Itinerary

DAY 1 KOCHI, INDIA

Arrive in Kochi (formerly Cochin) and transfer to the hotel. This intriguing old city in the green and tropical state of Kerala has a stunning location on a series of islands along the Arabian Sea as well as a long and colorful history as a trading city. Our accommodation in Kochi is the Brunton Boatyard, a boutique hotel with harbor-view rooms. We gather for a Welcome Dinner this evening...D

DAY 2 KOCHI

In our explorations today, we wander the old lanes of Fort Kochi and Mattancherry Palace, where we come upon such incongruous sites as traditional Dutch architecture, the Pardesi Synagogue, and other oddities that reflect the European influence on Kochi. Tonight we attend a performance of Kathakali, the elaborate and ancient dance-drama native to Kerala. Overnight at hotel... BLD

Kochi: The harbors of the Malabar Coast were a favorite port of call in the spice trade for two thousand years, attracting a mix of Arab, Christian, and Jewish settlers and traders from the Middle East. In the early 15th century, the Europeans arrived, and the Rajas of Kochi were keen to expand the spice trade and welcomed them. The British arrived thereafter and eventually took control of the lucrative spice trade. By 1800, Kochi was part of the British Madras Presidency. One of Kochi's old districts, Fort Kochi, is a quiet European enclave that still contains some fine old British mansions and a few Dutch cottages. Kochi's historic Mattancherry district bustles with traders in tea, jute, rubber, and spices, and is the area called Jewtown, where the Pardesi Synagogue, founded in 1568, still exists. Jews were a respected part of Keralan life until the arrival of the Portuguese, who brought the persecution of Jews with them. Many Jewish names are seen on houses and businesses in this district. Also in Mattancherry is the Mattancherry Palace, locally known as the Dutch Palace, built by the Portuguese and given as a gift to the Rajas of Kochi.

DAY 3 KERALA BACKWATERS CRUISE

A morning drive bring us to the romantic port town of Alleppey (known now as Alappuzha), once one of the best known seaports of the Malabar Coast. Much of the colorful traffic on Alleppey's waterways is from the thriving coconut fiber industry. On arrival, we board our houseboat for a relaxing cruise and overnight in the tranquil "backwaters" of Kerala, a beautiful region nestled between the sea and the hills of Kochi where we see people working their fields with water buffaloes, fishing with nets from traditional longboats, and washing clothes at the water's edge. We may even see some school boats (no school buses here) transporting uniformed children. The natural setting ranges from brilliant green paddy fields to tropical canopies dense with banana trees and coconut palms. We can glimpse through the trees at small farms, homes, churches, and mosques that dot the canals and lakes. We take our meals on




DAY 4 CARDAMOM HILLS / PERIYAR

Disembarking from our houseboats, we drive across rugged country roads through tea, spice, and rubber plantations to Periyar in the Cardamom Hills of the Western Ghat Mountains. At Periyar, set at a refreshingly cool altitude of around 3,500 feet, we stop in at a spice plantation and attend a performance of Kalairaputtu (a local martial art). Overnight at Spice Village, a collection of bungalows in a forested setting in Periyar...BLD

Driving Time: About 5 hours

DAY 5 PERIYAR

Centered on an artificial lake created by the British in 1895, Periyar was formerly the private hunting ground of the royal family of Travancore. It became a reserve in 1933. We enjoy a morning forest walk to look for Periyar's rich birdlife, shop for spices at local markets, and enjoy an afternoon gameviewing excursion by boat on the lake. Overnight at hotel...BLD



DAY 6 PERIYAR / MADURAI

We head to Madurai, one of the oldest cities in India, set on the River Vaigai. After lunch at our hotel, we explore this lively metropolis, with its bustling bazaars and history dating back over two thousand years. We stroll through a labyrinthine market full of produce, flowers, incense, and aromatic herbs, and enjoy a sunset view of the fortress-like Shri Meenakshi-Sundareshwarar temple, breathtakingly baroque with its profusion of gods, goddesses, rearing horses, and mythical figures. Its 12 towering gopuras (gateways) are visible for miles around. Overnight at the Gateway Hotel Pasumalai, an elegantly refurbished colonial home overlooking the city...BLD Driving Time: About 4 hours

DAY 7 MADURAI

Madurai's Meenakshi temple is one of the largest in India, enclosed by 15-foot-high walls and almost a city within a city. We take ample time to explore it, listen to the traditional temple music, and appreciate the beauty of its Shiva shrines. It is said that each day more than 15,000 faithful visit this temple, and there are about 50 bare-chested Shaivite priests in attendance. The principal shrines are closed to non-Hindus, but there's plenty to see, including ongoing weddings, religious instruction, and the prostrations of devotees at innumerable shrines. Time permitting, we may also visit the Nayak Palace, built in 1636 by King Thirumalai Nayak, or watch the sleeping ceremony at Shri Meenakshi. Overnight at hotel...BLD

Note: During Days 7-9, we may be lucky enough to come across a celebration of Pongal, a festival of thanksgiving during the year's harvest. Women decorate the ground entrance of their homes, and/or their central courtyards, with beautiful "kolams," artistic designs drawn with brightly-colored rice flour,

while people dress up in their best and gather in the villages for festivities like bull running, bike racing, and "uriyadi" (using a pole when blindfolded to smash a hanging pot).

