WHEN TO GO

January to December

Enter the heart of El Mundo Maya, with its intriguing Mayan culture and lavish temple cities rising out of misty rainforests. Our Private Journey in Guatemala features elegant Antigua, colonial capital of the Spanish realm in Central America, the mysterious mountain village of Chichicastenango, with its famous open-air market, and the stunning volcano-ringed lake called Atitlán, surrounded by traditional Mayan villages. For a grand finale, explore Tikal, the greatest Mayan religious center yet discovered, where thousands of structures have been cleared from the surrounding jungle. Tikal is magnificent not just for its towering temples and pyramids but also for its situation within a vast canopy forest of mahogany, cedar, palm, and ceiba where you'll see playful monkeys and fantastic birdlife. We also offer an optional extension to the extraordinary Mayan city of Copan in Honduras.

Itinerary

Please Note: If you wish to visit Chichicastenango on market day (either a Sunday or Thursday), your journey must begin in Guatemala on a Tuesday or a Friday. Many people also add an extra night or two in Antigua and Lake Atitlán at the beginning of the trip. This trip can also be done in reverse.

DAY 1

GUATEMALA CITY / ANTIGUA

Afternoon arrival in Guatemala City, where you are met by your guide for an hour-long drive along the Pan-American Highway to the enchanting city of Antigua. Dinner on your own and overnight at hotel...Meals on your own

DAY 2

ANTIGUA

Enjoy a guided morning walking tour of this beautiful city, with its cobblestone streets, fine public plazas, and ornate churches. Antigua's beautifully preserved examples of Spanish Renaissance art and architecture make you feel as if you've stepped back in time 300 years. Founded in 1543, Antigua was the seat of Spanish colonial government for the Kingdom of Guatemala, which stretched from Chiapas (southern Mexico) to Costa Rica. It was one of the first planned cities in the Americas, and the Spanish Colonial style permeates every part of the town. Antigua sits in a highland valley at about 5,000 feet and is surrounded by spectacular Volcano Agua (12,400'), Volcano Acatenango, and Volcano Fuego. The city also offers an introduction to the modern-day Maya culture. Some of Guatemala's most skillful Mayan artisans work and sell their wares here through Antigua's galleries and art exhibits, with wares including intricate weavings that express the history and traditions of the Mayan people. The afternoon is free to explore on your own. Overnight in Antigua...B

DAY 3

CHICHICASTENANGO / LAKE ATITLÁN

With your guide and driver, set off on a two-hour morning drive through green mountain highlands to Chichicastenango (6,500'), a small town famous for its open-air market, the largest in Central America (held Sundays and Thursdays). This handicraft market draws not only the Maya of the surrounding region, but vendors from all over Guatemala, representing such linguistic groups such as the Mam, Ixil, Kaqchikel, and others in a densely packed outdoor market full of color and costumes. After you roam the market, visit the adjacent Santo Tomás Church, built in 1540 on the site of an existing Mayan altar. Shamans still use the church for their rituals, burning incense and candles and, in special cases, a chicken for the gods. Each of the 18 stairs that lead up to the church stands for one month of the Mayan calendar year. In the afternoon, continue across the mountains to your lakefront hotel at magnificent Lake Atitlán, a huge mountain lake of cobalt-blue wind-tossed waters set against a backdrop

DAY 4

LAKE ATITLÁN VILLAGES

Lining the shores of Lake Atitlán are a dozen Mayan villages where life and customs have changed little over the centuries. Today you will visit an array of intriguing lakeside villages by private motor launch. In one of the larger villages, Santiago Atitlán, you can visit the historic cathedral and the shrine to Maximón, a colorful pagan saint. In the afternoon, you can have time on your own or we can plan a visit with your guide to some local craft markets or a more active hiking adventure. Overnight at hotel...BL

DAY 5

GUATEMALA CITY / FLORES

Drive back to Guatemala City and, time permitting, visit the Museo Ixchel del Traje Indígena, with its extraordinary collection of indigenous clothing from various regions of Guatemala, or the Museo Popol Vuh to view its collection of pre-Hispanic art (stone sculpture and ceramics) as well as Pre-classic, Classic, and Post-classic Maya exhibits. In the afternoon, transfer to the airport and fly to the pretty lakeside city of Flores, gateway to Tikal. Flores is built on an island in Lake Petén Itzá. A short causeway connects Flores to its sister town, Santa Elena, rising out of Lake Petén Itza. Overnight at hotel...B

