Experience the jaw-dropping beauty and teeming wildlife of Yellowstone and the Grand Tetons with your own private naturalist guide! On our week-long Private Journey, you'll look for the iconic wolf packs of Yellowstone's amazing Lamar Valley, often called America's Serengeti, savor the magnificent spectacle of the Grand Tetons, with their tooth-like peaks and sapphire lakes, and see the scintillating hues of the Grand Canyon of the Yellowstone River. Each day brings something different, whether you're discovering geothermal wonders, hiking the inspiring trails, or spotting an amazing variety of wildlife—from herds of bison to elusive wolf packs on the prowl (your naturalist guide is very involved with the local wolf-monitoring community). The grand finale finds you drifting down the meandering Snake River on a private wooden dory for a riverside dinner. Traveling with a knowledgeable private guide is the best way to maximize your chances of seeing wildlife, avoiding crowds, and getting an "insider" opportunity to learn about Yellowstone's ecology, scientific studies, and conservation efforts. Come take a closer look at the natural wonders we have right here in the US, and at journey's end, extend to the hidden Flat Creek Ranch for days of hiking, horseback riding, and fly fishing (this can also be done pre-trip).



Itinerary

DAY 1 JACKSON HOLE, WYOMING

Arrive in Jackson Hole, where you are met for a transfer to Huff House Inn and Cabins, right in the town of Jackson just two blocks from its main square. Huff House offers spectacular views of the Teton Mountain Range. Enjoy a Welcome Dinner and trip orientation with your naturalist Trip Leader...D

Pre-trip Extension: Begin your adventure at Flat Creek Ranch for idyllic days of hiking, horseback riding, and fly fishing (Flat Creek Ranch extensions must begin on a Monday or a Friday. Extensions that start on a Monday are 4 nights/5 days in length. Extensions that start on a Friday are 3 nights/4 days in length.)

DAY 2 WILDLIFE VIEWING IN GRAND TETON NATIONAL PARK / NATIONAL MUSEUM OF WILDLIFE ART

The morning is for wildlife viewing in magnificent Grand Teton National Park. In the afternoon, you'll visit Jackson's renowned National Museum of Wildlife Art, which overlooks the National Elk Refuge. This famous museum features wildlife art by prominent artists such as Georgia O'Keeffe, Andy Warhol, Robert Kuhn, and John James Audubon. We'll enjoy lunch at the museum's restaurant. Dinner is on our own, and your Trip Leader will be happy to make recommendations, depending on how local or fancy you want to go. Overnight at the Huff House Inn and Cabins...BL

DAY 3 GRAND TETON N.P. TO YELLOWSTONE / SUNRISE VIEWING / GEOTHERMAL HOTSPOTS

An early morning wildlife viewing excursion reveals more of Grand Teton's diverse natural history and wildlife, after which enjoy a gourmet packed lunch in the field. Wildlife viewing is always good in this region, with early summer the time when the wolves have their pups, and autumn the time when the elk make their famous mating-season bugling calls. Your guide will lead you to the best spots to see moose, bison, pronghorn antelope, and more. This afternoon, you'll have the opportunity to visit some of the many geothermal wonders in Yellowstone. This evening, continue through the park to Gardiner for dinner. Overnight at the 406 Lodge or the Yellowstone Gateway Inn...BLD

Approximate Driving time: 4 hours, plus stops for wildlife viewing

DAY 4 SUNRISE WOLF VIEWING / LAMAR VALLEY OF YELLOWSTONE

With another early morning start (about 5:30 am if desired), head out to explore the Lamar Valley of Yellowstone National Park, hoping for a glimpse of the iconic packs of grey wolf. Mornings are the best time for viewing, when the packs

are most active. Besides wolves, the valley is renowned for other wildlife, from bison to elk, grizzly bears, black bears, antelope, otters, osprey, bald eagles, and coyotes. The drive to the valley takes about an hour, and when you get there, you will join other wolf enthusiasts with their spotting scopes in hopes of seeing the wolves of this valley. Their reintroduction into Yellowstone in 1995 is considered one of America's best conservation success stories, a case study on the effect a single species can have on an entire ecosystem. After lunch at a local eatery, stop by the house of Dan Harman, a local character and wildlife photographer who lives in a log cabin between Cooke City and Yellowstone's Northeast Entrance. Dan's place is a phenomenal setting for seeing the prolific local birdlife, with great up-close photo opportunities. Overnight at the 406 Lodge or the Yellowstone Gateway Inn...BLD

