Discover the enchanting world of the cloud forest, the ancient haciendas of Ecuador's highlands, and hike on Cotopaxi, one of the highest active volcanoes on Earth! Celebrating Ecuador's phenomenal array of landscapes and cultures, our Private Journey immerses you in three totally distinct settings. In the lofty realm of

the highlands, explore beguiling rural landscapes, centuries-old markets, and enjoy a warm welcome at an atmospheric 17th century hacienda. On the high páramo grasslands of Cotopaxi National Park, crowned by ice-draped Cotopaxi (19,347'), hike along high trails and enjoy fantastic stargazing in the night sky of the Southern Hemisphere. For a grand finale, enter Ecuador's pristine cloud forest, home to some of the richest biodiversity in the world, and walk through vine-draped forests and even take an aerial "sky bike" ride across the canopy. As you explore these three realms of Ecuador, dining will be a special part of the experience, with locally sourced meals inspired by the ingredients of Ecuador's natural bounty. Our handpicked accommodations, from a stunning nature lodge in the cloud forest to a 17th century hacienda and a cozy mountain lodge, will be as memorable as the journey itself.

DAY 1 ARRIVE IN QUITO

Most flights from the US arrive in Quito around midnight. You'll be met by your private guide for a short transfer to the Wyndham Quito Airport Hotel, just minutes from the airport, for a well-deserved rest...meals on your own.

DAY 2 THE ECUADORIAN HIGHLANDS / HACIENDA ZULETA

After a trip briefing with your private guide and breakfast at the hotel (a good start for sampling Ecuador's array of tropical fruits and juices), set off for a drive north along the Pan-American Highway into the green Ecuadorian highlands. Arrive in time for lunch at Hacienda Zuleta, your home for the next two nights. Virtually everything gracing the table at Zuleta comes fresh from Zuleta's rich earth and is carefully prepared by hand. After lunch, enjoy your choice of self-guided activities at Zuleta. You can hike to the hacienda's Cóndor Huasi conservation program, where injured Andean condors are rehabilitated for release into the wild and chicks are raised for release. Another option is a visit to the hacienda's artisan cheese production area, with a tasting. There are miles of trails at Zuleta that lead through a green patchwork where wheat, maize, potatoes, and quinoa are grown, and you can learn about traditional Zuleteña embroidery, or simply explore the grounds and enjoy the sublime mountain setting. Many of the hacienda's employees are from the Zuleta community. "Zuleteños" are known for preserving their culture and traditions—you'll notice that their attire is unique and different from the traditional Otavalo clothing. Zuleta has been known to cast a spell and it is a delight to savor its atmospheric setting. Optional activities (at extra cost) include horseback riding, mountain biking, and a cooking class. The main sitting room has a roaring fireplace to keep away the chill of high altitude. Enjoy a delicious family-style dinner around

a common table this evening. Overnight at Hacienda Zuleta (9,488')...BLD

Driving Time: 2 hours

Hacienda Zuleta is a stunning 17th century property and working farm set on 4,000 acres. For over 100 years, it has belonged to the family of Mr. Galo Plaza Lasso, who was president of Ecuador from 1948 to 1952. A liberal reformer, Galo Plaza Lasso and his mother did what no landowner in Ecuador had ever done before—introduced land reforms that returned substantial tracts of land back to the local people, and today the peoples of this local region enjoy independence and control over their lives. Many are still farmers, and the local women are productively engaged in the local embroidery industry.

DAY 3 HACIENDA ZULETA / LAGUNA CUICOCHA HIKE / OTAVALO MARKET

Enjoy a beautiful hike around Laguna Cuicocha this morning with your guide, with a box lunch prepared by Hacienda Zuleta. Cuicocha is a spectacular crater lake set at 10,000 feet in the Reserva Ecológica Cotacachi-Cayapas. You'll have views of the towering Cotacachi and Imbabura volcanoes. Along the way, keep your eye out for hummingbirds, orchids, and perhaps even a soaring Andean condor. You can make the hike just a mile or two out and back, or hike the complete circuit of 5.5