DAY 6

TIKAL

Enjoy a glorious day of exploration at Tikal with your local guide, beginning with a morning drive through the Petén rainforest to Tikal National Park. The park is a wildlife preserve covering 222 square miles, the centerpiece of which is the ancient Mayan metropolis of Tikal. Today you'll explore the towering pyramids, ball courts, steep-sided temples, baths, multilevel palaces, and much more. Tikal is not only an ancient Mayan city—it is also a fantastic rainforest world of screeching howler monkeys and squawking parrots. Wildlife in the surrounding forest ranges from monkeys to white-lipped peccary, brocket deer, coatimundis, toucans, scarlet macaws, parrots, and ocelots. Return to Flores for overnight...BL



Tikal: Once a wealthy metropolis of 100,000 inhabitants, Tikal was the seat of power for the great Jaguar clan lords. Reconstructed over the past 40 years by the University of Pennsylvania and the Guatemalan government, it is one of the grandest archaeological sites in the world. The ruins of Tikal include more than

Itinerary

3,000 structures extending over six square miles and including palaces, temples, ceremonial platforms, ball courts, terraces, plazas, avenues, and steam baths. The most spectacular structure in Tikal is the Great Plaza, surrounded by stelae and sculpted altars, ceremonial buildings, residential and administrative palaces, and a ball court. On one side of the plaza is the Temple of the Great Jaguar (Temple I), more than 150 feet high and constructed about 700 AD by order of Ah Cacao, whose tomb was discovered inside. Temple II stands at the western end of the Great Plaza and rises to a height of 120 feet. It was also constructed by Ah Cacao around 700 AD. Literally thousands of structures have been cleared from the jungle at Tikal, most notably the famous Temple IV, the highest Maya temple still standing.

DAY 7

TIKAL / OPTIONAL ZIP LINE

Today you have the option of returning to Tikal for a half-day tour on your own or to explore the seldom-visited Maya ruins of Yaxha with a guide. Set on the northern shores of a lagoon, Yaxha was discovered in 1904 and is spread across nine plazas. Shrouded by rainforest, it hints at what Tikal may have looked like prior to its restoration. (Yaxha may look somewhat familiar—it was the setting for season 11 of the TV reality series, *Survivor*.) A boat tour to Topoxte, a Maya archaeological site located on an island in the lagoon at Yaxha, can be included with this tour. Other optional tours include a nature walk along the hanging bridges and/or a zip line ride through the treetops of the Petén rainforest near the Tikal National Park entrance (optional tours at your own expense). Return to Flores for overnight...B

