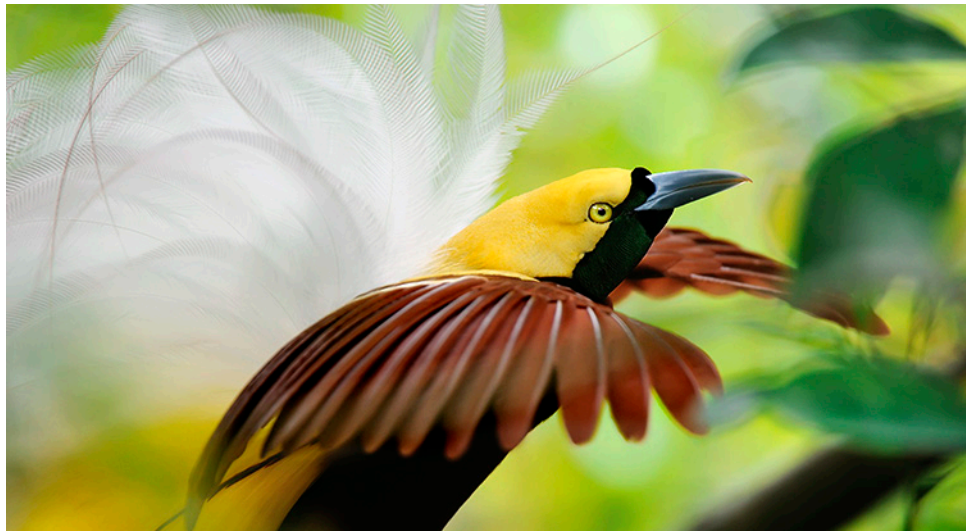

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Snorkeling with Whale Sharks in Cenderawasih Bay

With pristine reefs, white-sand beaches, and dramatic karst cliffs, Cenderawasih Bay in West Papua is stunning. Set in the heart of the Coral Triangle, Cenderawasih is also a biodiversity hotspot, renowned for its numerous endemic reef fish and corals. Aboard our 100-foot liveaboard schooner, we'll explore its hidden gems—plus enjoy two days of snorkeling and swimming with whale sharks, one of the most thrilling encounters on the planet. On shore, we visit villages, and we'll also take island walks to look for extraordinary birdlife, including the famed bird of paradise (“cenderawasih” in Indonesian), for whom this bay is named. This is a phenomenal natural history adventure!

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Itinerary

Please be aware that this itinerary is designed to be flexible. Although we will visit all the places listed on the itinerary, we rarely follow the schedule as described exactly due to weather, tides, preferences of trip members, and other factors. Come prepared to be flexible!

DAY 1 EMBARK / SNORKEL KALILEMON REEF

We embark on the traditional Indonesian schooner that will be our home for the next 11 days. Coffee and breakfast are served as we begin our expedition. During our afternoon snorkel on Kalilemon Reef, near the village of Kwatisore, be sure to look for giant clams and the recently-discovered endemic Cenderawasih longnose butterfly fish, with its bright yellow body and featherlike dorsal fins. Dinner on board this evening is followed by a presentation on whale sharks—fascinating creatures the size of a school bus that are one of only three known filter-feeding shark species. The pattern of their pale, yellowish spots and stripes is unique to each individual, allowing researchers to identify individuals from photos...BLD

Sailing Details: 5 hours, 32 nautical miles

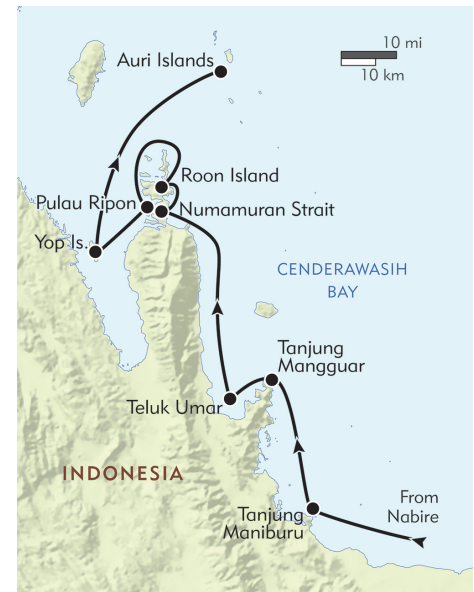
DAYS 2-3 SWIM WITH WHALE SHARKS!

