DAY 1 SAN JOSE

Late evening arrival in San Jose, capital of Costa Rica, where you will be met and transferred to the Hotel Bougainvillea, set among 10 acres of lush tropical gardens in San Jose's residential district of San Domingo de Heredia...Meals on your own

DAY 2 MONTEVERDE / EL REFUGIO RESERVE

We enjoy a Welcome Breakfast and a trip orientation at 7:00 am this morning in San Jose, then head out for a drive up into the highlands to the spectacular Monteverde Biological Cloud Forest Reserve. This world-famous reserve, set at 4,600 feet in the Tiláran Mountains straddling the Continental Divide, was founded in 1951 by a small group of Quakers from Alabama, attracted to Costa Rica by its lack of an army and its peaceful policies that matched Quaker philosophy. They bought land and brought dairy farming and cheese production to the region (today, Monteverde's cheese is sold throughout the country). They preserved about a third of the land they purchased to protect the watershed above Monteverde, and in 1972, after visiting biologists noted the richness of the flora and fauna, the Quakers turned it into Monteverde Biological Cloudforest Reserve, owned and operated by the Tropical Science Center of San Jose. After settling into the Monteverde Lodge, we'll explore the grounds with our guide. The gardens are teeming with plants like tree ferns, bromeliads, and anthuriums, as well as several varieties of orchids, agapanthus, and hydrangeas. In addition to butterflies and a wide variety of birds, it's not uncommon to see mammals like white-nose coatis, agoutis, and white-faced capuchin monkeys. On a night tour this evening, we'll head to the nearby El Refugio Reserve to walk along the trails with a naturalist who will point out sleeping birds and nocturnal animals. Wildlife is unpredictable, but with our well-versed guide we may spot armadillos, scorpions, two-toed sloths, porcupine, bats, frogs, and many others. Regardless of what you see, the experience of walking in the forest after dark

is unique. Overnight at Monteverde Lodge...BLD Driving Time: About 4.5 hours

DAY 3 MONTEVERDE BIOLOGICAL CLOUD FOREST RESERVE

We enjoy a full day at Monteverde, one of the outstanding nature reserves in the New World tropics. In this "cloud forest," the forest floor is carpeted in fern, mosses, and shadeloving plants, while high above is a thick, green canopy made by the branches of tall trees reaching for sunlight. More than 400 species of birds reside here, including toucans, tanagers, barbets, and bellbirds. The most famed is the resplendent quetzal (Pharomachrus mocinno), sacred and imperial bird of the Mayas and Aztecs and the largest member of the trogon family. This magical avian, with its iridescent green plumage and crimson breast, is found only in certain high-altitude cloud forests in Central America. We enjoy guided walks on the forested paths of the reserve, some raised on wooden platforms, and visit the local butterfly garden (the Jardin de las Mariposas), with its gardens, greenhouses, and netted flyway. About 40 species of butterflies are represented in this garden. Time permitting, we may visit one of the local craft collectives in the area. Overnight at Monteverde Lodge...BLD

DAY 4 HIKE IN MONTEVERDE OR OPTIONAL ZIP LINE TOUR / VOLCÁN ARENAL

In the morning we can either do a hike in Finca Ecológico, a private nature reserve just a 10-minute walk from our lodge, or an exhilarating zip line tour in Monteverde (optional, at an

additional cost of \$88), where we'll see the cloud forest from a whole new perspective. Later, we make a scenic journey to Arenal, first by 4WD vehicle, then by private boat across Lake Arenal, where we have our first views of Volcán Arenal, the most active volcano in Costa Rica. A perfect cone shape emerging 5,300 feet from gentle green hills, Arenal first became active in 1968 when it erupted in a spectacular fashion. Our overnight is at the Lost Iguana Resort, nestled among 120 acres of primal rainforest overlooking the mountain... BLD