miles. In the afternoon, head with your guide to the town of Otavalo (8,202'), famed for its market featuring the textile arts of the Otalaveño and other indigenous Andean groups. The people of Otavalo have excelled at weaving since pre-Inca times and their centuries-old market is a rainbow of textiles, from blankets to alpaca sweaters. You'll recognize Otalaveño men by their fedoras, dark blue wool ponchos, and long braid (the long, single braid of Otavalo men is such an important symbol of their ethnic identity that when Otalaveño men serve in the Ecuadorian army, they are not required to cut it off). Women of Otavalo wear white blouses, long blue skirts of wool, and multiple necklaces of gold beads—some scholars think this is the closest to traditional Inca clothing worn anywhere in the Andes. Overnight at Hacienda Zuleta...BLD

Driving Time: 1.5-2.5 hours

Hiking Time: 1 to 5.5 hours

DAY 4 HIKE ACROSS COTAPAXI NATIONAL PARK

It's time to discover another Ecuadorian realm: magnificent Cotopaxi National Park and the high, green páramo landscape that surrounds Cotopaxi (19,347'), whose name translates as "the shining peak" for its glowing mantle of snow. A morning drive brings you into Cotopaxi National Park. Inside the park, stop for a leisurely picnic lunch at remarkable Pucará de Salitre, a semi-restored Inca fortress built in the late 15th century, with the grandeur of the park all around. Keep an eye



out for resident and migrant Andean birds and savor views of mighty Cotopaxi, one of the most beautiful and colossal peaks in the high Andes, its perfect cone covered by a thick cloak of white snow that glows against the deep blue of the sky. After lunch, hike across the grassy páramo landscape, perhaps seeing some of the wild horses, deer, or llama that make the park their home, as well as seasonal mountain wildflowers. Cotopaxi National Park's landscape is a rolling moorland with native shrubs, lichens, and flowers adapted to the high realm. Your hike continues through the canyon of the Rio Pita to your perfectly located accommodation, Chilcabamba Mountain Lodge, a rustic accommodation in a gorgeous setting, with spectacular views of towering Cotopaxi on a clear day. Overnight at Chilcabamba Mountain Lodge...BLD
Driving Time: 3.5 hours
Hiking Time: 4 hours

DAY 5 HIKE ON VOLCÁN COTOPAXI

Drive from the lodge right up to the climbers' refuge at 15,748 feet on the flanks of Cotopaxi. Here you'll hike over steep terrain towards the base of the volcano's glaciers. It's a good idea to have warm clothing on hand, including a hat, gloves, scarf, and wind layers, as the weather can change quickly on this towering volcano. If the clouds part, the views are incredible. Cotopaxi is a popular high-altitude climb and you will see many climbers preparing for their ascents. Return to

Chilcabamba for lunch, with the afternoon free to explore. An optional activity today (at extra cost) is a mountain bike ride from the base of Cotopaxi to Laguna Limpiopungo on a rugged fire road (approximately one hour). Overnight at Chilcabamba Mountain Lodge...BLD
Hiking Time: 2-3 hours

DAY 6 FROM THE ALTIPLANO INTO VINE-DRAPED CLOUD FOREST

After breakfast at the lodge, depart for a drive that brings you down to the cloud forest, with stark changes in landscape and vegetation en route. Arriving at Mashpi Lodge at 3,117 feet, you'll bid farewell to your private guide (who will meet you again on your arrival in Quito) and be welcomed by the lodge's naturalist guides for a short presentation on this fascinating ecosystem. The lodge is a striking contemporary building nestled into the private, 3,000-acre Mashpi Reserve in the heart of the cloud forest. The land in and around the reserve is world-famous as a biodiversity hotspot of flora and avifauna. In the afternoon, head out with one of the specialist guides for a short walk through primary forest dominated by ancient copal trees, whose aromatic resins were used by the pre-Columbians as incense. The lodge's Life Center building has forest panoramas from the wide wooden deck, a good place to spot birds, hear the roar of mantled howler monkeys, and learn about the many species of butterflies found in this region. The





cuisine at Mashpi is inspired by the ingredients and flavors of the cloud forest. Guest rooms are designed with floor-to-ceiling windows to allow an immersion in the cloud forest, and it's a delight to awake to a magnificent forest view. Overnight at Mashpi Lodge...BLD

Driving Time: 4 hours

Walking Time: 1 hour

DAY 7 CLOUD FOREST RIDE, HEALING WATERFALL, BIKE IN THE SKY!