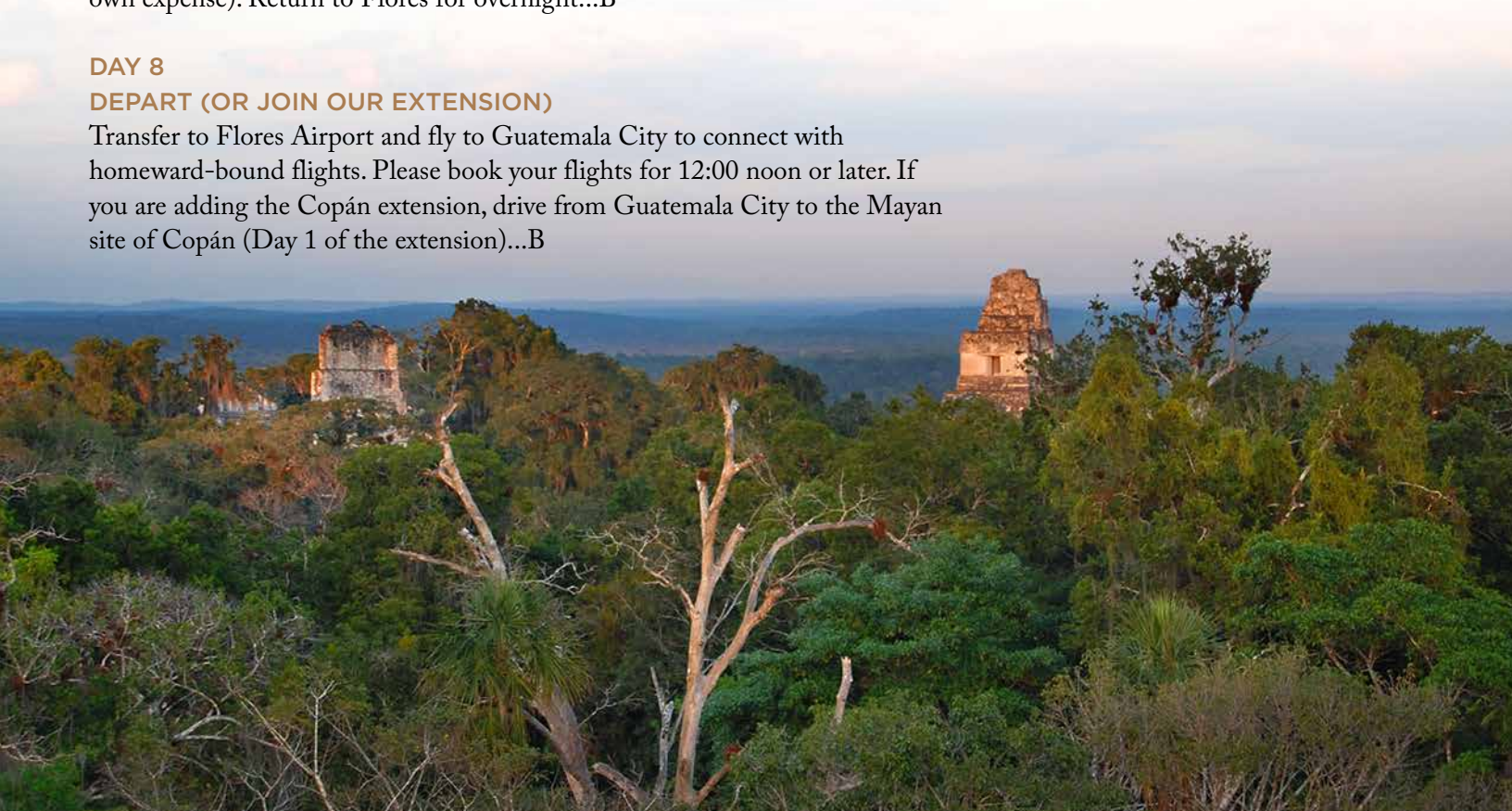
DAY 8

DEPART (OR JOIN OUR EXTENSION)

Transfer to Flores Airport and fly to Guatemala City to connect with homeward-bound flights. Please book your flights for 12:00 noon or later. If you are adding the Copán extension, drive from Guatemala City to the Mayan site of Copán (Day 1 of the extension)...B

Ancient Copán Extension

Set on the banks of the Río Amarillo in Honduras, the World Heritage Site of Copán is the most artistically advanced of all Mayan cities, surpassing other Mayan sites in its wealth of sculptures, hieroglyphics, and beautifully carved stone stelae. This can be booked as a pre- or post-trip extension.

DAY 1 COPÁN

Transfer by private car with your guide from Guatemala City to Copán Ruinas, a charming town of cobbled streets and red-tiled roofs (drive time is about 5.5 hours, with lunch on the way). Copán Ruinas' main plaza is dominated by a whitewashed Baroque cathedral. On the west side of the plaza is the impressive regional archaeological museum, with an excellent display of carved stelae from Copán. The late afternoon is free to explore the town of Copán. Overnight at Hotel Marina Copán...BL