Driving Time: 3 hours; Boat Travel: 30 minutes

DAY 5 ARENAL / HANGING BRIDGES / LA FORTUNA WATERFALL OR ARENAL HIKE / HOT SPRINGS

This morning we walk on a series of spectacular hanging bridges that give us access to the high rainforest canopy—a great way to enter the world of towering, orchid-draped trees in a 600-acre primary forest reserve. There are six bridges that lead us deep inside the canopy habitat. Views of Arenal can be particularly striking from these bridges. In the afternoon, we offer a hike through forests and meadows to the base of the spectacular, 200-foot-high La Fortuna Waterfall—the adventurous among us can take a refreshing dip in the cool waters below it—or take a hike along an old lava field that brings us close to Arenal. This afternoon, we head to a volcanic hot spring in a beautiful natural setting complete with thermal pools and a waterfall. It's a great place for an optional soak, and later we savor a typical Costa Rican dinner here. Overnight at Lost Iguana Resort...BLD









DAY 6 TORTUGUERO NATIONAL PARK / TORTUGA LODGE

A beautiful drive brings you across Costa Rica's lush countryside, passing through villages, small farms, and banana and coffee plantations. Arriving at the dock in Pavano, we journey by boat (1.5-2 hours) with our guide to Tortuguero National Park, a natural history wonderland of coastal forest and inland waterways. Our overnight is at the lovely Tortuga Lodge, set on 50 private acres along a river. Lunch is en route...BLD

Driving Time: 4 hours; Boat Travel: 1.5-2 hours

DAY 7 TORTUGUERO NATIONAL PARK / TORTUGA LODGE

Tortuguero National Park protects one of the last large areas of tropical rainforest in Central America. On our memorable morning of boating in its secluded waterways and blackwater canals, we may see six-foot-long gar fish, turtles, manatees (an endangered species), crocodiles, caimans, river otters, and sloths, along with howler, spider, or white-faced monkeys. More than 320 species of birds have been recorded in the park, including all six species of kingfishers found in the New World, three species of toucans, eight species of parrots, and other neotropical species such as the slaty-tailed trogon, white-collared manakin, purple-throated fruitcrow, and white-fronted nunbird.

In the afternoon, we will visit Casa Cecropia, where we'll learn about the history of chocolate, how it's produced, and

even participate in the chocolate-making process, from tasting cacao beans to roasting and grinding them, and seeing how the delicious chocolate elixir is produced. We will also have options to visit the tiny village of Tortuguero and the park headquarters, as well as the Green Turtle Research Station, where turtle migration and behavior have been studied since 1962 (the longest running continuous study of its kind in the world). The beach at Tortuguero is the most important seasonal nesting site of the endangered green sea turtle in the Western Hemisphere. Huge green turtles nest here in large numbers between July to October, and if you are here at this time, it's a spectacular experience to watch them laying their eggs or see the eggs hatching. Although Tortuguero's green turtles may wander as far as Florida and Venezuela to feed, none of the more than 28,000 turtles tagged at Tortuguero has ever been found to mate and nest at any other beach. Leatherback turtles also nest here, in smaller numbers, as do hawksbill turtles. In the evening, we gather for a festive Farewell Dinner. Overnight at Tortuga Lodge...BLD

DAY 8 RETURN TO SAN JOSE / DEPART

From the Tortuguero airstrip, we fly after breakfast to San Jose and transfer to the international airport for homeward-bound flights. Or you can extend your stay in Tortuguero, join our optional extensions to the Corcovado Rainforest on the Pacific Coast or the Pacuare Lodge & River Rafting Extension...B

Pacuare Lodge & River Rafting Extension

The perfect extension to your adventure in Costa Rica—a stay at Pacuare Lodge, a wonderfully remote eco-hotel set on the banks of the Rio Pacuare, one of Costa Rica's top whitewater rivers. And what better way to arrive there? By raft, of course! The Rio Pacuare courses through a beautiful granite canyon lined with cascading waterfalls and lush rainforest vegetation. With exhilarating rapids and spectacular scenery, it's a rollicking ride and offers tons of excitement for the adventurous traveler (not to worry—previous rafting experience is not necessary). Once at the lodge, take your pick of a variety of exciting nature- and cultural-based excursions, from guided birdwatching tours and waterfall hikes to zip lining through the tropical rainforest canopy.