The forest rewards early-bird explorers, and the dawn light attracts a wide variety of beautiful avians. Those who want to join the guides on the terrace at 6:30 this morning will enjoy not only the birdlife but also the beauty and the sounds of the forest. The lodge's spotting scope is available to look for birds, and there is coffee and tea available. After breakfast, join one of the lodge guides for a hike through the forest to the "Dragonfly," the lodge's unique cable car system that crosses above and sometimes even directly through the forest canopy for a stunning open-air perspective (there are walks aplenty if you don't want to take the cable car). The Dragonfly ride is a chance to watch the mist rolls back from the forest below

and listen to the birds. Afterwards, head out for an energetic hike deep into the reserve to the Healing Waterfall, where the sun bursts through the foliage with striking rays of light glancing off glimmering rocks. After lunch back at the lodge, walk to the Sky Bike station for a unique adventure—pedaling two-person "bicycles" suspended by a cable above a ravine and a river. It's an unforgettable way to experience the exuberant nature of Mashpi—and great for photos. At the Observation Tower, 85 feet above the forest floor, you'll get some of the best views across the canopy. Species spotted from here include toucans, woodpeckers, barbets, tanagers and parrots, as well as birds of prey, and this is a great place to watch the sunset. Overnight at Mashpi Lodge...BLD

DAY 8 DEPART

After breakfast at the lodge, transfer to Quito, where you will be met and brought to the day rooms held for you at the Wyndham Airport Hotel. Optional activities in Quito (at extra cost) include a city tour with lunch, a museum visit, and a chocolate tasting, or a day excursion to Papallacta Hot Springs. Evening transfer to the airport for departure on homeward-bound flights...BL

QUITO EXTENSION

Discover the picturesque capital of Quito, perched high in the Andes—warm and laid-back yet bursting with colorful markets and architectural gems that reflect a blend of Spanish, Italian, Moorish, Flemish, and indigenous designs. On this three-day extension, explore the city's Old Town—a UNESCO World Heritage Site and Latin America's most well-preserved historic center, where architecture dates back to the 1600s. You'll also taste ancient To'ak chocolate, admire centuries-old indigenous art, and stroll the streets that pulse with vibrant cafes and sophisticated shops.

AMAZON RAINFOREST EXTENSION: NAPO WILDLIFE CENTER

Enjoy an unforgettable adventure at Napo Wildlife Center for the best experience of the Ecuadorian Amazon. Explore by dugout canoe on blackwater lakes, hike trails through the emerald forest, visit the nearby clay lick where hundreds of parrots and macaws gather, get a bird's-eye view from the canopy tower (207 steps!), with its unobstructed 360-degree view of undisturbed forest. NWC is owned by the native Yasuní people, who have lived in this area for centuries. They have a profound respect for maintaining the natural integrity of the ecosystem and are knowledgeable and passionate guides who enhance your experience. Guest cabins are very comfortable and the buffet-style meals in the dining room provide tasty, fresh, and plentiful meals with a good variety to choose from. Our extension has three nights at Napo Wildlife Center and two in Quito, but you have the option to add additional nights.

CUSCO AND MACHU PICCHU EXTENSION

Discover the best of Peru's breathtaking mountain landscapes, mystical fortress-cities, and thriving cultural and artistic heritage on this extension that brings you to the heart of the Incan empire. Trip members will be transferred from Wyndham Quito Airport Hotel to Mariscal Sucre International Airport 3.5 hours prior to their international departure. Most flights depart for the US in the evening.

INTERNATIONAL AIR TRAVEL

You are responsible for making your own arrangements for flights to and from Ecuador. There are many online consolidators for booking travel, but for more personal help arranging air transport, you can contact Exito Travel at 1-800-655-4053 in the US or 1-800-670-2605 in Canada. They are very adept at putting flight itineraries together, to even the most far-flung places. More information can be found at www.exitotravel.com.

