Traditional desert tribes, camels painted with henna, airy Mughal palaces of marble and onyx—our Rajasthan adventure brings a wonderfully colorful experience of India. We'll have sunrise and sunset visits to the Taj Mahal, a camel ride and sunset dune walk amid herders' camps at the Pushkar or Nagaur fairs (or attend a village Holi Festival some departures), and enjoy a stay at the atmospheric Rambagh Palace—once the home of the Maharaja of Jaipur. We'll also take a Jeep safari in search of leopards, visit the village of Rohet, with its folk ceremonies, and finish in romantic Udaipur, exploring whitewashed havelis (mansions), parks, and temples on the shores of Lake Pichola.

DAY 1

DELHI, INDIA

Arrive in Delhi, where you are met by a WT representative and transferred to the hotel. Overnight at Claridges Hotel...meals on your own

DAY 2

AGRA FORT / SUNSET AT TAJ MAHAL

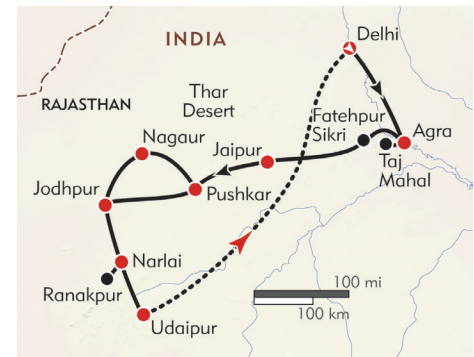
We head to the city of Agra, capital of the Mughal Empire from the 16th to the early 18th centuries. Our afternoon explorations include the beautiful four-gated Agra Fort, the first major building project of the Emperor Akbar, built in 1565 on the site of an earlier castle. Later in the day we make a sunset pilgrimage to the exquisite Taj Mahal, set on the banks of the Yamuna River. This white marble palace was constructed over a 21-year period from 1632 to 1653 by Emperor Shah Jahan in memory of his wife, Mumtaz Mahal, who died in childbirth. It was described by the English poet Sir Edwin Arnold as "Not a piece of architecture, as other buildings are, but the proud passions of an emperor's love wrought in living stones." Note: In order to be at the Pushkar/Nagaur fairs on the optimal days, your sunrise or sunset viewing of the Taj Mahal may take place at the Mehtab Bagh ("Moonlight Garden"), a beautiful viewpoint on the Yamuna River just opposite the Taj. In the evening we gather for a Welcome Dinner. Overnight at the ITC Mughal Agra...BLD
Approximate Driving Time: 4-5 hours

DAY 3

SUNRISE AT TAJ MAHAL / FATEHPUR SIKRI / JAIPUR / RAMBAGH PALACE HOTEL

After a sunrise visit to the Taj, we depart Agra for the haunting desert ruins of Fatehpur Sikri, once the capital of Mughal Emperor Akbar. The emperor and his court stayed here only from 1570 to 1586, and this fabulous city of red sandstone has lain abandoned ever since. The palaces and courtyards remain in pristine condition, offering us an extraordinarily accurate glimpse of a Mughal city. After lunch at the Bagh Resort, a 12-acre property with 200-year-old orchards and garden in the ancient town of Bharatpur, we head to Jaipur, the capital of Rajasthan. Along the way we stop at the baori, a 17th century step-well that goes down nine levels into the ground with pillared hallways and verandas. Our unforgettable accommodation this evening and tomorrow is the Rambagh Palace Hotel, the former princely residence of the Maharaja of Jaipur, now a wonderful hotel managed by the prestigious Taj group. Set right in the heart of Jaipur, the palace is a beloved landmark full of original paintings, marble sculptures, and sparkling fountains. There are vast lawns where peacocks roam as well as a large indoor pool and places to play croquet. The Old India atmosphere has been lovingly retained while modern amenities add to the comfort...BLD

