

Madagascar: Off the Beaten Path

Madagascar has been isolated from mainland Africa since the time of the dinosaurs and possesses rare life forms found nowhere else, from over 100 species of lemur to wildly colorful chameleons (ranging from thumbnail-sized to two feet long!). In this unique world, we bring you into seven environments, from sandstone canyons to mountain rainforests. We maximize your experience with your choice of



guided walks each day, whether a photo-paced ramble or an invigorating hike. You'll hear the haunting calls of the "singing indri" deep in the forest, meet wildlife researchers, visit reforestation projects—and even plant a seedling on the famed Avenue of the Baobabs!

What Makes This Trip Special?



MADAGASCAR'S MOST COMPREHENSIVE ITINERARY

You'll enjoy ample time to encounter endemic wildlife in Madagascar's widely varied ecosystems, ranging from lush Ranomafana (with its critically-endangered golden bamboo lemur) to the dry deciduous forest of Zombitse-Vohibasia, a biodiverse area that's the only place on earth to see Hubbard's sportive lemurs and Appert's greenbul (a pretty little pink-billed warbler) in the wild.

WATCH THE SUNRISE AT THE AVENUE OF THE BAOBABS

Almost everyone who visits Madagascar hopes to see the Avenue of the Baobabs, but many itineraries skip the site because it's a bit remote. We visit both at sunrise and in the slanting afternoon light, so you can get great photos of the magnificent trees here.



RARE WILDLIFE EXPERIENCES

Watch for "dancing" sifaka, "singing" indri, and many other species of lemurs, as well as the exotic, unusual birdlife (such as the endemic Amber Mountain rock thrush), chameleons of all sizes (one is as small as your thumbnail!), and other remarkable reptiles. Our expert local guides know where to find the wildlife, no matter how well camouflaged.



Travel to a fishing village by outrigger canoe, talk with local women weavers and see their hand-loomed designs, visit with traditional wood carvers and paper makers, and dance to live Malagasy music.



CHAMELEONS!

Madagascar is home to more than half of the world's 150 species of chameleons, including the huge, colorful Parson's chameleon and the tiny, one-inch *Brookesia micra*. While you can find chameleons everywhere you go, this itinerary includes visits to the six specific sites we recommend for viewing a wide range of species.



Photographers who want that perfect shot may opt for leisurely walks, while those who prefer a physical challenge can take longer hikes. We offer optional early morning outings for birders and night walks to observe nocturnal species, and we provide additional guides in the parks and reserves so you can choose your own pace.

The three-foot-tall indri lemurs, whose Malagasy name is *babakoto*, or "Father of Man," are renowned treetop acrobats whose eerie "songs" carry for miles as one troop calls another to establish their territories.






PARTICIPATE IN A REFORESTATION PROJECT

Learn about the country's unique environmental challenges in Andasibe. We'll meet our guide's son, who has been involved with reforestation for eight years, and a local man who has worked as a seed collector for 20 years. You'll have an opportunity to plant a seedling, supporting local conservation efforts.





EXPLORE ISALO NATIONAL PARK

Isalo is considered one of the best national parks of Madagascar. In this dramatic sandstone landscape dotted with stalagmite pinnacles, stunning gorges, canyons, and caves, enjoy an optional hike to a hidden waterfall cascading into a natural emerald-green pool fringed by oldworld pandanus trees.

DAY 1 WELCOME TO ANTANANARIVO

Arrive in the capital city, Antananarivo, often called simply "Tana," where you are met for transfer to the Hotel Carlton for a trip orientation and cocktails. This evening, we gather for our Welcome Dinner and later enjoy a private performance of Malagasy singing accompanied by the valiha, Madagascar's national instrument, a type of zither crafted from bamboo. Overnight at the Hotel Carlton...D

