And, you experience all this at a significant savings compared with high season safaris, as well as notable savings on airfare. Itinerary

DAY 1, APRIL 8, 2024

VICTORIA FALLS / ILALA LODGE

Arrive at Zimbabwe's Victoria Falls Airport, where you'll be met by your private guide for your transfer to our accommodation, the family-operated Ilala Lodge. This relaxing hotel has an ideal location just minutes from spectacular Victoria Falls. Guest rooms have nice beds and all rooms have access to the central garden area. The early afternoon is free to settle into your room, have a swim, or unwind on your patio. Keep an eye out for local wildlife—warthogs and impala are known to graze on the hotel's lawn. Later in the day, you will be transported to the banks of the Zambezi River to witness your first Zimbabwean sunset aboard a sundowner cruise (canapes and drinks included!). We'll float up the river, on the lookout for animals coming down to drink or the many hippo that often pop up to welcome us. After disembarking, the evening will be spent back at Ilala Lodge enjoying a Welcome Dinner. Overnight at Ilala Lodge...D

DAY 2, APRIL 9, 2024

VICTORIA FALLS / HWANGE NATIONAL PARK / NEHIMBA LODGE

Known as Mosi-oa-Tunya, or "the smoke that thunders," the cascade of Victoria Falls extends more than a mile across the Zambezi River (that's more than twice the size of Niagara Falls!). This World Heritage Site and natural wonder offers us an unforgettable introduction to our safari. After breakfast, our guide whisks us to the mighty Falls to take in the spectacular vistas and walk through the rainforest, enjoying a guided tour and incredible scenes of the cascades of water—a once-in-a-lifetime experience! We'll then head to the airport to catch a flight to the Giraffe Springs airstrip and look for game as we drive to Nehimba Lodge in Hwange National Park. Spanning some 5,600 square miles, Hwange is both the first (founded in 1928) and largest park in the nation. It is home to some of the highest concentrations of elephant on the planet (around 44,000) along with lion, leopard, and buffalo, and it's world famous as a birding destination. Nehimba is the perfect spot for exploring northern Hwange, with its mopane woodland and sand river environment. Nehimba's raised, thatched chalets arc around a lively watering hole frequented by elephants and other wildlife, including herds of buffalo and wild dog. Dinner is served outdoors with good views of the activity at the waterhole. After dinner, you can join an optional night game drive to spot the animals that are just starting their "day." Overnight at Nehimba Lodge...BLD

DAY 3, APRIL 10, 2024

NEHIMBA SEEP / NEHIMBA LODGE

Today we head out for game drives and game walks to explore more of the northern reaches of Hwange, which is distinctly different from the southern area of the park in its topography, habitats, and species of wildlife. At the Nehimba Seep, an ancient source of water once used by San Bushmen, we'll stop for a tea break and wildlife viewing. Elephants still come here to dig for water and nourishing minerals in the soil. We'll head back to the lodge for lunch and a siesta or a swim in the pool (with elephants often sipping from the waterhole just yards away). Our late afternoon game drive ends with cool

refreshments at sunset overlooking a famed waterhole. Dinner is back at the lodge, with an evening to relax around the campfire and discuss the day's events. Overnight at Nehimba Lodge...BLD



DAY 4, APRIL 11, 2024

ELEPHANT EXPRESS / BOMANI TENTED LODGE

Wake up to morning birdsong and set out for an early game walk, a great way to experience Hwange on foot and see the small details of the bush, such as bird's nests and game tracks. After a hearty brunch back at the lodge, we head 2-3 hours to the railway depot at Dete to catch the Elephant Express, a vintage open-air railway car that glides along the historic track built in 1904 by Cecil Rhodes. We'll savor lunch on board and enjoy exciting afternoon game viewing in comfort as we travel deeper into the park. At Ngamo, we disembark and head to Bomani Tented Lodge, just a 15-minute drive away. Bomani's spacious tents are set around a very active waterhole within a private concession on the magnificent Ngamo Plains, the largest savanna grasslands in Hwange. The mix of grasslands and woodlands provides the perfect mosaic of habitats for the full spectrum of both grazing and browsing herbivores resident in Hwange and the carnivores that prey on them—lion, leopard, painted dog, cheetah, and hyena. This abundance of wildlife provides some of the best game viewing to be found anywhere in Zimbabwe. After settling in, we'll enjoy a festive dinner under the stars. Overnight at Bomani Tented Lodge...BLD