DAY 8 KARAIKUDI

A scenic drive brings us through the "rice bowl" of Tamil Nadu, a lush, green landscape of paddy fields, coconut palms, and tiny, ancient villages. This region we pass through is known as Chettinad, cultural home of the Chettiars, a community that dates back to the Cholas and made its fortune as merchants and jewelry dealers. Not many Chettiars reside in Chettinad now. Most migrated in the 19th and 20th centuries to Sri Lanka, Singapore, Burma, and elsewhere, but they sent back lavish furnishings for their magnificent

ancestral mansions. We will visit intriguing off-the-beaten-path sites along the way, including a few Chettinad mansions and the ancient wayside Ayyanar temple, decorated with huge pottery figures of animals. We continue to the bustling town of Karaikudi, the district headquarters. Overnight at the Bangala Hotel in the heart of Chettinad country...BLD

Driving Time: About 2-3 hours

DAY 9

THANJAVUR / CHOLA TEMPLES / KUMBAKONAM

Beginning around the 9th century, the Chola kings constructed huge, elaborate Shiva and Vishnu temples all over Tamil Nadu—no other state of India is so dominated by temples and so famed for its temple architecture (more than 90 temples still exist!). Chola bronze sculptures are an art form known throughout the world, especially the variations on the famous "dancing Shiva," posed standing on one leg and surrounded by flames. The Cholas cast these images in bronze using the "lost wax" process known to have been used in India for thousands of years. The Tanjore (Thanjavur) school of painting, with its painted images decorated by semi-precious stones and gold leaf, originated in this town in the 18th century. We begin today with a two-hour drive to visit these stunning temples of Thanjavur, including the Brihdishwara temple, built by King Rajaraja I as a site of Shiva worship, which dominates the city's skyline. Local specialty shops have an amazing array of antique brass pots, old coins, copper plates, Tanjore paintings, and Thanjavur crafts. After lunch, we visit the bronze gallery at the museum and continue our drive to Kumbakonam, a former center of the Chola kings and the main commercial area for the Thanjavur region. Overnight at the Mantra Koodam, a peaceful retreat with a garden setting...BLD

Driving Time: About 4-5 hours, with stops

DAY 10 KUMBAKONAM

We visit fascinating sites including the spectacular Airavateshwara Temple



at Darasuram. This superb and little visited monument, a wonderful introduction to the Chola period sculpture, has fine black basalt images adorning its wall niches and inner shrines, including images of Nagaraja, the snake king, with his cobra hood, and Dakshinamurti, an image of Shiva as a teacher expounding under a banyan tree. We also visit the 17th century Kubareshwara Temple, which towers over the town. Overnight at hotel...BLD

DAY 11 PONDICHERRY

In the tiny village of Gangaikonda Cholapuram (its long name means "the town of the Chola who took the Ganges"), we explore a magnificent temple built by the Chola king Rajendra I in the 11th century. We then head to Pondicherry, the former capital of French India. The French relinquished their control of "Pondy" some 50 years ago, but reminders of the colonial days remain and the Tricolor flies over the grand French consulate. We'll enjoy a stroll through the beachside French Quarter, where we see richly ornamented Catholic churches and hear French spoken. Overnight at hotel...BLD

Driving Time: About 5 hours

DAY 12 MAMALLAPURAM

We drive to the small seaside town of Mamallapuram this morning and check into our hotel. Mamallapuram is known for its extraordinary rock-cut art, a legacy of the maritime Pallava Kingdom, for which Mamallapuram was a major port between the fifth and ninth centuries. Stone carving is still a thriving tradition here. This afternoon, we head out to visit the temple and cave complexes at Mamallapuram, with their open-air bas-reliefs and rathas (chariots) carved from single boulders. Our visits include the beautiful Shore Temple towering above the sea and the famous low-relief carving known as Arjuna's Penance. All of these creations, made between the 5th and 9th centuries when the Pallava Kingdom was at its zenith, are beautifully detailed and depict gods, animals, and scenes of everyday life in a natural and engaging style. The temples are now a UNESCO World Heritage Site. We also visit the outdoor museum of Dakshinachitra, a center for South India's living traditions of art, architecture, crafts, and performing arts. Overnight at Radisson Blu Resort Temple Bay or Taj Fisherman's Cove Resort & Spa...BLD