Local fishermen have been using bagans (lift-net fishing platforms) here for several decades, and the whale sharks have learned to take advantage of them, sucking small baitfish from the nets. Believing the sharks bring good luck, fisherman encourage this association by throwing out a handful of fish now and again. Prime feeding times are in the morning and before dusk, and we should have the opportunity to snorkel in close proximity with the largest fish in the ocean as they circle, looking for a meal. On Day 3, we have another opportunity to spend time in the water with the whale sharks; we can also climb onto the bagan for a unique perspective and photo opportunities. We visit a village, meet residents, and discover the local culture on the afternoon of Day 3...BLD

Sailing Details: 30 minutes relocation each day

DAY 4 BIRDS OF PARADISE / BIRD'S HEAD SEASCAPE / TANJUNG KOROROWAI

A pre-dawn dinghy ride takes us deep into the bay near Tanjung Kororowai. As the jungle begins to come to life, we take a short but rugged hike through mangrove roots to the crest of a hill to watch and listen for the exquisite lesser bird of paradise. This is the beginning of mating season, so we'll be on the lookout for males with their flamboyant plumage. Back on board we'll have breakfast and set sail north towards the crystalline waters of Tanjung Mangguar (also known as "Bird's Head Seascape"), an epicentre of marine biodiversity. This area is home to more than 70 endemic species of reef fish, corals, and crustaceans, leading scientists to call it a "cauldron of evolution" and a "species factory." We'll see divaricate soft coral with its delicate branches, hawksbill turtles, manta rays, and feather stars. The islands also boast the most significant nesting beaches for Pacific leatherbacks, the world's largest and fastest-swimming turtle. Interesting geology topside and incredible topography beneath the surface make for fascinating snorkeling near the offshore rocks on

the northeastern point of Tanjung Mangguar before we tuck into the serene bay in front of Yapenyuar village for our overnight anchorage...BLD

Sailing Details: 3-3.5 hours, 21 nautical miles

DAY 5 GIANT CLAMS OF UMAR BAY / YAPENYUAR VILLAGE VISIT

Today we snorkel with 100-year-old giant clams on a horseshoe-shaped reef inside Umar Bay. This species, capable of reaching four feet in length and weighing over 500 pounds, has sometimes been referred to as the “man-eating” clam. But don’t worry—that reputation is completely undeserved (their main foods are algae and plankton). We’ll also look for brightly colored orange-and-white false clown anemonefish before setting off on a birding walk in search of hornbills, kingfishers, parrots, and eagles, all common here. Back on shore, villagers welcome us to their homes; the local children are eager to interact and practice their English...BLD

DAY 6 PAPUA AND ROON ISLAND / PADDLEBOARDING IN SEARCH OF DUGONGS

A morning sail takes us to brilliantly colored hard corals in the shallow Numamuran Strait, between Papua and Roon Island. The jungle descends right into the reefs here, and the snorkelling is stunning—look for *Acropora* branching corals, large boulder coral colonies, and cushion stars. We paddleboard around the picturesque anchorage, keeping our eyes peeled for the dugongs that graze on underwater grasses. Once hunted for their meat, oil, and teeth, these sea mammals are related to manatees and may have been the inspiration for ancient seafarers’ tales of mermaids...BLD