DAY 5, APRIL 12, 2024

RHINO SANCTUARY / COBRAS COMMUNITY WILDLIFE PROTECTION UNIT / WALKING SAFARI

After enjoying early morning tea and coffee on the deck of your tent, we'll visit the Rhino Sanctuary. Our partners in Zimbabwe, Imvelo Safari Lodges, are proud and excited to be spearheading the return of white rhino in Hwange under the auspices of the Community Rhino Conservation Initiative (CRCI). The CRCI concept is to establish a highly protected rhino sanctuary on community land bordering the park. We'll tour the sanctuary headquarters, meet some of the Community Wildlife Protection Scouts on duty today, and spend time with the rhino and the rangers who guard them 24/7 (great photo opportunities!). We'll also join the Cobras Community Wildlife Protection Unit for a display of their prowess—a challenging physical fitness routine and a demonstration of their shooting skills. We'll hear a short talk describing the origins and ideas behind the formation of the Cobras unit, and their important role in the new rhino conservation project that was launched in June 2022 at the Imvelo Wildlife Sanctuary. After a rest back at Bomani and maybe a dip in the pool, we enjoy a late afternoon game walk led by our expert Zimbabwean guide. Every walk provides fascinating insights into Hwange's circle of life. We may see elephants



shake the acacia trees to eat the nutritious pods, while on a smaller scale, dung beetles roll elephant dung containing acacia seeds into balls and bury them, thus making the acacia seed ready to germinate and grow into a new tree. Before sunset, we'll stop at a watering hole to watch sunset, then head back to the lodge to freshen up before dinner. Overnight at Bomani Tented Lodge...BLD

DAY 6, APRIL 13, 2024

GAME VIEWING ON THE MFAGAZAAN PAN

After waking up to the sounds of the African bush and enjoying an early breakfast, we set out for a full day of game viewing. Elephant, giraffe, zebra, wildebeest, and impala are often seen in these parts. We'll set up for a picnic lunch, complete with chairs and tables, at the Mfagazaan Pan (seasonal lake bed) to watch the animals, and a leisurely drive brings us back to the lodge, spotting wildlife along the way. After dinner at the lodge, we enjoy a nightcap by the campfire, sharing stories and photos of the day's adventures. Overnight at Bomani Tented Lodge...BLD

DAY 7, APRIL 14, 2024

VILLAGE VISIT AND THE LOOK-UP BLIND

A memorable cultural opportunity is in store as we head to Ngunyana village and join the community in their morning activities. Our lodge here is also intentionally set on community land so that the benefits go directly to the community—not to distant government agencies—and so community members have an incentive to protect wildlife. We'll be welcomed warmly at the village, meeting the village leader, and as this is school holiday time, we'll even have a chance to bring some of the schoolchildren into the park on a game drive. This is a wonderful opportunity for the children to learn about the wildlife and the unique ecosystem that is being protected by the park, and in turn, we'll have a chance to learn a few words of Ndebele, their tribal "click" language. It is a tremendous experience for all involved—the children, especially, love to practice their English and learn about different cultures. Our late afternoon game drive brings us to a specially built underground game-viewing blind at Stoffie's Pan, where we enjoy sundowners and snout-level viewing of elephants. This ingenious blind gives us incredible close-up views, and is furnished with comfortable seating and a bathroom. Tonight we head out on a night drive, looking for species that prowl the plains after twilight. Dinner and overnight at Bomani Tented Lodge...BLD