Depending on your routing, it is necessary to depart from the US one or possibly two days prior to Day 1 of the trip itinerary. The name on your airline ticket must match the name on your passport exactly, and your passport must be valid for at least six months after your date of return to the US.

Please do not purchase your tickets until you are confirmed on the trip. Once tickets are purchased, please forward a copy of your email flight confirmation from the airline. It is your responsibility to ensure your flight times coordinate with the arrival and departure logistics for this trip.

Lodging



WYNDHAM QUITO AIRPORT

Quito, Ecuador, Day 1 (1 night)

The Wyndham Quito Airport is a nice hotel with a great location right next to the airport. Rooms are spacious, with plush bedding and great views of the nearby hills, and the lounge area is perfect for relaxing upon arrival. The hotel also has a spa with a sauna.



HACIENDA ZULETA

Highlands, Ecuador, Days 2 to 3 (2 nights)

There is something quite special about Hacienda Zuleta. Surrounded by more than 2,000 acres of forest and grazing lands, it was built at the end of the 16th century and is still a private family home. You can get a sense Ecuador's history here, and that of the Galo Plaza-Lasso family (which has produced two of country's most beloved former presidents) in their photos, paintings, and furnishings. There are just 11 guest rooms at the estate, plus beautiful gardens, famous hospitality, and excellent food, often fresh from the organic garden and trout farm (and Zuleta's hand-made artisan cheese is delicious). All the guest rooms and the main sitting room have roaring fireplaces to keep away the chill of the 9,000-foot altitude. There are no TVs or video games here to break the spell, just peace and quiet in a spectacular Andean setting. It's a delightful place to call home after a day of hiking, visiting the condor rehabilitation project, or horseback riding in the high Andes.



CHILCABAMBA MOUNTAIN LODGE

Chilcabamba, Ecuador, Days 4 to 5 (2 nights)

Chilcabamba is a small, rustic mountain lodge in a gorgeous setting, with spectacular views of towering Cotopaxi on a clear day. Guest rooms are comfortably furnished and heated by wood-burning stoves, and the chef prepares excellent home-cooked meals using fresh local ingredients from Ecuador's highlands. At night, it's a treat to sit out by the lodge's campfire and gaze at the stars.



MASHPI LODGE

Mashpi Private Reserve, Ecuador, Days 6 to 7 (2 nights)

Mashpi is a luxurious retreat surrounded by a private nature reserve in the cloud forest. Guest rooms have floor to ceiling windows onto the cloud forest, and the terrace is the perfect place to enjoy sights, sounds, and views over the canopy. The chefs provide meals sourced from fresh, local ingredients as well as the diverse culinary heritage of Ecuador. The lodge's butterfly enclosure, waterfalls, "sky bikes," research center, and knowledgeable guides all add to the delights.

What the Trip is Like

TRIP LEVEL

This trip is rated Level 3, Moderate. Cultural explorations and day hikes are the focus of the trip, with hotel, hacienda, and lodge accommodations throughout. Much of the trip takes place at higher altitudes, ranging from 9,500 feet at Otavalo to over 15,000 feet in Cotopaxi National Park. Overland travel is by van. There are five days with optional hikes of about 2-4 hours each. For your enjoyment of the trip, we recommend you make a special effort to be in very good physical condition, and ready to hike on varied terrain (rock and sand), driving on mountain roads that can be rugged, and the hikes will often be cross country, not on developed trails. Please note that your Trip Leader may make adjustments to the itinerary and hiking routes, depending on local weather and trail conditions.

WEATHER

Because of Ecuador's location on the equator, the weather patterns don't change very much during the year. Altitudes are very much the determining factor in the temperatures. In Quito, temperatures are pleasant and spring-like much of the year, with highs around 75°F and lows around 50°F. The central highlands of Ecuador are crossed by the Andes, with snow line starting at altitudes of about 16,500 feet. Expect the daily high to be around 75°F. Nights and mornings are cold, dropping down to 50°F or even lower. In the cloud forest at Mashpi, expect daytime highs of around 80°F and much cooler evenings, possibly as low as the mid-50s, and higher humidity.

The summer season is June through September, and you will enjoy great views of the volcanoes and mountains. The rainy season is generally February-April, and while temperatures are comfortable, it is not an optimum time for hiking.