Sailing Details: 4-5 hours, 29 nautical miles

DAY 7 SNORKEL ABOVE WWII WRECKS / NUMAMURAN STRAIT

We begin the day snorkelling above a Japanese Zero fighter plane resting in just 30 feet of water. Downed during WWII and coming to rest on a hard coral reef near the island of Pulau Rippon, this relic of war is now home to colorful fish. Hawksbill and green turtles, barracuda, and surgeonfish (think of Dory, from *Finding Nemo*) all live in the area. Surgeonfish keep reefs healthy by eating the algae that grow here, preventing them from choking the coral. In

the afternoon we stop at the beach where a babbling stream runs down from the forest into the ocean. The reef in front of the beach is lovely, with sea fans, blue sea stars, huge barrel sponges, an amazing array of hard and soft corals, and bright sea whips on reef “islands” above a white sand bottom...BLD

DAY 8 YOP ISLAND DRIFT SNORKEL

We anchor near Yop Island and travel by dinghy into Korio Bay, a narrow, one-mile-deep channel fringed with forest. The bird and plant life here are spectacular. Be sure to have your binoculars with you as we search for the dramatic Blyth’s hornbill and eclectus parrots, which are easy to spot because of their bright plumage (females are red; males are green with “candy corn” yellow beaks). We return to the boat for lunch, followed by an afternoon snorkel with endemic fish such as the colorful—and recently discovered—Nursalim flasher wrasse and the brilliant blue Giti’s demoiselle...BLD

Sailing Details: 2 hours

DAYS 9-10 PADDLEBOARDING IN THE AURI ISLANDS / SNORKELING ABOVE WWII WRECKS

Auri’s spectacular karst islands rise above the water’s surface like the backs of gigantic green sea monsters. Underwater, the scenery is just as incredible, with some of Indonesia’s most pristine coral reefs and a high concentration of endemic fish—plus a trio of American WWII fighter jets sunk in the shallows. Watch for elegant blacktip reef sharks and odd looking broadclub cuttlefish. Our days are filled with jaw-dropping beauty as we explore crystal-clear waters and enjoy lunchtime beach barbecues along white sandy shores beneath palm trees. Finish your days with cocktails on the beach as the setting sun turns the Cenderawasih sky to fire. We’ll be snorkelling and paddleboarding in paradise!...BLD

Sailing Details: 3 hours each day

DAY 11 FAREWELL TO PARADISE / DEPART

Having sailed overnight from Auri, we reach Nabire this morning and disembark. The crew will take your checked luggage to the airport. After breakfast, transfer to the airport for departure...B

In most years, no price changes are necessary. However, we do reserve the right to raise or lower the trip price if there is a significant change in costs or exchange rates. If this is the case, your final invoice will reflect the difference in trip cost.

BALI EXTENSION

Sculpted by dense tropical forests and dramatic coastlines famous for their waves, Bali shelters a unique combination of natural beauty and vibrant culture. This extension to the "land of the gods" whisks you to the lush artist's haven of Ubud, where you'll walk amid cascading rice terraces and sample Balinese specialties. Your guide will introduce you to local artisans and farmers and you'll have the opportunity to witness ceremony dances and visit tranquil temples. For those looking for an extra thrill, you have the option to dine 150 feet in the air during a hot-air balloon ride or rush down the white waters on a rafting excursion. Overnights are in lovely atmospheric hotels that blend into the environment. This extension can be taken either before or after your main trip.

YOGYAKARTA EXTENSION

Yogyakarta is situated almost exactly halfway along the length of Java, in an area considered by the Javanese to be the heartland of the country. It's home to some of the island's most spectacular scenery and oldest traditions. On this extension, you'll be immersed in the cultural capital of Java, with many influences from Hindu and Buddhist traditions to Dutch colonial designs. Enjoy a sunrise visit to the world's largest Buddhist monument, take a music lesson or batik dyeing class, and you even have the option for a Jeep excursion. This extension can be taken either before or after your main trip.

