Experience the Rocky Mountain splendor and phenomenal wildlife of Yellowstone and the Grand Tetons! We'll track the iconic wolf packs of Yellowstone, hike in the majestic landscapes of the Grand Tetons, drift down the Snake River by private dory, and witness the geological wonder of Yellowstone, including the spectacular Grand Canyon of the Yellowstone River. Each day brings us something different, whether we're hiking the inspiring trails, discovering fumaroles and mud pots, or spotting an amazing variety of wildlife—from herds of bison to elusive wolf packs on the prowl (our Trip Leader is involved with the local wolf-monitoring community). We've set the trip for September, when Yellowstone edges into its autumn glory and the bugling call of the bull elk echoes across the valleys. Traveling with a highly knowledgeable biologist Trip Leader maximizes our chances of spotting wildlife and we'll get an "insider" opportunity to learn about Yellowstone's ecology, scientific studies, and conservation efforts. Begin your journey with an extension to hidden Flat Creek Ranch for three idyllic days of hiking, horseback riding, and fly fishing.





## Itinerary

### DAY 1

#### JACKSON HOLE, WYOMING / WELCOME DINNER / PRE-TRIP EXTENSION TO FLAT CREEK RANCH

Arrive in Jackson, where you are met for a transfer to Huff House Inn, located just a couple blocks from the historic main square in Jackson. Tonight we'll gather for our Welcome Dinner. Overnight at the Huff House Inn and Cabins...D

Pre-Trip Extension: Begin your adventure at hidden Flat Creek Ranch for idyllic days of hiking, horseback riding, and fly fishing (4 nights/5 days).

### DAY 2

#### WILDLIFE VIEWING IN THE GRAND TETONS / NATIONAL MUSEUM OF WILDLIFE ART

The morning is for wildlife viewing in magnificent Grand Teton National Park.. In the afternoon, we'll visit Jackson's renowned National Museum of Wildlife Art, which overlooks the National Elk Refuge. This famous museum features wildlife art by prominent artists such as Georgia O'Keeffe, Andy Warhol, Robert Kuhn, and John James Audubon. We'll enjoy lunch at the museum's restaurant. Dinner is on our own, and the Trip Leader will be happy to make recommendations, depending on how local or fancy you want to go. Overnight at the Huff House Inn and Cabins...BL

### DAY 3

#### WILDLIFE VIEWING / GRAND TETON N.P. TO YELLOWSTONE

We'll be up early (6:00 am) to start our full day of wildlife viewing as we head through the Grand Tetons and up to the North Entrance of Yellowstone National Park. It's a full day of exploring, with many incredible stops en route and a gourmet packed picnic lunch in the field. The Trip Leader knows the best spots along the way to look for wildlife, which should include moose, bison, and pronghorn. By the afternoon, we'll be in the world of Yellowstone's impressive geothermal wonders, including Old Faithful geyser. Dinner tonight is in Gardiner and we'll stay overnight at the 406 Lodge, just outside the park's north entrance... BLD

Approximate Driving time: 4 hours, plus stops for breakfast, lunch and wildlife viewing, for a total of about 8 hours

### DAY 4

#### YELLOWSTONE / SUNRISE WOLF VIEWING / HIKING / WILDLIFE VIEWING

Our mornings begin early (about 5:30 am so we can take advantage of wildlife activity and the soft dawn light—and see sunrise over the Tetons!), as we head into Yellowstone National Park, on the lookout for iconic packs of grey wolf. Mornings are the absolute best time for viewing them, when the packs are most active. In addition to wolves, we'll keep an

eye out for other wildlife from bison to elk, grizzly bear, black bear, pronghorn, otter, osprey, bald eagle, and coyote. Wolves reintroduction into Yellowstone in 1995 is considered one of America's best conservation success stories, a case study on the effect a single species can have on an entire ecosystem.

We'll meet a local wildlife photographer at his property between Cooke City and Yellowstone's northeast entrance to learn about living in this remote corner of Montana, fascinating wildlife encounters he's experienced over the years photographing in the area, and we'll also have time to visit his gallery and even photograph wildlife—from pine martens to foxes—that live around his cabin.

Wildlife viewing in Yellowstone is always good, but our visit in September means we're here at the time the bull elks are making their famous mating season bugling calls and rounding up their harems. Migrating hawks and eagles begin their flights south, soaring over the mountains, and bears return to lower elevations to fatten up by gorging on berries before hibernation. The fall hues of orange and gold make this month absolutely spectacular for photography. We head back to Gardiner for dinner. Overnight at 406 Lodge...BLD  
Approximate Driving time: 2-3 hours, plus stops for wildlife viewing





## DAY 5

### WILDLIFE VIEWING / GRAND CANYON OF THE YELLOWSTONE RIVER

We'll start our journey south towards Jackson this morning with more opportunities for wildlife viewing en route. After a picnic lunch in the field, we visit the spectacular Grand Canyon of the Yellowstone River, over a thousand feet deep and graced with multi-colored walls and thundering waterfalls. Our leisurely walk to the waterfall overlook reveals Yellowstone's complex geologic history in dramatic shapes and colors. Puffs of steam mark the hydrothermal features of the canyon's walls and both the Upper and Lower Falls are grand cascades. Arriving in Jackson in the late afternoon, we check into our hotel, the Bentwood Inn, for our overnight...