DAY 2 LA MANDRAKA / ANDASIBE-MANTADIA NATIONAL PARK

Heading out of the capital today, we travel through highland countryside to the upland rainforests of Andasibe, stopping along the way at La Mandraka Nature Farm, where we are introduced to the incredible variety of Madagascar's reptiles (La Mandraka has a breeding project for chameleons). We continue to Andasibe-Mantadia National Park, a rainforest reserve created to protect the Indri, the largest living lemur species. The forests here hold a wealth of lush fern and orchid species, fantastic birdlife, and colorful reptiles including huge Parson's chameleons. Tonight we set out for an evening walk for a glimpse into the fantastic nocturnal world of Madagascar's forests—we'll look for dwarf, woolly, and mouse lemurs, plus frogs and chameleons. Overnight at Mantadia Lodge…BLD

Approximate driving time: 4 hours, not including stops en route







DAYS 3-4 "SINGING" INDRI INDRI AT ANDASIBE

Andasibe is famous as the home of the indri, a black-and white lemur whose haunting treetop calls carry for miles as one troop answers another. These three-foot-tall primates, whose Malagasy name is babakoto, or "Father of Man," are the largest of lemurs and renowned treetop acrobats, although they spend much of the day sleeping in the canopy. We get an early

start on the trail to see the indri and hear its "singing." Common brown lemurs, grey bamboo lemurs, and woolly lemurs are also found here, as well as several species of the small, nocturnal tenrec, an insectivorous mammal resembling a hedgehog. Our hikes give us a good opportunity to become familiar with the special flora and fauna of Madagascar's

eastern rainforests. While we are at Andasibe on Days 3 and 4, we offer optional early morning birding walks as well as one or two additional guides on the hikes so avid photographers have time to take pictures and trip members who prefer easier trails can enjoy a more leisurely pace. We'll visit Analamazoatra Reserve, home to nine species of lemur, and the forests of nearby Mantadia, where we may see the beautiful diademed sifaka. One afternoon we will visit Andasibe village and its reforestation project, with tea at a local guide's home.

Overnights at Mantadia Lodge...BLD each day

DAY 5 LEMUR ISLAND / ANTANANARIVO

A morning visit brings us to Lemur Island, a home for orphaned lemurs who would not have survived on their own. Because they're cared for by rangers, the brown lemurs, bamboo lemurs, and black-and-white ruffed lemurs that

live here are habituated, allowing close encounters and excellent photo opportunities. This afternoon we return to Tana, with dinner on your own and the evening at leisure. The Trip Leader will be happy to make restaurant recommendations, depending on how fancy or local you want to go. Overnight at the Hotel Carlton...BL

Approximate driving time: Andasibe-Antananarivo, 4 hours

DAY 6 MORONDAVA / AVENUE OF THE BAOBABS

Fly by private charter to the seaside town of Morondava, with its markets bursting with colorful displays of fruits, vegetables, and spices. In the mid-afternoon, we'll head to the stunning Avenue of the Baobabs, where these majestic trees, which can live thousands of years and grow to well over 100 feet in

circumference, push high into the sky. In collaboration with a local reforestation project, we'll plant baobab seedlings in this spectacular setting, then relax with Malagasy sundowners

as we enjoy the sunset beneath these majestic trees. Dinner and overnight are at the beachside Hotel Palissandre Cote Ouest in Morondava...BLD Approximate flying time: 1.5 hours

DAY 7 AVENUE OF THE BAOBABS / KIRINDY FOREST

Today we're up early to watch the sunrise at the Avenue of the Baobabs and explore the dry, deciduous Kirindy Forest. The highly threatened ecosystem here is habitat for the Verreaux's

sifaka—a statuesque, white lemur with a black face and "hat"—as well as several endemic chameleons; it is also the most likely place to see the elusive cat-like fossa, Madagascar's largest carnivore. The late afternoon is free so you can relax at the beach listening to the lapping waves and feeling the sea breeze. Watch the sunset, or schedule a massage at the hotel Palissandre Cote Ouest's spa if you wish...BLD

Approximate driving time: Morondava-Kirindy, 3 hours each way

DAY 8 FIANARANTSOA / RANOMAFANA NATIONAL PARK

In the morning, we fly by private charter from Morondava to Fianarantsoa, where we board our vehicles for a scenic two-hour drive to Ranomafana. We'll pass rolling hills, green rice paddies, and colorful villages en route, and there's time to stretch our legs and meet local farmers along the way.