We HIGHLY recommend arriving in Nabire one day prior to Day 1 of the trip. For extra nights in Nabire, we recommend booking the Hotel Grand Papua Nabire. Wilderness Travel can book these nights for you, including your transfers to/from the hotel. Please see your Extra Services Request Form for more information.

Please note that Nabire has very little tourism infrastructure, so there are not many pre-trip hotel options. Hotels are basic and not up to high Western standards.

On Day 1 of the trip you will meet your Trip Leader in the lobby of the Hotel Grand Papua Nabire at 9:00 am for your group transfer to the boat.

On Day 11, the boat will be anchored near Nabire Airport and you will be transferred to the airport for your departure flight.

INTERNATIONAL AIR TRAVEL

You are responsible for making your own arrangements for flights to and from Indonesia.

While it is possible to fly to Nabire from various locations in Indonesia, such as Bali, we suggest Jakarta as it has the most efficient flight routes.

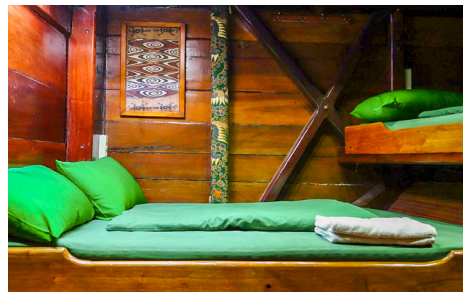
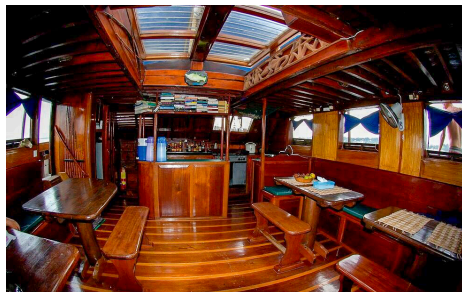
You will need to book international flights from your original destination to/from Jakarta or Bali on a larger international carrier, and then book separate flights to/from Nabire on a smaller regional carrier. For these smaller regional flights to/from Nabire, we recommend booking through Wings Abadi Air, which partners with Lion Air (www.lionair.co.id/en) and Batik Air (www.malindoair.com). Please note that most flights to/from Nabire will involve a separate connection through another Indonesia city, such as Jayapura (DJJ), Biak (BIK), Ambon (AMQ), or Timika (TIM).

There are many online consolidators for booking travel, but for more personal help arranging air transport, you can contact Exito Travel at 1-800-655-4053 in the US or 1-800-670-2605 in Canada. They are very adept at putting flight itineraries together, to even the most far-flung places. More information can be found at www.exitotravel.com.

Depending on your routing, it is necessary to depart from the US one or possibly two days prior to Day 1 of the trip itinerary. The name on your airline ticket must match the name on your passport exactly, and your passport must be valid for at least six months after your date of return to the US.

Please do not purchase your tickets until you are confirmed on the trip. Once tickets are purchased, please forward a copy of your email flight confirmation from the airline. It is your responsibility to ensure your flight times coordinate with the arrival and departure logistics for this trip.

