewing and direct access to pristine sections of the parks. Driving Time (Day 6): Approximately 3 hours, transitioning from the edge of the salt pans to low mopane forests

DAYS 6-7 MAKGADIKGADI PANS NATIONAL PARK / ZEBRAS, MEERKATS, AND MORE

Departing our sleep-out camp, we head out on the salt pans in search of meerkats. Research scientists have habituated several family groups of these endearing suricates (*Suricata suricatta*), a small species of mongoose. We should be able to get very close to the more habituated groups. Meanwhile, our camp crew will be setting up our mobile camp for Days 6 and 7 in an ideal spot overlooking the immensity of the pans. On early morning and late afternoon outings by vehicle and on foot, we search for migrating herds of zebra. We will also look for lesser-known mammals such as bat-eared foxes, honey badgers, and a host of other desert-adapted animals, including their often-elusive predators.

Itinerary



Overnight: Meno a Kwena Tented Camp

Meno a Kwena Tented Camp is perched on a rocky bluff above the Boteti River in Botswana, perfectly suited for visiting the Makgadikgadi Pans. There are nine spacious en suite Meru-style tents furnished with beds. In addition, there is a traditional fenced boma and a relaxing lounge area overlooking the waterhole below, where views include a menagerie of animals, from herds of elephant to nomadic zebra. The camp also has a viewing hide at the waterhole for excellent access to the visiting animals and great photo opportunities.

DAYS 8-10 MAKGADIKGADI PANS NATIONAL PARK / MENO A KWENA LODGE / MAUN / DEPART

Our final two nights are at Meno a Kwena Tented Camp, set on a bluff overlooking the Boteti River in the western Makgadikgadi. The camp's nine spacious tents have beautiful views over the river. We can take game drives to look for the abundant wildlife at waterholes along the Boteti River. The camp even has a floating game-viewing hide at the river, a great place to see everything from elephants to eagle owls. The camp kitchen is open-air, with everything cooked over the open fire. For those who just want to relax, there is a small pool, a bar, a cool and shady deck, and a large lounge area with spectacular views. Our Farewell Dinner is on Day 9. On Day 10, we'll be transferred back to Maun by road in time for onward international flights.

PRIVATE BATHROOMS

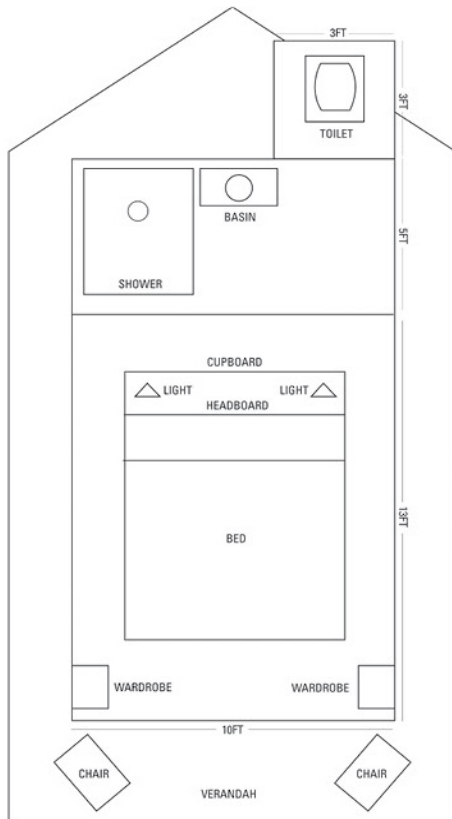
At the rear of the tent is your en suite bathroom, with a warm-water shower, sink, and toilet.

Each day on safari unfolds in its own unique way—this is what makes the experience so wonderfully alive. Our schedule is planned around the optimum times for seeing and photographing the wildlife, and we keep things flexible to make the most of any special opportunities that come along—that's the beauty of being on a small group safari. We'll let nature make the final call!

5:30 AM

Wake up call is early—but it is worth it, as morning is when the animals are very active. Savor a fresh-brewed cup of coffee or tea and continental breakfast, then we'll head out on our morning wildlife drive or walk, with refreshments served midway, and cozy blankets in the vehicles if the morning is chilly.