Approximate Driving Time: 2-3 hours to Fatehpur Sikri, 4-5 hours to Jaipur



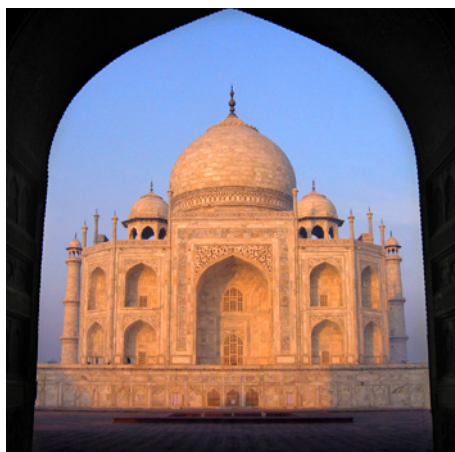

DAY 4

JAIPUR / RAMBAGH PALACE HOTEL

Jaipur, is a remarkable ancient city of palaces and fortresses of famed “pink” sandstone architecture. Built by Maharaja Jai Singh II in the early 18th century, elegant Jaipur is unsurpassed as a testament to the craftsmanship of the old masters. Fresco painting and mirror work were two renowned forms of adornment here, and the frescoed interior spaces in Jaipur’s forts and gracious residences show preening peacocks, caparisoned elephants or often floor-to-ceiling extravaganzas of flowers and stylized motifs.

Our full day of sightseeing includes Jaipur’s City Palace, a splendid blend of traditional Rajasthan and Mughal architecture, inside of which is the unique Jaipur Observatory, which looks futuristic although it was built in the 1700s. Also within this great palace complex is the Hawa Mahal (Palace of the Winds), not a palace at all but a five-story facade of more than 900 ornately decorated sandstone windows where the women of the royal family could look out over the street scene of the city but not be seen. We also visit the bustling market, one of the most vibrant in Asia, renowned for embroidered textiles, jewelry, and precious stones. In a valley near Jaipur, we visit the mighty Amber Fort, a Rajput hilltop stronghold fortified by natural hills and high ramparts. Overnight at the Rambagh Palace Hotel...BLD

DAYS 5-6

PUSHKAR OR NAGPUR CAMEL FAIR

November Departure (Pushkar Camel Fair):

Heading into Rajasthan’s countryside, we reach the ancient Hindu pilgrim town of Pushkar to witness the extraordinary Pushkar Fair, held each year in the Indian month of Kartik (Oct.-Nov.) for the two weeks leading up to the first full moon. The small, sleepy town of Pushkar comes alive with brilliant color as hundreds of thousands of pilgrims arrive for a ritual cleansing of the soul in the waters of Pushkar Lake, a holy lake in the center of town surrounded by bathing ghats and whitewashed temples. This two-week-long religious gathering in turn attracts all kinds of trading opportunities for Rajasthani villagers. In the desert, the raising of animals is far more important than agriculture, and with livestock trading so central to the culture, Pushkar has developed into one of the largest camel, cattle, and horse markets in the world.

The atmosphere on the dunes outside Pushkar, where all the animals are kept, is a lively one, with families dressed in their festive best, chatting and trading. Even marriages may be arranged in this great annual meeting place. In Pushkar town itself, families gather at over 300 temples, singing religious chants, performing age-old Hindu rituals, and making wishes for their loved ones and ancestors by the lakeside. Nearby, the Pushkar Fairground is abuzz with activity, from tented bazaars to itinerant musicians to camel and horse owners proudly showing off prized animals adorned in hand-tooled leather saddles and beadwork.

We experience this spectacular fair with morning and evening walks amid the herder camps as the sound of temple bells drifts across the lake, on visits to the lakeside to watch Hindu priests perform pujas, and on camel rides through the fairgrounds, where singers and dancers celebrate around campfires. The Pushkar Fair is a dazzling experience of the vibrancy of India. It is also a coming together of traditional peoples to rejoice in the richness of their culture. Our Trip Leader will bring us deep into this world with his cultural insights and local connections. Royal Heritage Camp, our accommodation, is a comfortable tented camp with an excellent location for enjoying the fair. Please note that this property only serves vegetarian meals...BLD each day

Approximate Driving Time: 3 hours on Day 5

February Departure (Nagaur Fair):

We stop at the town of Pushkar for lunch and a short visit en route to Nagaur, a picturesque Rajput township that comes alive with activity as thousands and thousands of colorful camels and young bulls (the renowned Nagauri breed), along with oxen and horses, are brought in for trade and sale at the Nagaur Cattle Fair. These prized animals are lavishly adorned and even their owners flaunt colorful turbans and long moustaches. We spend the day enjoying the festivities of the fair, the second largest in all Rajasthan, held annually for eight days between late January and February. Along with camel and cattle trading, there are also events like tug-of-war and bullock races to entertain the fairgoers. In the evenings, there are campfires and performances of Rajasthani folk music. The fair is a great celebration, a coming together of traditional peoples to reaffirm their identity and rejoice in the richness of their culture. One evening at sunset, we enjoy a camel ride through the fair, a wonderful experience of this