Ranomafana, one of Madagascar's richest rainforest reserves,

is set majestically on the edge of Madagascar's High Plateau. This lush rainforest shelters many species of lemurs, including red-bellied, black-and-white ruffed, red-fronted brown, eastern bamboo, and Milne-Edwards' sifaka—as well as the rare golden bamboo lemur, which primatologist Patricia Wright discovered here. Afternoon visit to the ValBio Center, a world-class research station set on the edge of the park.

DAY 9 RANOMAFANA: RAINFOREST AND RARE SPECIES

We'll enjoy a morning walk as we look for lemurs, geckos, and chameleons such as the nose-horned, carpet, canopy, and Perinet chameleons. Ranomafana is also home to a multitude of bird species, including the blue coua, broad-billed roller, velvet asity, and slender-billed flufftail. The terrain in this densely forested park is sometimes steep and the trails can be slippery, but the rewards of seeing this exotic wildlife make it well worth the effort. We offer guided options each day for easier, slower hikes (ideal for photographers), more challenging hikes, and early morning birding excursions, or you can birdwatch on your own from the ValBio Center. Afterwards visit the botanical garden at Ranomafana. Overnight at Hotel Thermal...BLD

DAY 10 RANOMAFANA / AMBALAVAO

In the morning hike in Ranomafana. After lunch vsit the nearby women's weaving cooperative and drive to Ambalavao.

We continue our overland journey south into the tapia woodlands and palm savannas of the high plateaus today, passing through stunning scenery. Overnight at Betsileo Country Lodge, set near Anja Reserve...BLD Approximate driving time: 4 hours, plus stops en route

DAY 11 ANJA RESERVE / RING-TAILED LEMURS / ISALO NATIONAL PARK

Drive to Isalo with a stop at Anja Reserve, a community-run park that is home to some 500 friendly ring-tailed lemurs. We'll take a one-hour hike on a flat trail with rock outcrops graced by these delightful creatures (great for photo ops!). Arriving in Isalo National Park in the early afternoon, we check into our hotel for dinner. Overnight at Le Jardin du Roy, one of the nicest properties in Madagascar...BLD Approximate driving time: 5 hours, plus stops en route

DAYS 12-13 LEMURS / THE WINDOW OF ISALO / WATERFALL HIKE / ZOMBITSE-VOHIBASIA

Isalo's landscape is dominated by a Jurassic sandstone massif eroded by the elements into surreal ridges with impressive gorges, canyons, and stalagmite pinnacles. The park shelters ring-tailed, red-fronted brown, and Verreaux's sifaka lemurs, as















well as endemic plants and sacred Bara burial sites in the high cliffs.

In the morning, enjoy a hike to the Piscine Naturelle, a refreshing natural pool surrounded by leafy pandanus trees, with magnificent views of the sandstone peaks along the trail. We'll return to the hotel around 2:00 pm with the rest of the afternoon at

biodiversity. We may see Appert's greenbul, a rare endemic bird found in this forest, and Standing's day gecko, also endemic to the park. Return to Isalo for a late lunch. Overnight at Le Jardin du Roy...BLD each

The next day we drive to Zombitse-Vohibasia National Park (1.5 hours), a rare example of Madagascar's dry deciduous

DAY 15 COOKING CLASS / DEPARTURE

This morning before you depart today, you have the option to join a fun Malagasy cooking class at a restaurant close to the airport. Those who participate in the class will head out early to visit a local market with the restaurant's crew as they purchase the day's ingredients. If you don't want the early start, you may go directly to the cooking class at around 10:00 am. At the restaurant, your class will be right in the kitchen, and the Malagasy staff will show you how to create dishes with the striking flavors that characterize Malagasy cuisine. You'll dine on the delicacies you prepared, or enjoy a dish that you didn't have an opportunity to sample during the trip. Transfer to the airport for homeward-bound flights…BL

Ankarana and Amber Mountain Pre-trip Extension

DAY 1 WELCOME TO MADAGASCAR

Afternoon arrival is in Madagascar's capital city, Antananarivo—often referred to simply as "Tana." You'll be met and transferred to Les Relais des Plateaux, conveniently located near the airport. Meals today are on your own.

