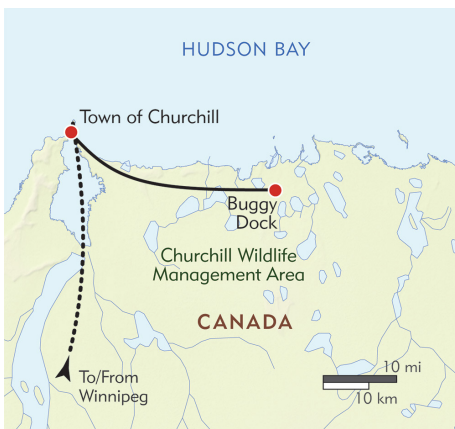

Churchill Polar Bear Expedition



Lying on the edge of Hudson Bay, Churchill, Manitoba, is one of the best places to see polar bears in the wild. Aboard a specially designed Tundra Buggy®, this hotel-based adventure allows you to experience the excitement of polar bear viewing in total safety and comfort. Expert guides and researchers from Polar Bears International (PBI)—the world’s leading polar bear conservation group—will join you on the buggies and at the lodge, and allow travelers to not just see polar bears but learn about them in a way that will leave a depth of knowledge about these majestic animals. You’ll also search for other subarctic wildlife, including arctic fox and ptarmigan, and have the opportunity to take in the eclectic charm of this remote northern town. A bonus—you’ll have a chance to race through the boreal forest with a local dog musher and a team of enthusiastic sled dogs by joining in the traditional northern sport of dog sledding. If you’re seeking an authentic Canadian adventure in the Far North, look no further!

DAY 1 WINNIPEG, CANADA

Arrive in Winnipeg and transfer on your own to the hotel, the Lakeview Signature by Wyndham. It's just a quick five-minute walk across the street from the airport and there's also a complimentary shuttle service. In the evening, meet with your guide for an orientation to the exciting days ahead. You'll have a chance to ask last-minute questions and learn more about what your adventure holds. Overnight at hotel...meals on your own

Note: Many travelers like to arrive a day early to avoid any potential flight delays. Additional nights can be booked upon request.

DAY 2 FLY TO CHURCHILL

After an early breakfast, transfer to a private hangar for the flight to Churchill (2.5 hours). Upon arrival, head right out for a driving tour of Churchill with a stop at the Manitoba Conservation's Polar Bear Holding Facility. (This is where polar bears who have been troublesome are isolated before they can be relocated.) After lunch at a family-run restaurant in town, we head to the Parks Canada Visitor Centre for a look at its in-depth displays revealing the remarkable history of Churchill, dating back to the fur trade era and beyond. Return to the hotel to freshen up before dinner. Overnight at hotel...BLD

DAY 3 SEARCH FOR POLAR BEARS / CHURCHILL WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT AREA

After breakfast, you are picked up from the hotel and taken to the Tundra Buggy



Dock, where after a safety speech from the driver, you'll board the buggy and travel into the Churchill Wildlife Management Area (CWMA). As the driver navigates bumpy trails in search of polar bears and other subarctic wildlife, you'll learn about the geology and history of the area from your knowledgeable interpretive guide, as well as how the bear's physique allows it to dominate the Arctic. If you're lucky, you might see some "head wagging," a sign that polar bears want to play! Enjoy a picnic lunch right aboard the Tundra Buggy as you watch and photograph wildlife. After an incredible first day on the tundra, return to the hotel for dinner followed by a cultural presentation by a local trapper who shares his way of life in the north through the four distinct and beautiful seasons of Churchill...BLD

DAY 4 DOGSLEDDING / ITSANITAQ MUSEUM

Your second day in Churchill is all about the northern culture. This morning, you'll go on a dog sledding excursion with local dog musher Dave Daley. You'll hear stories, meet the pack, and head out on a short dogsled ride through the boreal forest. Then it's back to town for lunch at a local restaurant. In the

afternoon, visit the Itsanitaq Museum, filled with an enormous collection of Inuit artifacts that honor Churchill's indigenous culture and history, including traditional carvings and kayaks. Overnight at hotel...BLD

DAY 5 SEARCH FOR WILDLIFE

It's another great day on the tundra and you'll once again search for polar bears and other wildlife in the Churchill Wildlife Management Area, with lunch aboard the buggy. Return to town for dinner, then transfer to the airport for an evening flight to Winnipeg. Overnight at the Lakeview Signature by Wyndham...BLD

DAY 6 DEPART WINNIPEG

Walk across the street (or take the complimentary shuttle) to the airport and depart on homeward-bound flights.

In Churchill, we stay at one of the following properties, based on availability—the Tundra Inn, Polar Inn, or Aurora Inn. These hotels are small and family owned. They are the best in the area that offer private facilities for each room. They are not “luxury” hotels, but all are well maintained, clean, and comfortable. Hotels will be assigned based on availability at the time of the trip and requests cannot be promised due to the size of each hotel and limited availability. If you have a mobility issue, please notify us ahead of time so appropriate rooming can be provided.