DAY 7

JODHPUR

A morning journey brings us to Jodhpur, called the “Blue City” for the color of its traditional homes. We enjoy a walk through the colorful spice and textile markets, where craftsmen continue centuries-old artisan traditions. Overnight at the Raas Haveli, a charming boutique hotel set beneath the ancient Mehrangarh Fort...BLD

Approximate Driving Time: 4 hours

DAY 8

JODHPUR

This morning we explore the great Mehrangarh Fort, a grand edifice that straddles a steep rocky eminence rising over the desert valley. This red sandstone fort was founded in 1459 by Prince Jodha of the Rathore clan. Here we see the color and vibrancy of Rajasthan on a princely scale. Seven massive gateways lead into the walled city, with its temples and palaces, gardens and lakes. Passing through cannon-scarred gateways and walls that carry the poignant palm prints of proud Rajput queens who immolated themselves on funeral pyres, we enter a series of palaces and courtyards: the Pearl Palace, the Flower Palace, the Palace of Delight. Beautifully painted and delicately carved and ornamented, they house a royal collection of rare miniature paintings, silver howdahs, palanquins, armor and royal cradles. The remainder of the day is free to explore on your own...BLD

DAY 9

NARLAI

Departing Jodhpur, we head to Narlai, a village that once had a hundred temples (nowadays there are 22 that are open to visitors). We arrive at our hotel, Rawla Narlai, in time for lunch. In the afternoon we head to Ranakpur, famous for its marvelous complex of finely ornamented Jain temples. Nestled at the base of the Aravalli Hills, these hilltop temples are in a peaceful setting where peacocks and langur monkeys roam. One of the temples we visit is the Adinatha, the complex's most noteworthy building, with its 1,444 engraved pillars, no two of which have the same carvings. We return to our hotel in Narlai for dinner and overnight...BLD

Approximate Driving Time: 5-6 hours

DAY 10

NARLAI

We spend the day exploring the village of Narlai. You can visit the temple dedicated to “Aye Mata” where a miraculous flame is reputed to have burned for centuries, producing saffron instead of soot. Wishes made here are said to come true. You can also visit the cave temple dedicated to Lord Shiva, a cool, serene and silent oasis. Feeling energetic? Climb over 750 steps (an easy

30-minute walk up) to the top of Elephant Hill (so called as there is a 12-foot elephant statue right at the top). The hotel staff can accompany you on simple village walks to local homes, which allow an insight into the villagers' lives. In the evening we depart on a Jeep safari in search of leopards—the rugged countryside around Narlai is an ideal site for these elusive creatures. Overnight at hotel...BLD

DAY 11

KUMBALGARH / UDAIPUR

We drive through peaceful rural villages to reach little-known Kumbalgarh, with its enormous fort, the most imposing of the 32 forts built by the Maharana Kumbha in the 15th century. Set atop a high ridge, the fort is encircled by massive and spectacular walls that measure more than 20 miles in length. It's a steep walk to reach the palace at the top but well worth the effort for the panoramic views. After lunch, we continue to Udaipur, one of the most romantic cities in the world, with its palaces, traditional havelis (mansions), parks, fortresses, and temples on the shores of Lake Pichola. The afternoon is free to enjoy the atmosphere of our hotel and relax. Overnight at the Taj Fateh Prakash Palace...BLD

Approximate Driving Time: 8 hours

DAY 12

UDAIPUR

Today we explore the City Palace, set on a rocky bluff above the shore of the lake. It is truly an architectural marvel, actually a blend of 11 palaces, each built by successive maharajas during the 16th to 18th centuries. The crenellated walls of the City Palace are adorned with brilliant miniature paintings and decorative tiles and mosaics, and a warren of narrow passages connect courtyards and royal apartments. The triple-arched marble main entrance is where the maharanas (queens) of Udaipur were weighed and their weight in gold distributed to the populace. On the grand Suraj Gokhada ("Balcony of the Sun"), the Suryavanshi Maharanas of Mewar once stood to present themselves to the people. The Zenana Mahal, the women's quarters, are among the most spectacular spots in the palace. We also visit the elegant 18th century Sahelion-ki-Bari gardens, created as a retreat for the royal ladies, and Udaipur's local markets. The city is proud of its heritage as a center for the arts, and there is an abundance of craftwork including colorful Rajasthani puppets. We enjoy an evening boat ride on the lake, then gather for our festive Farewell Dinner this evening. Overnight at hotel...BLD