## DAY 6

### BRIDGER TETON NATIONAL FOREST HIKE / FLOAT TRIP ON THE SNAKE RIVER

Our hike today brings us far away from the crowds of Grand Teton National Park for a much better hiking experience in 3.4-million-acre Bridger Teton National Forest, with its abundant wildlife and immense wildlands. We'll enjoy a packed lunch en route. In the late afternoon, we'll embark on a 1.5-hour float trip aboard a private, hand-crafted vintage dory (wooden boat) to drift down a calm stretch of the Snake River as it winds through Grand Teton National Park. With the eye-catching peaks of the Grand Tetons on the horizon, we'll keep an eye out for wildlife, particularly bald eagles, before arriving at the private Tipi Camp for our celebratory Farewell Dinner in a pristine riverside setting, a time to reflect on our week amid the wildlife wonders of Yellowstone and the Tetons. Overnight at the Bentwood Inn...BLD

# Flat Creek Ranch Extension (pre-trip only)



Ride a horse, fish in a legendary trout stream, hike the trails of Bridger-Teton National Forest. Historic Flat Creek Ranch (nearest neighbor—10 miles away!) is a fantastic getaway for couples, families, and friends. Enjoy your own cozy cabin and fine dining in the main lodge. This extension can be taken either pre- or post-trip and must begin on a Friday.

## DAY 1 FLAT CREEK RANCH

An afternoon transfer brings you 16 miles across the National Elk Refuge and into the mountains over a private jeep track. At the end of the road, you reach the hidden Flat Creek Ranch, where you are welcomed for cocktail hour and dinner at the ranch. Flat Creek Ranch offers five log cabins with creekside or lake views and a main lodge building whose kitchen is supplied with local, organic meat and produce. Overnight at Flat Creek Ranch...BD

## DAY 2 TRAIL RIDING / FLY FISHING

Head out this morning for a half-day horseback ride in the Gros Ventre National Wilderness Area, with 287,000 acres of pine forests, mountains, and steep valleys. Return for a delicious lunch at the ranch. In the afternoon, try your hand at fly fishing, with instruction, on the ranch's mile-and-a-half stretch of upper Flat Creek's challenging waters or on 50-acre Flat Creek Lake. Enjoy appetizers and dinner tonight at the ranch. Overnight at Flat Creek Ranch...BLD

## DAY 3 BRIDGER-TETON NATIONAL FOREST HIKE

Today get out and active with a half-day hike in Bridger-Teton National Forest. There are rigorous hikes or easy ambles that will bring you across elk trails and brilliant meadows with stunning views. Your afternoon is at leisure to read a book on the porch of your private cabin, hop on one of the stand-up paddle boards, or kayaks and head out onto the lake. Enjoy

appetizers and dinner tonight at the ranch. Overnight at Flat Creek Ranch...BLD

## DAY 4 MORNING AT THE RANCH / JOIN MAIN TRIP OR DEPART FOR HOME

If you take this extension pre-trip, you'll be transferred to Jackson after breakfast to join the main Yellowstone & Grand Teton Wildlife Adventure. If you take it post-trip, you will have one last morning at the ranch before returning to Jackson Hole Airport for your flight home. Departing flights should leave between noon and 4:00 pm...B

## HUFF HOUSE INN AND CABINS

Bentwood Inn, one of the National Geographic Unique Lodges of the World, has a secluded location five miles from the town of Jackson. # What the Trip is Like

## WHAT THE TRIP IS LIKE

The trip is Level 2+, Easy to Moderate, according to our trip grading system. Wildlife viewing takes place during drives and on nature walks on mountain roads. The hikes cover a variety of terrain and are usually on well-marked trails. There is no extensive hiking on the trip, but you should be in good physical shape to enjoy it to the fullest. Jackson, Wyoming, is at an altitude of 6,200 feet and Gardiner, Montana, is at 5,200 feet. The hikes and drives within the national park are at altitudes upwards of 8,800 feet, and can be higher on some hikes. If we drive on the Beartooth Highway, the altitude reaches 11,000 feet.

## WEATHER

The months between Memorial Day through Labor Day weekend are exceptionally beautiful in Yellowstone, although they draw the highest volumes of visitors. From June through August, average temperatures are in the 60s and 70s, making for great hiking conditions. Excellent months to visit are from mid-May through early June and between September and October, when there are fewer crowds. Spring in Yellowstone can be unpredictable, with the park emerging from winter hibernation. It can be quite cold (20F to 50F, so plan to pack layers). Visiting Yellowstone in September and early October can be especially exciting because the elk are in rut. The weather is cooler, with average daytime temperatures ranging from 35F to low 60F. Park facilities such as visitors' centers can close as early as mid-October.

## ACCOMMODATIONS

Accommodations are in comfortable hotels and lodges ideally located to avoid crowds and get you as close as possible to the best wildlife viewing.