DAY 1 SAN JOSE / RIO PACUARE RAFTING

After an early morning pickup from your hotel in San Jose, drive toward the town of Turrialba, with a typical Costa Rican breakfast en route. Once at the put-in on the Pacuare, a rafting orientation with your river guides sets you up for a couple of hours of unbelievable fun. Side creeks cascade into quiet pools of the river while iridescent blue morpho butterflies whirl around you, their wings winking in the sunlight. You'll paddle, splash and float your way on Class I-III rapids to Pacuare Lodge, where more fun experiences await you. Accommodations are in Garden Suites, which include a private terrace with hammock and sitting area, king size or two full size canopy beds, and en suite bathroom with indoor and outdoor showers. Dinner and overnight at Pacuare Lodge...BLD

Note: Minimum age for rafting is 12. Arrival by land (via 4WD vehicle) or helicopter (at additional expense) is also available if you don't wish to raft. Call us for the details.

DAY 2 PACUARE LODGE

The lodge offers a variety of optional activities, including—but not limited to!—the following (note: minimum age is 12 for most excursions, 9 for easier activities):

- Early morning guided birdwatching tours, right on the lodge's grounds. Enjoy a cup of coffee before you head out, then return to the lodge for breakfast afterwards.
- A variety of hikes, from a moderately challenging hike to visit a clan of the indigenous Cabécar people (4-5 hours) to an easy loop hike (1.5 hours) that ends with a refreshing splash in a local waterfall.
- Most of the action in the rainforest is up in the treetops!



Experience it all with a zip line offering dramatic views, exotic birdlife, rappelling down trees, and sliding on cables from tree to tree (2 hours).

- Feeling fit and adventurous? Try canyoning, combining rock climbing, rappelling a rock face, descending a waterfall—all in the lush environment of the rainforest (2.5 hours).
- Or just take it easy—relax at the lodge's infinity pool or indulge in a soothing spa treatment.

Overnight at Pacuare Lodge...BLD

DAY 3 RETURN TO SAN JOSE

Once again, board rafts and head through the Pacuare's Class III-IV rapids to the town of Siquirres (this is a more challenging part of the river). You can return to San Jose by vehicle if you do not choose to raft this harder section, arriving at your hotel around 6:00 pm. End of services...BL

Corcovado Rainforest Extension

We offer an extension to beautiful Corcovado National Park with three well located lodges to choose from, SCP Corcovado Wilderness Lodge, Aguila de Osa Inn, or La Paloma Lodge. All lodges are lovely. Aguila de Osa is the probably best choice for more fit travelers or travelers without young children because the rooms are arranged on a steep hillside and there is some steep walking to get between the rooms and the restaurant. Please check with our office for lodge availability before you book your international flights. An additional night in San Jose on Day 4 is recommended.

DAY 1 SAN JOSE / PALMAR SUR / CORCOVADO NATIONAL

PARK From San Jose, fly by charter flight to Palmar Sur. On arrival, you are met and transferred to a jetty for a one-to one-and-a-half hour ride by motor launch to either SCP Corcovado Wilderness Lodge, Aguila de Osa Inn, or La Paloma. Overnight at the lodge...BLD

DAY 2 CORCOVADO NATIONAL PARK

Enjoy a guided tour of Corcovado National Park, which protects the best rainforest environment on the Pacific Coast of Central America. Nearly 400 species of birds, about 140 species of mammals, and more than 500 species of trees have been recorded here. Costa Rica's largest population of scarlet macaws lives in Corcovado, along with an array of other tropical wildlife. The park's trails ascend and descend through verdant rainforest. Overnight at SCP Corcovado Wilderness Lodge, Aguila de Osa Inn, or La Paloma...BLD