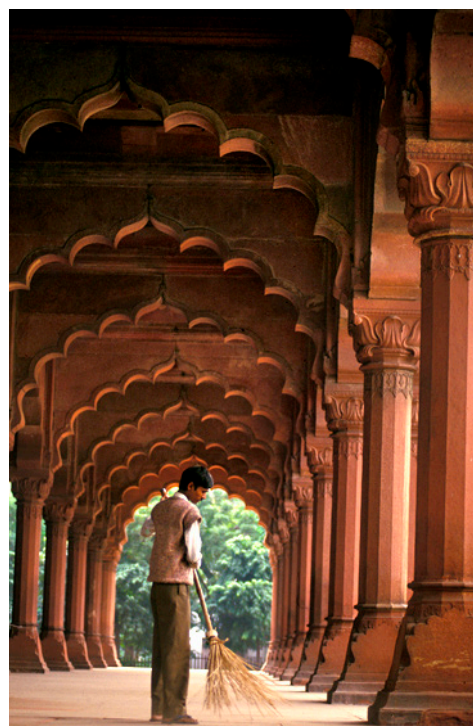
DAY 13

Holi Festival Itinerary

MARCH 5-17, 2025 DEPARTURE

Our March departure of Royal Rajasthan is timed for India's colorful Holi Festival, which symbolizes the beginning of spring, the victory of good over evil, and hope for a good harvest. Holi is a boisterous occasion in which families gather outside in the streets, douse each other with brilliantly colored powders and splash each other with water pistols to make the color stick! It's a bit messy, so we'll provide you with a set of traditional Indian clothes for this day, but it's all in fun, with sunset bonfires, special festival food, and traditional dances. The festival is sometimes said to be a reenactment of a game the Hindu god Lord Krishna played with his consort Radha and the gopis, or milkmaids.

DAY 1 DELHI, INDIA

Arrive in Delhi. Overnight at Claridges Hotels...meals on your own

DAY 2 DELHI / AGRA

We head to the city of Agra, capital of the Mughal Empire from the 16th to the early 18th centuries. Afternoon explorations of Agra Fort, with a sunset visit of the Taj Mahal. Overnight at the ITC Mughal Agra...BLD

Approximate Driving Time: 4-5 hours



DAYS 3-4 AGRA / FATEHPUR SIKRI / RANTHAMBORE NATIONAL PARK

After a sunrise viewing of the Taj Mahal on Day 3, depart Agra, visit Fatehpur Sikri and the Chand Baori Step Well, then arrive at Ranthambore National Park, with overnights at the Khem Villas, which neighbors the reserve. Haunt of tiger, leopard, crocodile, and sloth bear, Ranthambore is a vast wildlife reserve famed for its tiger population and the thousand-year-old Ranthambore Fort. With luck, we may see one of these majestic animals on our morning and afternoon game drives over Days 3 and 4...BLD each day
Approximate Driving Time (Day 3): 5-6 hours

DAYS 5-6 RANTHAMBORE NATIONAL PARK / JAIPUR

After breakfast on Day 5, we drive to Jaipur. Our unforgettable accommodation this evening and tomorrow is the Rambagh Palace Hotel, the former princely residence of the Maharaja of Jaipur, now a wonderful hotel set in the heart of Jaipur. On Day 6, our full day of sightseeing includes Jaipur's City Palace, Jaipur Observatory, and Hawa Mahal (Palace of the Winds). We also visit the bustling market, one of the most vibrant in Asia, and Amber Fort, a Rajput hilltop stronghold fortified by natural hills and high ramparts...BLD each day
Approximate Driving Time (Day 5): 3-4 hours

DAYS 7-8 JAIPUR / JODHPUR

A morning journey on Day 7 brings us to Jodhpur, called the "Blue City" for the color of its traditional homes. We enjoy a walk through the colorful spice and textile markets, where craftsmen continue centuries-old artisan traditions. On Day 8, we explore Mehrangarh Fort, which includes a series of palaces and courtyards: the Pearl Palace, the Flower Palace, the Palace of Delight. Beautifully painted and delicately carved and ornamented, they house a royal collection of rare miniature paintings, silver howdahs, palanquins, armor and royal cradles. Approximate Driving Time (Day 7): 4 hours