DAY 2 FULL DAY TOUR OF COPÁN

A World Heritage Site, Copán was the most important city-state in the southern Maya world. In 426 AD, the warrior-shaman founder of Copán, Great Sun First Quetzal Macaw, established the city and began a 400-year dynasty. Copán's golden era began around 550 AD and the highly artistic period reached its pinnacle under the reign of Eighteen Rabbit (695-738 AD). The famed Hieroglyphic Stairway, one of the finest pieces of architecture in the Maya world, was completed under the ruler Smoke Shell (749-763 AD). Enjoy a full-day tour of Copán, including the Great Plaza, strewn with magnificent carved stelae, Ball Court, Acropolis, and the astonishing Hieroglyphic Stairway as well as the excellent Museum of Mayan Sculpture near the visitor center. Time permitting, you may

also visit the Macaw Mountain Bird Park. Overnight at the Hotel Marina Copán...BL

DAY 3 COPÁN AT LEISURE

Today you can return to the site of Copán on your own, explore the city and local museums, visit the Tea and Chocolate Place visitors' center or do other optional touring. Overnight at Hotel Marina Copán...B

DAY 4 GUATEMALA CITY / JOIN REGULAR TRIP OR DEPART

Return by private car with your driver to Guatemala City to begin the rest of your tour (if you are doing this pre-trip) or to return home. Transfer to the airport for evening flights from Guatemala City...B

Note: It is possible to add a visit to the site of Quirigua by adding an overnight in Livingston and visiting Livingston and Rio Dulce. Please call for details.

Lodging

DAYS 1 TO 2 (2 NIGHTS), ANTIGUA, GUATEMALA

In Antigua, we stay at one of the following properties based on availability and choice of accommodation:



CASA SANTO DOMINGO

With beautiful gardens and traditional courtyards and fountains, the Casa Santo Domingo is an oasis in the heart of Antigua. A former 16th century monastery, the hotel is about a 10-minute walk from Antigua's main plaza. The spacious guest rooms have private baths and many rooms have in-room fireplaces. The public rooms, including a small museum on the premises, feature a collection of colonial objects and the works of local artists. The hotel has appeared on Travel & Leisure's "World's Best Hotels" list.



EL CONVENTO BOUTIQUE HOTEL (OPTIONAL UPGRADE)

Serene and private, the El Convento combines the beautiful colonial ambiance of Antigua with state-of-the-art amenities (even an ipod dock so you can play your favorite music in the room). This hotel's 20 guest rooms surround a beautifully landscaped courtyard garden, and each features an in-room fireplace, spacious marble bathroom, and a private patio (the Suites and Grand Suites also offer private Jacuzzis). El Convento is close to the center of town (great restaurants and shopping) but far enough away to avoid the hustle and bustle. Be sure to order a mojito at the rooftop lounge/bar, which has a marvelous view of Agua Volcano. A nice touch: at night the hotel is lit by flickering candles, contributing to its warm and welcoming ambiance.

DAYS 3 TO 4 (2 NIGHTS), LAKE ATITLÁN, GUATEMALA

In Lake Atitlán, we stay at one of the following properties based on availability and choice of accommodation:



VILLA SANTA CATARINA

The Villa Santa Catarina, a peaceful retreat right on the shores of volcano-ringed Lake Atitlán, conveys a Spanish-Colonial flavor and a relaxing ambiance. Guest rooms feature private bathrooms and balconies; the hotel's pool offers views of the lake and its volcanoes. The Villa Santa Catarina is located in the village of Santa Catarina Palopò, just south of Panajachel, famous for its beautiful locally produced textiles.



CASA PALOPO (OPTIONAL UPGRADE)

This enchanting hotel, perched high on a hillside overlooking Lake Atitlán, was once a stunning private home. The main building features seven unique, cozy, and comfortable rooms, each with a terrace (knockout views of the lake and volcanoes), and richly decorated with colorful art, textiles, and furnishings. The on-site gourmet restaurant offers fine dining in an elegant, romantic setting (the sunset views are out of this world), and there is a gym for those so inclined, as well as a solar-heated lap pool. Need to stay connected? The hotel offers free Wi-Fi in the reception area.