DAY 2 AMBER MOUNTAIN NATIONAL PARK / CHAMELEONS

We fly to Diego Suarez, then take a short drive to Amber Mountain National Park, a biologically diverse reserve with its own unique microclimates: the montane rainforests here are home to huge green tree ferns, crystal-clear crater lakes, picturesque waterfalls, and a wealth of wildlife, including endemic species not found in the south of Madagascar. We'll see Sanford's brown lemurs and some of the 35 species of endemic birds, more than 40 species of butterflies, and 1000 species of flora that live in the park. It's also home to 60 species of reptiles, including photogenic leaf tailed geckos and the planet's smallest chameleon (about the size of a fingernail). We'll look for huge Parson's chameleons, colorful panther chameleons, blue-nosed chameleons, globe-horned chameleons, stump-tailed chameleons, and many others—this may be the best place in the world to see chameleons in the wild. Afterward, we return to Diego Suarez and overnight at the Hotel Allamanda...BLD

DAY 3 ANKARANA NATIONAL PARK

In the morning we drive for about 2.5 hours to Ankarana and check in at the Ankarana Lodge. Simple but comfortable, the lodge is ideally located near the park, and is frequented by brightly-colored chameleons and several species of lemurs—it's a great spot for photography. After lunch at the lodge we enjoy the afternoon at Ankarana National Park, a reserve with spectacular landscapes, including the unique eroded limestone towers that make up the famed *tsingy* terrain. Overnight at Ankarana Lodge...BLD

DAY 4 ANKARANA / HIKING THE TSINGY

In the morning we visit Ankarana National Park, hiking for two to three hours on a flat, easy trail. We should see many crowned lemurs (the reserve harbors one of the largest and least disturbed populations of this distinctive primate, endemic to northern Madagascar) as well as the inquisitive ringtailed mongoose, fossa, tenrecs, and the Madagascar striped civet. Ankarana is outstanding for reptiles, with 50 species including endemic and threatened geckos—plus 10 species of frogs. There's also an option for a longer hike today (for early risers). It's challenging, but rewards you with superb views of

the tsingy formations—you can even see them from above as you cross a long, hanging bridge on this route. We've hired an additional guide so you can relax at the campsite and look for the local lemurs if you decide not to hike. We return to Ankarana Lodge for overnight…BL

DAY 5 ANKARANA / TSINGY

This morning, enjoy a return drive to Diego Suarez. After lunch, visit the Bay of Sakalava, a popular kitesurfing destination, as well as the Bay of Dunes and Bay of Pigeon out to the Orangea beach. We arrive at the Allamanda Hotel before sunset for overnight...BL

DAY 6 ANTANANARIVO

In the morning we fly to Antananarivo and transfer to the Hotel Carlton, with the remainder of the day at leisure. Lunch and dinner are on your own...B



DAY 7 ANTANANARIVO / DAY 1 OF THE MADAGASCAR: OFF THE BEATEN PATH TRIP

Anjajavy Extension

DAY 1 ANTANANARIVO / ANJAJAVY LODGE

Depart Antananarivo on a scheduled charter flight to the airstrip at Anjajavy Lodge, set along the isolated Anjajavy Peninsula on the northwest coast of Madagascar. The flight takes approximately one hour and 40 minutes, and you'll be met on arrival for transfer to the lodge.