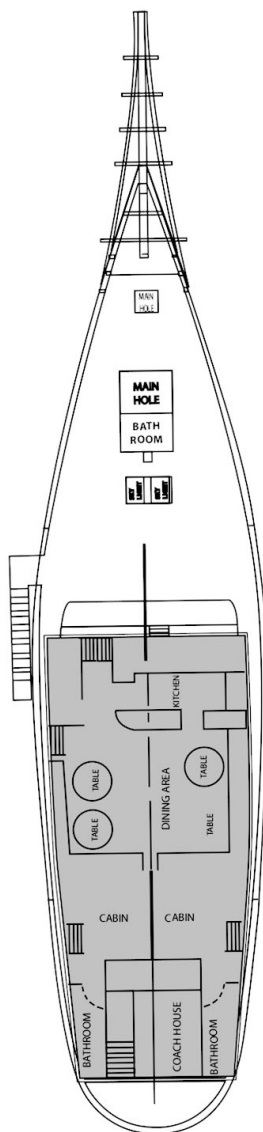

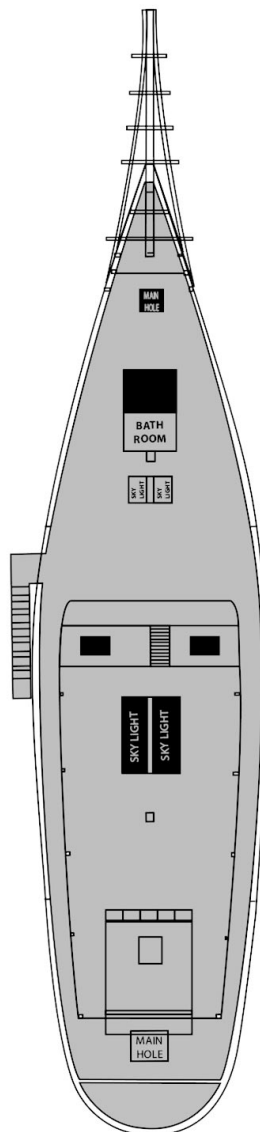
TRADITIONAL INDONESIAN SCHOONER

Our vessel is a double-masted traditional Indonesian sailboat that offers the unique opportunity to explore the incredibly remote, unique, and mystical Raja Ampat archipelago. The boat was built in Sulawesi in 2000 out of Indonesian hardwoods and is 100 feet long with a 21-foot beam. While not luxurious, she is comfortable, well maintained. There are six double cabins with en suite bathrooms, individually controlled air-conditioning, and electricity 24 hours a day. The boat is very sturdy and stable, whether still or under motor. The boat's crew of seven is attentive, experienced, and helpful, and many have worked on the boat for years. Note: There are four cabins below deck, and two cabins on the main deck (where the dining room and common areas are located). Please note that the cabins below deck require descending steep stairs/ladders, and that the cabins above deck are slightly smaller.

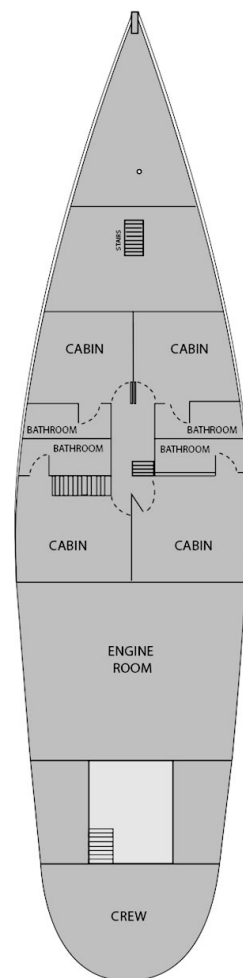

Bob Brunskill is an Englishman with two decades of experience planning and executing diving and snorkeling excursions in Indonesia. He left the United Kingdom in 2003 in search of adventure, which led him to Thailand, where he gained his diving certification, and later to Indonesia. Nineteen years and more than 10,000 dives later, he continues to pursue his passion to explore and introduce travelers to the underwater haven of this spectacular corner of the world. "I have been working in Raja Ampat for the last two decades and it continues to surprise me," he says. "Never the same twice, mother nature always amazes me, and it is a privilege to share this special experience with guests." He is fluent in Indonesian and has a deep appreciation for the people and culture in Papua and Indonesia. WHAT THE TRIP IS LIKE

This trip is rated a Level 3 (Moderate) according to our trip grading system.

How Tough is This Trip?

You need to be comfortable snorkeling in a variety of conditions, including drift snorkels and occasionally against strong currents. While snorkeling is usually at your own pace, it is sometimes necessary to be able to keep up with the group.

WEATHER

Cenderawasih Bay is very close to the equator and has a warm, tropical climate with year-round temperatures in the high 80s°F and occasional rain showers.