11:00 AM

We're welcomed back to camp for lunch and time to relax, read, or watch wildlife activity at the local water hole.

3:30 PM

After a mid-afternoon snack, we head out for afternoon game viewing. Our

Trip Leader and game spotters are phenomenal in their ability to track wildlife.

SUNSET

Indulging in a wonderful safari tradition, we'll pause in our game viewing to enjoy a "sundowner" cocktail at a scenic spot and watch the setting sun fill the sky with color.

7:30 PM

Back in camp, we freshen up, then gather to savor dinner and stories. Take a seat by the campfire for a nightcap below the star-filled African sky, then head to your tent to drift to sleep to the sounds of the night.

AMONG THE ELEPHANTS AND RHINOS EXTENSION

Magnificent Hwange National Park, one of the largest national parks in Africa, is home to some 40,000 elephants along with lion, hippo, cheetah, and more. You'll also have the unique opportunity to visit two white rhinos at the Ngamo Rhino Sanctuary in Hwange—these are the first white rhinos to be reintroduced in this part of Zimbabwe. Enjoy game drives with the flexibility to get out and walk, lantern-lit dinners in the bush, a ride on a vintage railway car, and a walk to school with the local kids (you'll even learn a few words of their click language). *4 days. From \$2795.*



CAPE TOWN EXTENSION

The town where modern South Africa was born has a glorious location on the mountainous Cape Peninsula along the blue waters of Table Bay. There is much to see, from Table Mountain to the Cape Point Nature Reserve, where the African continent ends. *4 days. From \$1995.*



VICTORIA FALLS EXTENSION

Victoria Falls, or Mosi-oa-Tunya, “the smoke that thunders,” is one of Africa's most famous sights. Here the mile-wide Zambezi River drops 300 feet into a sheer chasm to create a spectacular thundering cascade. Above the falls, the river is placid, with palm-fringed islands and rainforested banks. In 1860, Scottish missionary and explorer David Livingstone was the first Westerner to report the existence of this mile-wide cascade, and he named this magnificent wonder for his queen. Since then, it has attracted visitors from around the world. The Zambezi River marks the border between Zambia and Zimbabwe, and visitors can walk across a bridge to view the falls from both countries. *3 days. From \$1545.*

ARRIVAL & MEETING PLACE

Suggested Airport: Maun Airport (MUB)

Suggested Date & Time: Day 1, before 2:00 pm

Meeting Place: Upon arrival, you will be met by your Trip Leader or WT representative outside the arrivals hall at the Maun Airport.

DEPARTURE

Suggested Airport: Maun International Airport (MUB)

Suggested Date & Time: Day 10, after 1:00 pm

At the end of the trip (Day 10) we will transfer you to the Maun Airport to check in for flights departing after 1:00 pm. If you'd like to extend your stay to Victoria Falls, transportation and accommodation arrangements can be made at an additional cost.

INTERNATIONAL AIR TRAVEL

You are responsible for making your own arrangements for flights to and from Botswana.

There are many online consolidator websites for booking travel, but for more personal help arranging air transport, you can contact Exito Travel at 970-818-8459 in the US or Canada. They are very adept at putting flight itineraries together, to even the most far-flung places. More information can be found on Exito's website at www.exitotravel.com.

Depending on your routing, it is necessary to depart from the US one or possibly two days prior to Day 1 of the trip itinerary. The name on your airline ticket must match the name on your passport exactly, and your passport must be valid for at least six months after your date of return to the US.

Please do not purchase your tickets until you are confirmed on the trip and have reviewed your proposed air schedule with our office. Once tickets are purchased, please forward a copy of your email flight confirmation from the airline.