Anjajavy consists of 24 two-story rosewood villas dotting a long, sandy beach on the lodge's private estate. The villas are air conditioned and have a spacious terrace facing the sea, a living room, and a breakfast nook. There is a large swimming pool overlooking the ocean. Fresh fruits, crabs, shrimp, and local fish are on the restaurant's menu, with indoor or outdoor dining available. Private dinners can be organized by staff on the veranda, poolside, or on the beach.

In the late afternoon around 5pm, enjoy tea time at the Oasis, a specially designed native garden surrounded by trees that are a playground for wild lemurs as well as parrots, sunbirds, Malagasy kingfishers, and Malagasy paradise flycatcher. At 7 pm, head out for an hour-long guided night walk, an opportunity to learn about the nocturnal wildlife of the forest. Overnight at Anjajavy Lodge...D

Note: Scheduled charter flights depart on Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday. This extension requires a minimum 3-night stay.

DAYS 2-3 ANJAJAVY RESERVE

Deciduous dry forest is one of the world's richest and most distinctive tropical dry forests, sheltering communities of rare and endemic faunal and floral species and scattered with small traditional villages. The Anjajavy forest is home to chameleons, frogs, and common brown lemur, as well as nocturnal species such as sportive, and mouse lemur. More than five lemur species can be seen on walks in the Anjajavy Reserve (and even while you're on the deck of your villa). Birdlife includes flocks of grey-headed love birds, vangas, crested couas, and vanga parrots.

Activities on these days can be tailored to your taste. Enjoy a walk through the towering baobab forest or through a tsingy labyrinth, or cove to cove hikes along the cliff path. Some walks you can do on your own and some require a lodge guide. Mountain bikes are offered, as are guided catamaran trips. Single and double kayaks are available for a paddle along the



south coast of the reserve. More than 135 bird species have been recorded at Anjajavy, many of them rare or endangered; for birders, an early morning trip accompanied by a birding guide is a memorable experience. An optional excursion is offered out to island-dotted Moramba Bay for fishing, snorkeling, or swimming. The bay has one of the largest coral reefs outside Australia. Visit the nearby fishing village that is home to many of the friendly people employed by the lodge. Overnights at Anjajavy Lodge...BLD each day

DAY 4 FLY ANJAJAVY / ANTANANARIVO

Depart for the lodge airstrip and fly to Antananarivo to connect to international flight (international flights should depart after 2pm)...B

Wilderness Travel hires the best local naturalist guides in each park. They are highly trained, with a deep understanding of the flora and fauna in their locations. Many of have helped internationally acclaimed researchers find the most elusive animals, birds, and plants in Madagascar: one guided British naturalist and broadcaster David Attenborough; another is a skillful birdwatcher and also specializes in Madagascar's exquisite orchids and succulents; yet another is an expert on Ranomafana's rare and intriguing golden bamboo lemur. MANTADIA LODGE

Andasibe National Park, Madagascar Days 2 to 4 (3 nights)

The modern Mantadia Lodge has a beautiful setting on a high ridge overlooking a private rainforest. Guest bungalows have sliding doors opening onto a private patio, and the lodge's restaurant was designed with large windows to take in the spectacular views. There is also a lounge, large outdoor terrace, and bar. The calls of indri lemurs in the surrounding rainforest can often be heard from the property, and there is good birdlife all around.



HOTEL PALISSANDRE COTE OUEST

Morondava, Madagascar Days 6 to 7 (2 nights)

Ideally located on Nosy Kely beach, this beach hotel offers a relaxing atmosphere, with clean and spacious air-conditioned, thatch-roofed beachside bungalows featuring lovely views of the sea. Enjoy a swim in the small swimming pool, and linger a while after dinner to gaze at the sunset and the glittering night sky.



HOTEL THERMAL

Ranomafana National Park, Madagascar Days 8 to 9 (2 nights)

Set on the edge of Ranomafana National Park, this comfortable 21-room hotel was formerly a health resort. Spacious guestrooms are air-conditioned and feature amenities including TV, safe, and mini-bar. Make time to take a stroll on the lovely grounds. The hotel is committed to sustainable tourism development in cooperation with the local community.