DAY 3 CANO ISLAND SNORKELING ADVENTURE

Boat to Cano Island for snorkeling amid a colorful spectrum of Pacific Coast reef fish as well as rays and sea turtles. Overnight at SCP Corcovado Wilderness Lodge, Aguila de Osa Inn, or La Paloma....BLD

DAY 4 TO SAN JOSE

Return by motor launch and charter flight to San Jose, then transfer to the hotel or to the airport for departure...B

Tortuga Lodge Extension

With its lush rainforest and exotic flora and fauna, Tortuguero National Park on Costa Rica's Caribbean Coast is a haven for active adventures and tremendous wildlife viewing, and a wonderful place to extend your Costa Rica journey. Your base during your explorations here is the charming Tortuga Lodge, set right on the Tortuguero River and with its own private nature reserve. Travelers are welcomed into the relaxing atmosphere, where guest rooms are nestled into the tropical landscapes and various adventures are right out your front door. Choose from a wide variety of activities that can be booked directly at the lodge—from visiting a sea turtle nesting site to hiking Cerro Tortuguero and a kayaking excursion in the mystical waterways of Tortuguero National Park. Please note activities are an "on your own" expense. This is the perfect extension for those looking to unwind and relax after our Costa Rica Wildlife journey.

DAY 1 TORTUGA LODGE

Enjoy a leisurely breakfast after your main Costa Rica Wildlife adventure comes to an end and relax in your room or near the pool. In the afternoon, you can head out on one of the excursions listed below or simply soak in the tranquility of the property. Tortuga Lodge is the only hotel in Tortuguero with its own private nature reserve, and there are four short walking trails behind the property if you wish to explore at no additional charge...LD

Activities:

- Visit a turtle nesting site at night (July through October only). In groups of 10 led by local guides, you'll have the opportunity to see Atlantic Green Sea turtles as they lay their eggs. These turtles can weigh up to 300-pound and lay 80-100 eggs. Groups set out at 8 pm or 10 pm.
- **Boat Excursion.** After an early breakfast at the lodge, join your fellow guests and the local naturalist guide for a three-hour boat expedition into Tortuguero National Park.
- Kayak in Tortuguergo National Park. Spend
 a couple hours in the morning or afternoon
 kayaking through the majestic canals of Caño Chiquero
 or Caño Mora, natural waterways designated for nonmotorized boats only. You will be accompanied by a
 bilingual Tortuguero guide for the duration of the trip.
- **Hike Cerro Tortuguero.** Get a birds-eye view of the majestic Caribbean lowlands on this two-hour hike up Cerro Tortuguero. After breakfast at the lodge, join

- your fellow hikers and the bilingual naturalist guide for a boat transfer to the Caribbean village of San Francisco and gateway to Barra del Colorado National Wildlife Refuge.
- Visit Tortuguero Village. Get a glimpse of Costa Rica's Caribbean Coast and the fascinating history and culture of Tortuguero Village. This fun, two-hour experience begins with a boat ride from the lodge to town, where you can visit the local school (during weekdays and school year), stroll through the Sea Turtle Conservancy center and museum, visit local artisan shops, a general goods store, and walk down the quaint streets of colorful Afro-Caribbean homes.
- Atlantic Coast Fishing. Available for a half-day (6 hours) or full-day (8 hours), set out with your guide on one of the lodge's boats to fish for tarpon, four varieties of snook, rainbow bass, jack cravelle, and much more.

Enjoy a number of activities you can book through the lodge or simply savor extra time in this serene setting... BLD

They are very adept at putting flight itineraries together, to even the most far-flung places. More information can be found on Exito's website at www.exitotravel.com.

Depending on your routing, it may be necessary to depart from the US one day prior to Day 1 of the trip itinerary. The name on your airline ticket must match the name on your passport exactly, and your passport must be valid for at least six months after your date of return to the US.

Please do not purchase your tickets until you are confirmed on the trip and have reviewed your proposed air schedule with our office. Once your tickets have been purchased, please send us a copy of your airline schedule so we can reserve your airport transfers.