DANIEL SECHI

Daniel was born in Lobatse, Southern Botswana, and as a youth, heard many stories about the bush from his father, a well-respected tracker. His first introduction to the wilds of Botswana began when he joined a wildlife club in primary school, and he finished high school in the Ghanzi district, right next to the Khutsi/Central Kalahari game reserve. After finishing school, Daniel applied for a position at the Botswana Department of Wildlife and National Parks and was immediately given a post as a game ranger in Chobe National Park where he worked from 1999 to 2005. He also worked in the anti-poaching unit during his time there. Daniel earned his Professional Guide License in 2008 and started guiding at a lodge in the Northern Okavango, but quickly moved on to the more demanding but rewarding mobile safari sector. His passion is the bush but his love is for family—he is a father of four and also cares for his sister's children.



EZEKIEL DITSHAMEKO

Born in a village on the edge of the Okavango panhandle, Ezi's love of the outdoors began at a very young age. After graduating business school and working as a Botswana police officer for several years, he returned to the bush and became a safari guide working for a lodge on the Linyanti river in northern Botswana before finding his passion for mobile safari guiding and joining our team. With 25 years of experience as a safari guide, Ezi considers the wild areas of Botswana his backyard. His huge smile and deep laugh are very infectious—his deep voice has earned him the nickname Kgosi (Chief) among the crew!

What to Expect

WHAT THE TRIP IS LIKE

This trip is rated **Level 2, Easy to Moderate**. It is a vehicle-based camping safari, with five nights in our mobile private camps, one night in a simple lightweight sleep-out camp, and three nights in lodges. It will be enjoyed by anyone in reasonably good health. Although the trip is not rigorous, it does involve some long driving days over rough roads and game tracks. Any African safari is an adventure, and the traveler to Africa should bring along flexibility, a sense of humor, curiosity about new peoples and places, and an openness to the unexpected.

TERRAIN

The great grass plains of the Makgadikgadi and the associated pan complexes of Sowa, Ntwetwe, and Nxai lie southeast of the Okavango Delta. Relics of one of the world's largest super lakes, these pans dried up thousands of years ago as a result of tectonic activity in the Earth's crust. The Makgadikgadi was formed some five million years ago and was once almost 100 feet deep covering an area of 8,600 square miles. As the water evaporated, huge glistening salt-encrusted pans remained which, in the heat of the day, are transformed into mirages.

WEATHER

The best game viewing period is during the "dry" season, which runs from late March to October. Because of the minimal rainfall during this season, the bush turns golden brown and in many areas is beaten flat, so game viewing is easier and animals concentrate around major water sources. The Okavango Delta's water level starts to rise during these months. October to April can be very hot, with most of the rainfall between December and February. This season characteristically has hot sunny days with afternoon thundershowers. This season is excellent for the viewing of newborn mammals, summer flowers, and the migration of rare birds. Predator viewing during this time remains quite good.

ACCOMMODATIONS

Our mobile tented camping safaris in Botswana provide a true bush experience without sacrificing comfort. Our comfortable walk-in tents feature cozy beds, linens, tent lamps, and have en suite bathrooms with a toilet, mirror, sink, and hot water shower. Our crew sets up camp and prepares all meals. Delicious food is served in a comfortable dining tent. You'll find camping delightful and very comfortable, and you will appreciate how close to nature you feel, away from the lights and distractions of the lodges. We spend one overnight (Day 5) in a simple lightweight sleep-out camp that allows us access to very remote areas. For this night, there are outdoor beds under the stars and a shared toilet tent.

CUISINE

Our local chefs are trained in a wide range of culinary skills, including mastering the art of preparing three-course meals on an open fire and baking fresh bread every day using a traditional Dutch oven. If there is one thing we are sure of, it's that you will never go hungry on our safari.

What to Expect

TRANSPORTATION

We travel by Toyota 4WD Land Cruiser "go-anywhere" safari vehicles equipped with a refrigerator for cold drinks, AC power outlets for charging your devices, and a reference library on flora, fauna, and avifauna. The vehicles carry five trip members, with guaranteed window seating. During drives and walks, we can at times get quite close to wild animals. Being very quiet improves everybody's chances of observation. In the interest of safety, your Trip Leader explains limitations on movement while on game drives, in the safari vehicles, and around camp. Incidents with wild animals are extremely rare on safaris, but no trip can guarantee immunity from such incidents. Wilderness Travel is not to be held responsible for incidents involving the behavior of wildlife.