DAYS 9-10 RAWLA NARLAI / HOLI FESTIVAL

A 2.5 hour drive on Day 9 brings us to the serene Rawla Narlai Heritage Hotel in the Aravalli Hills. We'll visit the Ranakpur Temple and head out by jeep in the early evening for leopard viewing. The rugged countryside around Narlai is ideal for leopards. The next day, Day 10, we'll enjoy Holi Festival activities at Swaroop Sagar Lake – there will be a canopy tent set up with drinks and food throughout the day.



DAYS 11-12, RAWLA NARLAI / KUMBALGARH FORT / UDAIPUR

On Day 11, depart for Udaipur with a visit of Kumbalgarh Fort en route (drive time: approximately 4 hours). Today we have the afternoon to relax. On Day 12, explore the amazing City Palace and elegant 18th century Sahelion-ki-Bari gardens, created as a retreat for the royal ladies, and Udaipur's local markets. The city is proud of its heritage as a center for the arts, and there is an abundance of craftwork including colorful Rajasthani puppets. We enjoy an evening boat ride on the lake, then gather for our festive Farewell Dinner this evening. Overnights at the Taj Fateh Prakash Palace...BLD each day
Approximate Driving Time (Day 11): 4 hours

DAY 13 UDAIPUR / DELHI

After a morning for independent exploration, we fly to Delhi, where day rooms are held for us at the Radisson Blu Airport Hotel until 8:00 pm. SOUTH INDIA EXTENSION: THE MALABAR COAST

Roam the narrow lanes of Cochin, set along the Arabian Sea and a favorite port of call in the spice trade for two thousand years. Then, in enchanting tropical Kerala, watch the pageant of traditional riverside life as you journey through tranquil waterways and overnight aboard a beautiful private houseboat (and enjoy the good life as your on-board chef serves you a selection of savory Keralan cuisine!).

KANHA NATIONAL PARK EXTENSION

Kanha is one of the Indian subcontinent's greatest wildlife reserves and a great place in India to see the Royal Bengal tiger. Besides tigers, there are more than 200 species of birds and some 22 species of mammals in residence here. On guided excursions, explore by jeep through the park's bamboo thickets, dadar (plateau grasslands) and sal forests, which gave birth to Rudyard Kipling's classic *The Jungle Book*. Overnights are at the Baagh Resort, a comfortable jungle-surrounded retreat adjacent to the edge of the park, or the Taj Banjaar Tola (deluxe option), an elegant tented camp on the banks of the Banjaar River overlooking Kanha.

VARANASI AND KHAJURAHO EXTENSION

As one of the seven sacred cities of Hinduism, the holy city of Varanasi is a magnet for more than a million pilgrims from around the world who come annually to worship, meditate, and bathe in the sacred waters of the Ganges River. With your private guide, stroll through ancient alleys and past golden temples and ashrams, and watch the slanting sun rise over haunting riverside ghats. At the World Heritage Site of Khajuraho, discover some of India's most famous temples, a showcase of sculpture reflecting the celebration of human activity in everyday life. Accommodations throughout are in garden-set hotels, oases of comfort after an active day of exploring.

Experience one of life's rare treats—a stay at the Rambagh Palace, an authentic royal residence and a treasure of India, with its Rajasthani charm, centuries-old grandeur, and unparalleled level of service. Originally built in 1835 by a queen for her favorite handmaiden, the Maharaja of Jaipur made the Rambagh his royal residence in 1925, and its princely splendors abound in its lovely terraces, immaculate gardens, spacious corridors, and elegant rooms. This 5-star heritage hotel is truly in a class of its own, and a night here allows you to feel like a maharaja, too.