Approximate Driving time: 2-3 hours, plus stops for wildlife viewing

DAY 5 WILDLIFE VIEWING / GRAND CANYON OF THE YELLOWSTONE RIVER

Start the journey south towards Jackson this morning with more opportunities for wildlife viewing en route. Visit the spectacular Grand Canyon of the Yellowstone River, a



thousand feet deep with multi-colored walls and a thundering waterfall, and enjoy a walk to the waterfall overlook reveals Yellowstone's complex geologic history in dramatic shapes and colors. Puffs of steam mark the hydrothermal features of the canyon's walls and both the Upper and Lower Falls are grand cascades. You'll enjoy a picnic lunch en route. Arrive in the late afternoon at your accommodation, with dinner on your own. Overnight at Huff House Inn and Cabins or Brentwood Inn...BL

Approximate Driving time: 4 hours, plus stops for wildlife viewing

Upgrade Option: Hotel Jackson

DAY 6 OPTIONAL ACTIVITIES / JACKSON / SNAKE RIVER FLOAT

This morning, you have the option to rise early to watch a splendid sunrise over Grand Teton National Park and the towering peaks of the Teton Range. Later you have the choice between a hike away from the crowds in Bridger Teton National Forest or you can opt for another activity including

horseback riding, whitewater rafting, biking, or kayaking (these are an additional cost). You'll have some free time to explore the shops and galleries in Jackson before embarking on an evening float trip aboard a private, hand-crafted dory (wooden boat). You'll drift down the Snake River, keeping an eye out for bald eagles and other wildlife before arriving at the private Tipi Camp for a celebratory Farewell Dinner in a pristine riverside setting. Overnight at Huff House Inn and Cabins or Brentwood Inn...BLD

Upgrade Option: Hotel Jackson

DAY 7 DEPART / OR JOIN FLAT CREEK RANCH EXTENSION

After breakfast, transfer to the airport for departure, or join our post-trip Flat Creek Ranch Extension (Flat Creek Ranch extensions must begin on a Monday or a Friday. Extensions that start on a Monday are 4 nights/5 days in length. Extensions that start on a Friday are 3 nights/4 days in length.)...B

Flat Creek Ranch Extension



Ride a horse, fish in a legendary trout stream, hike the trails of Bridger-Teton National Forest. Historic Flat Creek Ranch (nearest neighbor—10 miles away!) is a fantastic getaway for couples, families, and friends. Enjoy your own cozy cabin and fine dining in the main lodge. This extension can be taken either pre- or post-trip and must begin on a Friday.

DAY 1 FLAT CREEK RANCH

An afternoon transfer brings you 16 miles across the National Elk Refuge and into the mountains over a private jeep track. At the end of the road, you reach the hidden Flat Creek Ranch, where you are welcomed for cocktail hour and dinner at the ranch. Flat Creek Ranch offers five log cabins with creekside or lake views and a main lodge building whose kitchen is supplied with local, organic meat and produce. Overnight at Flat Creek Ranch...BD

DAY 2 TRAIL RIDING / FLY FISHING

Head out this morning for a half-day horseback ride in the Gros Ventre National Wilderness Area, with 287,000 acres of pine forests, mountains, and steep valleys. Return for a delicious lunch at the ranch. In the afternoon, try your hand at fly fishing, with instruction, on the ranch's mile-and-a-half stretch of upper Flat Creek's challenging waters or on 50-acre Flat Creek Lake. Enjoy appetizers and dinner tonight at the ranch. Overnight at Flat Creek Ranch...BLD