Driving Time: About 3 hours

DAY 13 MAMALLAPURAM

We spend the day exploring more temples in Mamallapuram before gathering in the evening for a festive Farewell Dinner. Overnight at hotel...BLD

DAY 14 CHENNAI / DEPART

Transfer to the airport in Chennai (1-1.5 hour-drive) and depart on homewardbound flights...B

TAJ MAHAL AND JAIPUR EXTENSION

Legendary Rajasthan is full of spectacular color and wondrous reminders of its glorious past. On guided excursions, explore Jaipur, a walled city of pink stone and a treasure-trove of exuberant 18th and 19th century palaces; visit the haunting red sandstone ruins of the remote Mughal capital at Fatehpur Sikri; and watch a golden sunset and sunrise illuminate the legendary Taj Mahal, an exquisite white marble palace set on the banks of the Yamuna River in Agra. 4 days. From \$2,495.

KANHA NATIONAL PARK EXTENSION

Kanha is one of the Indian subcontinent's greatest wildlife reserves and a great place in India to see the Royal Bengal tiger. Besides tigers, there are more than 200 species of birds and some 22 species of mammals in residence here. On guided excursions, explore by jeep through the park's bamboo thickets, dadar (plateau grasslands) and sal forests, which gave birth to Rudyard Kipling's classic The Jungle Book. Overnights are at the Baagh Resort, a comfortable jungle-surrounded retreat adjacent to the edge of the park, or the Taj Banjaar Tola (deluxe option), an elegant tented camp on the banks of the Banjaar River overlooking Kanha. 5 days. From \$2,395.

VARANASI AND KHAJURAHO EXTENSION

As one of the seven sacred cities of Hinduism, the holy city of Varanasi is a magnet for more than a million pilgrims from around the world who come annually to worship, meditate, and bathe in the sacred waters of the Ganges River. With your private guide, stroll through ancient alleys and past golden temples and ashrams, and watch the slanting sun rise over haunting riverside ghats. At the World Heritage Site of Khajuraho, discover some of India's most famous temples, a showcase of sculpture reflecting the celebration of human activity in everyday life. Accommodations throughout are in garden-set hotels, oases of comfort after an active day of exploring. 4 days. From \$1,995.

Meeting Place: A complimentary transfer is provided from the Cochin International Airport to our group hotel, no matter when you arrive. Our WT representative will meet you outside the customs area and will be holding a Wilderness Travel sign. In the evening we gather for a Welcome Dinner.

DEPARTURE

Chennai, India

Suggested Airport: Chennai International Airport (MAA) Suggested Date & Time: Day 14, anytime

A complimentary transfer is provided from the group hotel to the Chennai International Airport, no matter when you depart.

The transfer from the group hotel to the Chennai International Airport can take up to 1.5 hours, depending on traffic.

INTERNATIONAL AIR TRAVEL

You are responsible for making your own arrangements for flights to and from Cochin/Chennai.

There are many online consolidators for booking travel, but for more personal help arranging air transport, you can contact Exito Travel at 970-818-8459 in the US or Canada. Depending on your routing, it is necessary to depart from the US one or possibly two days prior to Day 1. The name on your airline ticket must match the name on your passport exactly, and your passport must be valid for at least six months after your date of return to the US.

Once your tickets have been purchased, please send us a copy of your airline schedule so we can reserve your airport transfers. Accommodations



BRUNTON BOATYARD

Kochi, India Days 1 to 2 (2 nights)

Set by the water's edge in Fort Kochi, the Brunton Boatyard is a 19th century shipyard that was converted into a charming 22-room hotel that captures the ambience of a bygone era. All the guest rooms are beautifully furnished in colonial-style antiques and have balconies with stunning views of the bustling Kochi harbor.



TRADITIONAL HOUSEBOAT

Alleppey, India Day 3 (1 night)

The beautiful houseboats of Kerala, called kettuvallams, were once used to transport rice, spices, and other goods to the port of Cochin. Today these delightful 80-foot barges make fantastic overnight accommodations for a journey along the lagoons of Kerala. The private, air-conditioned houseboats come in a variety of shapes and sizes but all are still constructed using the traditional method of tying boards together with rope (not a single nail is used!). Each houseboat has an open-air sitting area and deck, double sleeping cabins with private bathroom and showers, and a crew of four including a chef who prepares Keralan specialties. Floating along the scenic waterways aboard a beautiful private kettuvallam is the quintessential experience of tropical South India.