ROYAL HERITAGE CAMP

Days 5 to 6 (2 nights)

Pushkar Departures

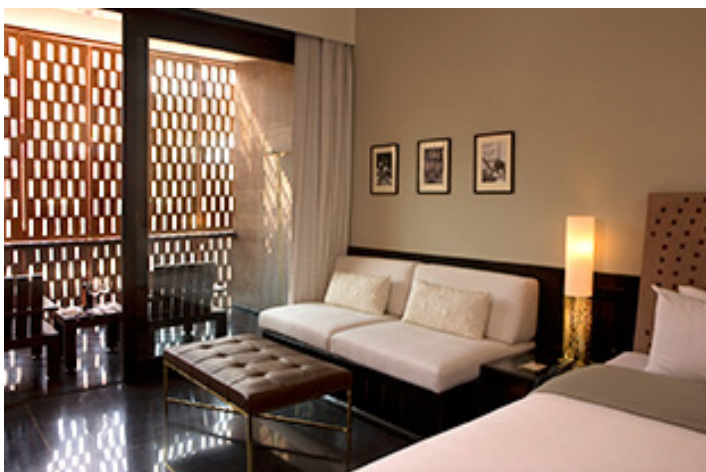
RANVAS NAGAU

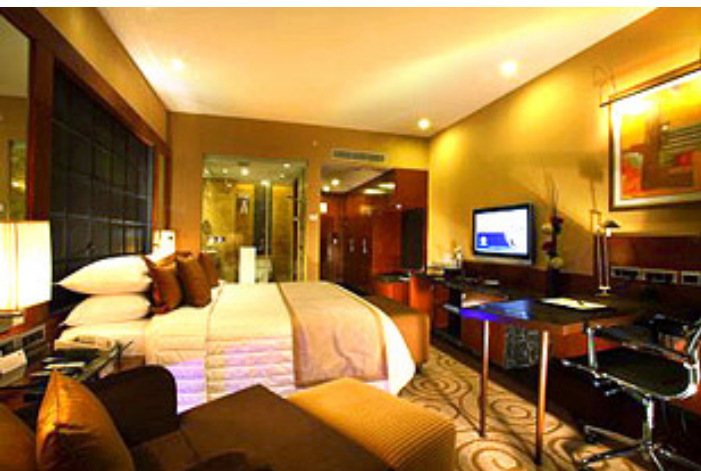


TAJ FATEH PRAKASH PALACE

An airport transfer is provided for flights departing in the evening or early the following morning. If your departing flight is after 2:00 am, you may want to extend the hotel day room to a full overnight (at additional cost).

If you are departing on a different day, extra hotel nights and airport transfers can be arranged at additional cost.

INTERNATIONAL AIR TRAVEL

You are responsible for making your own arrangements for flights to and from Delhi.

There are many online consolidators for booking travel, but for more personal help arranging air transport, you can contact Exito Travel at 970-818-8459 in the US or Canada. Depending on your routing, it is necessary to depart from the US one or possibly two days prior to Day 1 of the trip itinerary. We recommend you arrive at least one night early so that you have a full day to recover from jet lag. Extra hotel nights can be arranged (at extra cost). The name on your airline ticket must match the name on your passport exactly, and your passport must be valid for at least six months after your date of return to the US.

Please do not purchase your tickets until you are confirmed on the trip. Once your tickets have been purchased, please send us a copy of your airline schedule so we can reserve your airport transfers. It is your responsibility to ensure your flight times coordinate with the arrival and departure logistics for this trip.

Trip Details

WHAT THE TRIP IS LIKE

This trip is Level 1+, Easy. It is a comfortable, vehicle-based sightseeing trip. Accommodations include comfortable, modern hotels reflecting the traditional architecture of Rajasthan as well as former palaces and royal residences that have been converted into luxurious heritage hotels. At our tented camp at the Pushkar Fair, we sleep in Rajasthani-style air-conditioned tents furnished with cots and en suite facilities. There are some long days of driving on rough, bumpy roads.

An optional early morning camel ride is offered at the Pushkar or Nagaur fair for an “above the crowd” view of the activities around the fairgrounds as the day begins. Anyone participating in this optional activity must acknowledge the inherent dangers in riding and agree to accept any and all risks.

Please remember that travel in India is an intense experience. The essential requirements are flexibility, a sense of humor, curiosity, enthusiasm about new peoples and places, and an openness to the unexpected.

WEATHER

Like the rest of India, Rajasthan has four seasons. In winter (January to March), temperatures vary widely around the state of Rajasthan but this is an ideal season for travel. January is the coolest month of the year. April to June is pre-monsoon, the hottest season, particularly in May and June. June to September is the monsoon season, when 90 percent of the annual rains come. October to December, the post-monsoon season, is a very comfortable season for travel.