DAYS 5 TO 7 (3 NIGHTS), FLORES, GUATEMALA

In Flores, we stay at one of the following properties based on availability and choice of accommodation:



VILLA MAYA

The Villa Maya is a quiet retreat located on the shores of Petenchel and Monifata lagoons in a private natural reserve just 45 minutes from Tikal. The hotel's 56 simple but stylish guest rooms (arranged in separate bungalows, with four rooms each) feature en suite bath, air conditioning, and private veranda with views of the lagoon, tropical forest, and gardens (and great bird-watching right from your room). Nature trails lead around the lake and through the gardens, and there's a flock of resident macaws right on the property. Sunsets from the bar are terrific and you can enjoy tasty meals in the open-air restaurant built above the lagoon. A triangular swimming pool and hot tub overlooking the lake offer a refreshing respite after a day exploring the ruins of Tikal.



LAS LAGUNAS HOTEL (OPTIONAL UPGRADE)

In a private reserve in the heart of the Maya world, Las Lagunas Hotel has 19 jungle view and waterfront suites overlooking the peaceful Quexil Lagoon and Monkey Island. Each suite has air conditioning, a cascade shower bathroom, and a private deck with Jacuzzi. In this tranquil hideaway, you can walk along elevated paths to the shaded pool or spa to enjoy a wide range of body treatments, as well as the spa's sauna, steam room, and hot tub. The restaurant features fresh ingredients from the local market, and you can relax with a tropical drink or a glass of wine at the poolside bar. The hotel has kayaks, bicycles, and a small museum with archeological pieces that reflect the history of fascinating Flores.

Arrival & Departure

ARRIVAL & DEPARTURE

Upon confirming your trip reservation, we will send you a Welcome Packet that includes a list of documents (passport, visas, etc.) required for your trip. Please feel free to call if you would like this information before making your air arrangements.

The trip begins on Day 1 in Guatemala City, Guatemala. You will be met and transferred to Antigua.

At the end of the trip on Day 8, you are transferred to Flores Airport for a flight to Guatemala City. Your homeward-bound flight from Guatemala City must depart after 12 noon.

It is best to arrive by midday for your transfer to Antigua. If you arrive later, we can still transfer you to Antigua, or to your hotel in Guatemala City if you are arriving prior to Day 1. Please review your air schedule with us before you book your flights.

FLIGHT ARRANGEMENTS

Trip members are responsible for making their own arrangements for air transportation. Please do not purchase your airline tickets until you are confirmed on the trip and have reviewed your proposed air schedule with our office. Once your tickets have been purchased, please send us a copy of your airline schedule so that we can send it on to the local guide (make sure to include your Trip Name and Trip Dates on it).

Note: The name on your airline ticket must match the name on your passport exactly; otherwise you may be denied boarding. Please remember this when reserving your flights. In addition, your passport must be valid for at least six months after your date of return to the US (in most cases).

What to Expect

WHAT THE TRIP IS LIKE

This trip is Level 2, Easy to Moderate, according to our trip grading system. Daily walks and cultural exploration are the focus of the trip; you may be on your feet for around four to five hours over the course of a day as you tour, although this will be broken up by cultural stops. At the archaeological sites, much of your walking will be on rocky or uneven surfaces and steep stairs, and that can be more strenuous.

GETTING IN SHAPE

Even though this trip is not strenuous, we strongly urge you to train for it, as travel can be wearing and your enjoyment will be highly dependent on your level of fitness. The best training is to hike, especially over hills. Next best are running, swimming, bicycling, or other cardiovascular exercises. Your feet should also be well prepared—make sure you have sturdy, comfortable footwear.

WEATHER

This journey can be enjoyed year-round. Altitude is the biggest climatic consideration in Guatemala. In the highlands, including Antigua, Guatemala City, Atitlan, and Chichicastenango, the altitudes are between 4,300 and 6,900 feet and the daytime temperatures are usually 65°F to 80°F. Humidity is rarely a problem in the highlands. At night in the highlands, have a jacket handy because temperatures can drop as low as the 30s. However, in the lowland Petén jungle at Tikal, it is very humid and daytime temperatures are in the 80°Fs. There are two general seasons in Guatemala. From May to October, skies are a mix of sunshine and clouds and you can expect periodic short tropical downpours in the late afternoons, clearing for the evening. From November to April, it is cooler, with clearer skies and cold nights, especially in December and January.