CHARTER FLIGHTS

The private charter flight on the trip is typically on a small 12-passenger Cessna plane with two pilots. Flights are booked through our local operator in San Jose and your guide handles the tickets. Note: There is a 40-lb. checked bag and 10-lb. small bag carry-on per person weight limit for the Costa Rica internal flights booked by WT. Excess luggage can be stored in San Jose if needed, just let us know.

HOTEL BOUGAINVILLEA

San Jose, Costa Rica Day 1 (1 night)

The Hotel Bougainvillea is set among 10 acres of lush tropical gardens in the residential district of San Domingo de Heredia, just 15 minutes from downtown San Jose. This hidden gem of a hotel offers spacious rooms with comfy beds, tranquil grounds for strolling and birdwatching (wonderful butterflies, too), a swimming pool, tennis, and a fine restaurant. And don't forget to try a Guaro Sour—the Costa Rican national drink—at the bar.



MONTEVERDE LODGE

Monteverde, Costa Rica Days 2 to 3 (2 nights)

The winding paths of Monteverde Lodge's beautifully manicured gardens are flanked by ferns and bromeliads, a magical butterfly and hummingbird garden, and a stream, pond, and small waterfall provide a habitat for riverine birds and a host of reptiles and amphibians. After an active day exploring the cloud forest, relax in a hammock or take a dip in the solar heated swimming pool. The elegant dining room, with its cloud forest mural and abundant tropical flora, offers excellent Costa Rican specialties. Spacious rooms with private bath have two double beds with fluffy comforters and large windows, and are designed to put you "in the forest"—there are no TVs!



LOST IGUANA RESORT AND SPA

Arenal Volcano, Costa Rica Days 4 to 5 (2 nights)

This wonderful resort is like an oasis in the middle of nowhere. While the rooms are not luxurious, they are very comfortable and private, and feature balconies with fantastic views of Arenal Volcano (assuming clear weather). An openair restaurant serves delicious meals (try the ceviche and tilapia dishes) and the free in-room Wi-Fi is a plus. There are also beautiful gardens, a spectacular double pool with swim-up bar, and if you have some extra time, treat yourself to a soothing spa treatment.



TORTUGA LODGE

Tortuguero National Park, Costa Rica Days 6 to 7 (2 nights)

Surrounded by acres of landscaped gardens and dense forest, Tortuga Lodge offers 27 spacious and comfortable rooms with private bathrooms and screened windows. Its airy barrestaurant is right on the river, as is the swimming pool. The lodge is located right next to Tortuguero National Park, but there's plenty of wildlife on the grounds, too—take a walk on the trails behind the lodge and see what you can find! Solar energy is used at the lodge, which earned Tortuga ecotourism awards from Travel & Leisure and Condé Nast Traveler. The lodge supports the local community through sustainable development, hires local staff, and supports local conservation projects.

What the Trip is Like

WHAT THE TRIP IS LIKE

The trip is Level 2, Easy to Moderate, according to our trip grading system. Wildlife viewing takes place during nature walks on mountain rainforest trails and on lagoon trips by boat. The walks are about two to four miles, covering a variety of terrain and usually on well-marked trails. There is no extensive hiking on the trip, but you should be in good physical shape to enjoy it to the fullest. Accommodations range from a modern hotel in San Jose to charming wildlife lodges. The Corcovado Extension and Pacuare River Rafting Extension are Level 3, Moderate.

WEATHER

The temperature in Costa Rica does not change drastically with the seasons. Lowland areas are warmer, while in the mountains, it is cooler, especially at night. If you are sensitive to the cold, bring a warm layer for cold early mornings and evenings, especially in the winter months, when it can be quite chilly. On the Pacific Coast and in the highlands, the rainy season begins in late May and ends by November. Mornings are usually bright and sunny, with typical afternoon rains that come as short downpours. December through April is the dry season, but Costa Rica is tropical so you can expect some rain at any time of the year.