BETSILEO COUNTRY LODGE

Ambalavao, Madagascar Day 10 (1 night)

Nestled amid foothills of the mountains stands the Betsileo Country Lodge. Guest rooms range from bungalows set in the peaceful garden to standard rooms attached to the main building. All rooms have airy windows, nice beds, and en-suite bathrooms. The staff is friendly and helpful and there is a nice restaurant and bar on the property. If you have time, take a dip in the swimming pool.



HOTEL LE DARJIN DU ROY

Isalo National Park, Madagascar Days 11 to 14 (3 nights)

The park-like setting and thoughtful design of Jardin du Roy makes it blend beautifully into the landscape. Architectural details include Madagascan motifs worked into stone-built walls. Guest rooms are large, clean, and comfortable, with mosquito nets and a veranda or balcony. The high-ceilinged open lobby has hand-crafted stonework, with a comfortable bar and lounge at one end and the dining room at the other. Service is attentive and efficient.

INTERNATIONAL AIR TRAVEL

You are responsible for making your own arrangements for flights to and from Madagascar. Flights to Madagascar are still limited but the following carriers do offer service to Madagascar. You may need extra days before or after your trip (Wilderness Travel can book additional services for you).

There is no longer direct service from Johannesburg, South Africa to Antananarivo, Madagascar. That routing may resume in the future but is currently not available.

Ethiopian Airlines offers several flights a week from Addis to Antananarivo. Website: www.ethiopianairlines.com

Kenya Airways offers several flights a week from Nairobi to Antananarivo (Mondays, Wednesday, and Fridays). Website: www.kenya-airways.com

Air France offers several flights a week. Air France sometimes has flight schedule changes or cancelled flights so you may need to be flexible in the event of schedule changes. Website: www.airfrance.us

There are many online consolidators for booking travel, but for more personal help arranging air transport, you can contact Exito Travel at 1-800-655-4053 in the US or 1-800-670-2605 in Canada, or www.exitotravel.com.

Depending on your routing, it is necessary to depart from the US one or possibly two days prior to Day 1 of the trip itinerary. The name on your air ticket must match the name on your passport exactly, and your passport must be valid for at least six months after your date of return to the US.

Please do not purchase your tickets until you have checked your schedule with our office. Once your tickets have been purchased, please forward the email confirmation from the airline so we can reserve your airport transfers. It is your responsibility to ensure your flight times coordinate with the arrival and departure logistics for the trip.

INTERNAL FLIGHTS

We need to issue your internal flights as soon as you are confirmed on the trip. Your Trip Leader will handle your international ticket. We will need a PDF copy of your passport page emailed to us.

What to Expect

WHAT THE TRIP IS LIKE

The trip is Level 2+, Easy to Moderate. It features day hikes in national parks, with accommodations that range from city hotels to basic wildlife lodges. You should be fit, healthy, and ready for adventure because the walking trails in Madagascar's parks can be quite slippery and muddy and temperatures can be extreme. Several of the travel days involve long drives and road conditions can be rough.

A Special Note About Travel in Madagascar

Traveling in Madagascar is always an adventure! Changes and delays are all part of the experience. We will make every effort to follow the Detailed Itinerary as described, but please note it may be rearranged due to unforeseen circumstances beyond our control, including internal flights that are often subject to delay, cancellation, and last-minute schedule changes. In addition, travelers should be aware that there is a scarcity of medical facilities outside of Antananarivo and they may not be up to international standards. A spirit of adventure and a flexible, cooperative attitude are musts. Your reward is an unparalleled experience of one of the world's most intriguing countries and its fascinating wildlife.

WEATHER

Madagascar has a tropical climate with many microclimates, so the weather can vary greatly depending on the time of year and region of the country. The north and south tend to be warm and dry, while the highlands, including the capital, Antananarivo, are cooler. Daily temperatures typically range from the low 60s to the high 80s. Our departures are set for the dry season (April-November), where you can expect warm weather (don't forget your sun protection), but also some rain and muddy road conditions.