ARRIVAL & MEETING PLACE

Suggested Airport: Winnipeg James Armstrong Richardson International Airport (YWG)

Suggested arrival time: anytime before 7:30 pm. You will meet with the group at 9:00 pm at the hotel, which is just a short walk from the airport. A complimentary shuttle is also available.

Suggested Airport: Winnipeg James Armstrong Richardson International Airport (YWG)

Suggested departure time: anytime

On Day 5, an evening flight brings you from Churchill back to the hotel in Winnipeg for overnight. On Day 6, walk across the street to the airport (or take the shuttle) and depart on homeward-bound flight.

INTERNATIONAL AIR TRAVEL

You are responsible for making your own arrangements for flights to and from Winnipeg. There are many online consolidators for booking travel, but for more personal help arranging air transport, you can contact Exito Travel at 970-818-8459 in the US or Canada. They are very adept at putting flight itineraries together, to even the most far-flung places. More information can be found at www.exitotravel.com.

Depending on your routing, it may be necessary to depart from the US one day prior to Day 1 of the trip itinerary. The name on your airline ticket must match the name on your passport exactly, and your passport must be valid for at least six months after your date of return to the US.

Please do not purchase your tickets until you are confirmed on the trip. Once tickets are purchased, please forward a copy of your email flight confirmation from the airline. It is your responsibility to ensure your flight times coordinate with the arrival and departure logistics for this trip.

What the Trip is Like

WHAT THE TRIP IS LIKE

This trip is rated Level 1+, Easy, and is appropriate for anyone in good health who is physically active. Tundra Buggy vehicles are used to explore the Churchill Wildlife Management Area in search of polar bears and there is an optional dog sled ride. Some agility is required for getting in and out of vehicles and exploring towns where walkways may be icy or snowy, so you must feel confident and stable on your feet.

WEATHER

The weather in Churchill varies greatly from season to season, and the wind coming off of Hudson Bay can often make temperatures feel even cooler than reported. Temperatures can vary from -20°C to 0°C (-4°F to 32°F), but strong winds can make the temperature colder (the “wind chill” factor). The Buggies are heated; however, when we see bears, windows go down and the interior quickly cools. Dressing in warm layers is the best way to stay comfortable. There is a service to rent arctic clothing ahead of time and pick it up upon arrival. Please ask our Area Specialist for details.

Daylight in Churchill During your adventure you can expect approximately 9 hours of daylight. The later in the season, the fewer hours of daylight there are.

Weather patterns over Hudson Bay in autumn can make the sky quite overcast. Please keep in mind that any Northern Lights are considered a bonus instead of a guarantee during these departures.

TRANSPORTATION

The Tundra Buggy® is specially designed for the northern landscape, these all-terrain vehicles enable you to safely experience wildlife. Venturing on a network of established trails in the Churchill Wildlife Management Area, the Tundra Buggy takes you to the best locations in Churchill to view and photograph wildlife. You'll be out for most of the day—6 to 8

hours—so bring everything you need to be comfortable for the day. You'll enjoy lunch aboard the buggy—soup, sandwiches, cookies, and both hot and cold drinks. There is a single-use bathroom at the back of the buggy. The vehicles have a maximum of 40 passengers, but this trip is capped at 22 guests, allowing maximum spacing and window access for viewing and photography.

Polar Bear Alert Program

Autumn is Churchill's polar bear season, meaning this time of year is when they are most active in the region. Always practice bear safety during your time in Churchill.

Polar bears spend much of their year roaming the ice of Hudson Bay hunting seals. When the ice begins to melt in July, the bears come ashore and remain on land until the bay freezes over in late November. While on land in the summer, the bears eat little and are quite inactive. But as autumn approaches, they begin to move northward along the coast and congregate where the first winter ice forms. This annual movement brings many bears into the town of Churchill each year.

Manitoba Conservation and the Town of Churchill have worked hard to educate the people of Churchill and visitors about polar bears and how to avoid potentially dangerous situations. Manitoba Conservation operates the Polar Bear Alert Program, which has the following objectives:

- To protect people and property from the dangers posed by the presence of polar bears
- To ensure the conservation of polar bears and avoid undue harassment and killing of bears
- To prevent polar bears in the Churchill area from becoming conditioned to scavenging for food or developing other problem behaviors
- To protect Manitoba Conservation staff who work in the Polar Bear Alert Program

If you encounter a polar bear:

- Stay calm
- Stay with your group
- Back away, facing the bear at all times
- Do not turn and run away
- Do not play dead
- Get into your vehicle or a building as fast as possible
- Call the Polar Bear Alert line at 204-675-2327 (204-675-BEAR)