DAY 3 BRIDGER-TETON NATIONAL FOREST HIKE

Today get out and active with a half-day hike in Bridger-Teton National Forest. There are rigorous hikes or easy ambles that will bring you across elk trails and brilliant meadows with stunning views. Your afternoon is at leisure to read a book on the porch of your private cabin, hop on one of the stand-up paddle boards, or kayaks and head out onto the lake. Enjoy

appetizers and dinner tonight at the ranch. Overnight at Flat Creek Ranch...BLD

DAY 4 MORNING AT THE RANCH / JOIN MAIN TRIP OR DEPART FOR HOME

If you take this extension pre-trip, you'll be transferred to Jackson after breakfast to join the main Yellowstone & Grand Teton Wildlife Adventure. If you take it post-trip, you will have one last morning at the ranch before returning to Jackson Hole Airport for your flight home. Departing flights should leave between noon and 4:00 pm...B

HUFF HOUSE INN AND CABINS

406 LODGE

Hotel Jackson is a boutique property just steps away from the galleries, restaurants, and the elk-antler arches of Jackson's town square. There are 55 guest rooms including four suites, plus a charming restaurant and cozy bar. Every guest room and suite has a natural gas fireplace, and the rooftop hot tub offers a place to relax after a day's activities.

ARRIVAL & MEETING PLACE

Jackson, Wyoming

Suggested Airport: Jackson Hole Airport (JAC)
Suggested Date & Time: Day 1, morning or afternoon

Meeting Place: A complimentary transfer is provided from the Jackson Hole airport to the hotel for all trip members arriving on Day 1. For those arriving by car, you can leave your vehicle in the airport's overflow parking lot for the duration of the trip.

For those taking the Flat Creek Ranch Extension, complimentary transfers will be provided to and from the Jackson Hole Airport. Departing flights can leave Jackson any time after 12:00 pm. Flights departing earlier than 12:00 pm will require an additional cost for an early transfer and/or may necessitate departing the ranch a day early.

Travelers arriving in Jackson by car and staying at Spring Creek Ranch at the start and end of the trip can leave their car at Spring Creek Ranch for the duration of the trip. Cars can also be left at Jackson airport's long-term parking for \$17 per day (should be pre-booked to ensure availability).

DEPARTURE

AIR TRAVEL

You are responsible for making your own arrangements for flights to and from Wyoming. There are many online consolidators for booking travel, but for more personal help arranging air transport, you can contact Exito Travel at 1-800-655-4053 in the US or 1-800-670-2605 in Canada. They are very adept at putting flight itineraries together, to even the most far-flung places. More information can be found at www.exitotravel.com.

Depending on your routing, it may be necessary to depart from the US one day prior to Day 1 of the trip itinerary.

Please do not purchase your tickets until you are confirmed on the trip. Once tickets are purchased, please forward a copy of your email flight confirmation from the airline. It is your responsibility to ensure your flight times coordinate with the arrival and departure logistics for this trip.

What the Trip is Like

TRIP LEVEL

The trip is Level 2, Easy to Moderate, according to our trip grading system. Wildlife viewing takes place during drives and nature walks on mountain roads. There is the option for hikes of your choice, covering a variety of terrain and usually on well-marked trails. There is no extensive hiking on the trip, but you should be in good physical shape to enjoy it to the fullest. Accommodations are in comfortable hotels and lodges ideally located to avoid crowds and get you as close as possible to the best wildlife viewing. Jackson, Wyoming, is at an altitude of 6,200 feet and Gardiner, Montana, is at 5,200 feet. The hikes and drives within the national park are at altitudes upwards of 8,800 feet, and can be higher on some hikes. If we drive on the Beartooth Highway, the altitude reaches 11,000 feet.

WEATHER

The months between Memorial Day through Labor Day weekend are exceptionally beautiful in Yellowstone, although they draw the highest volumes of visitors. From June through August, average temperatures are in the 60s and 70s, making for great hiking conditions. Excellent months to visit are from mid-May through early June and between September and October, with fewer crowds. Spring in Yellowstone can be unpredictable, with the park emerging from winter hibernation. It can be quite cold (around 20F to 50F) so be sure to pack warm layers. Visiting Yellowstone in September and early October can be especially exciting because the elk are in rut. The weather is cooler, with average daytime temperatures ranging from 35F to low 60F. Park facilities such as visitors' centers can close as early as mid-October.