SPICE VILLAGE HOTEL

Periyar, India Days 4 to 5 (2 nights)

A marvelous eco-friendly hideaway, Spice Village has about 60 thatched bungalows scattered in a park-like setting. The bungalows aren't air-conditioned but the altitude, breezes, and forested surroundings make them very comfortable. The bar, once the park headquarters for Periyar, has a charming atmosphere and the feel of an old colonial club in the middle of a jungle. The grounds are full of fragrant spice plants and the garden supplies vegetables for the hotel's two restaurants, which offer authentic Keralan dishes as well as other options. There's a lovely swimming pool.

GATEWAY HOTEL PASUMALAI

Madurai, India Days 6 to 7 (2 nights)

This restored colonial home, with its unique hilltop location overlooking the temple city of Madurai, is full of character and charm. Built atop Pasumalai Hill amid 62 acres of tranquil gardens, it is a former governors' residence that feels more like a house than a hotel. The old-fashioned rooms blend colonial touches with modern amenities, and if you sit on the patio terrace to take in the views, you might be able to hear the chanting coming from the temples in the city below. You couldn't ask for a more peaceful refuge after a day of exploring Madurai's bustling bazaars and towering temples. The pool, spa, and attentive staff add to a pleasant stay.



BANGALA HOTEL

Karaikudi, India Day 8 (1 night)

The Bangala is a family-run heritage hotel in Karaikudi, the main town in Chettinad country. It has been in the same family for 100 years and was transformed into a 34-room hotel about 12 years ago, centered around the original colonial garden. It has a relaxed ambience and a traditional kitchen that serves authentic Chettinad cuisine.



MANTRA KOODAM

Kumbakonam, India Days 9 to 10 (2 nights)

This eco-friendly hotel is spread over landscaped acres along the banks of the Veera Chozha River. It has comfortable air-conditioned guest cottages, a pool, and a restaurant that serves classic South Indian vegetarian cuisine prepared the traditional way. Ayurvedic spa treatments and yoga sessions are available.

HOTELS IN PONDICHERRY

Pondicherry, India Day 11 (1 night)

In Pondicherry, we stay at one of the following properties:

PALAIS DE MAHE

The boutique Palais de Mahe is set in the colonial area of Pondicherry near the seaside promenade. Guest rooms are spacious, with high ceilings, and the hotel's verandas, courtyard, and period furniture give it a French Colonial atmosphere. The poolside café is good place to relax and there a lovely rooftop bar and restaurant. All the attractions of the French Quarter are within walking distance.

GRAND HOTEL D'EUROPE

Set in the heart of Pondicherry, this heritage property dates to 1891 and exudes a welcoming touch of French ambiance. Clean and spacious guestrooms feature high ceilings and large windows, while amenities include a swimming pool and spa.

HOTELS IN MAHABALIPURAM

Mahabalipuram, India, Day 12 and 13 (2 nights)

In Mahabalipuram, we stay at one of the following properties:

RADISSON BLU RESORT TEMPLE BAY

Spread across 46 acres along a stretch of private beach, this resort complex has spacious, well-kept rooms, either beachside or poolside, as well as a huge swimming pool, spa services, and multiple dining options. It's an easy walk to many of the shops and monuments at Mamallapuram.

TAJ FISHERMAN'S COVE RESORT AND SPA

Set on the site of an Old Dutch fort, these contemporary cottages are spread across 48 acres along the coastline facing the waters of the Bay of Bengal. The hotel has a variety of restaurants from Seagull, one of Chennai's most popular for Indian and Continental cuisine, to Bay View, an outdoor coastal retreat with thatched-roof gazebos overlooking the sea. The Sun Burst Bar and Upper Deck are additional spots to lounge in the breeze with a glass of Sangria. Guest rooms feature modern furnishings, Egyptian cotton linens, and have ocean or garden views. Take a dip in the outdoor pool, relax with a massage, or work up a sweat in the fitness center.

Trip Details

WHAT THE TRIP IS LIKE

This trip is Level 1+, easy, according to our trip grading system. It is a vehicle-based cultural and natural history adventure. Accommodations are in hotels and lodges.

Although this is not a difficult trip, please remember that travel in India is an intense experience. The essential requirements are flexibility, a sense of humor, curiosity, enthusiasm about new peoples and places, and an openness to the unexpected.

WEATHER

We expect temperatures to be warm to hot, ranging through the mid-70Fs to 80Fs. During this season, the average high temperature on the coast at Kochi is recorded as 86F. At higher elevations, such as at Periyar, it is much cooler. The south of India has two distinct monsoon seasons: one in summer and another from October to mid-November. We don't expect heavy rain to be a problem on our trip, but there can be occasional showers at any time between November and February.

Please show respect for the cultures we are visiting by observing local customs concerning appropriate dress, particularly in sacred places. Your Trip Leader is always available to answer any questions that you may have regarding this. If it is necessary to use a cell phone during the trip, please do so privately. Smoking is rarely an issue these days, but if you do smoke, please do so only away from the group.