DAY 8, APRIL 15, 2024

VICTORIA FALLS / ZAMBEZI NATIONAL PARK / VICTORIA FALLS RIVER LODGE

After another thrilling walking safari in Hwange's wilderness, we fly to

Victoria Falls and transfer to Zambezi National Park, whose northern border is formed by the Zambezi River. We arrive in the afternoon and settle in at Victoria Falls River Lodge, with its stunning setting on the banks of the river. Each spacious tent has river views and its own plunge pool on its private deck. Tonight's sundowners will be enjoyed on board our riverboat as we cruise along the Zambezi at sunset, watching for elephant, hippo, crocodile, and a great variety of birdlife as the sunset's gold and crimson hues reflect off the waters. Overnight at Victoria Falls River Lodge...BLD

DAY 9, APRIL 16, 2024

UPPER ZAMBEZI RIVER / VICTORIA FALLS RIVER LODGE

This morning we'll set off by canoe to drift along the Zambezi as it flows past the Siansimba Islands, where we keep an eye out for hippo, crocodile, elephant, buffalo, and the occasional lion or giraffe. We'll stop along the river for a relaxing waterside brunch, then head back to the lodge by vehicle. The afternoon is free to enjoy your private plunge pool and a light lunch. Tonight we have a final game drive with sundowners on the river bank, followed by our festive Farewell Dinner. Overnight at Victoria Falls River Lodge...BLD

DAY 10, APRIL 17, 2024

DEPART

After a leisurely brunch along the river, pack up for the short (one-hour) drive to Victoria Falls Airport. Depart on international flights...B

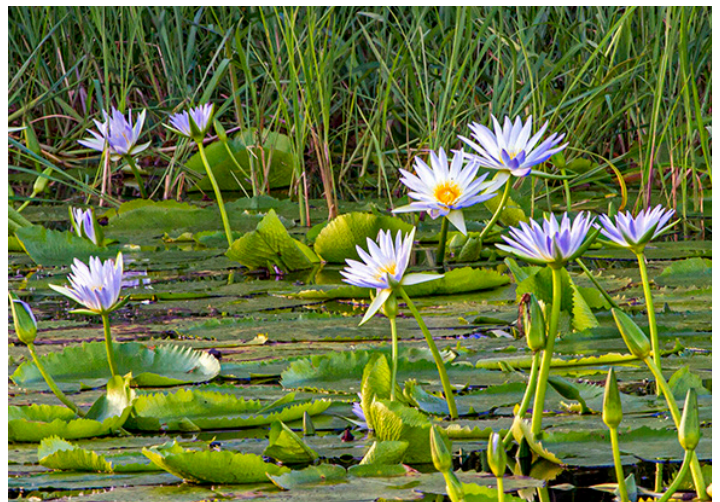

OKAVANGO DELTA SAFARI EXTENSION

The 800-mile-long Okavango—the river that never finds the sea—is rightfully considered one of the most incredible wilderness sanctuaries in Africa. Its inland delta system is the largest in the world, 8,000 square miles filled with water channels, lagoons, swamps, and islands. Apart from the outstanding beauty of the wetland habitat, this unique area supports and sustains a huge diversity of fauna and flora so that game viewing is excellent throughout the year, with elephants congregating along the lagoons and waterways and impala, wildebeest, red lechwe, zebra, giraffe, sable, and buffalo found on the game-rich floodplains, along with their predators—lion, leopard, cheetah, and hyena.

CAPE TOWN EXTENSION

INTERNATIONAL AIR TRAVEL

Depending on your routing, it is necessary to depart from the US one or possibly two days prior to Day 1 of the trip itinerary. The name on your airline ticket must match the name on your passport exactly, and your passport must be valid for at least six months after your date of return to the US.

Please do not purchase your tickets until you are confirmed on the trip. Once your tickets have been purchased, please send us a copy of your airline schedule so we can reserve your airport transfers. It is your responsibility to ensure your flight times coordinate with the arrival and departure logistics for this trip.

ILALA LODGE

Day 1 (1 night)

The family-operated Ilala Lodge is a relaxing hotel with an ideal location just minutes from spectacular Victoria Falls. Perfectly manicured gardens and thatched roofs set the scene as you are welcomed into the open-air lobby. Guest rooms have nice beds and all rooms have access to the central garden area. There is a pool if you wish to take a refreshing dip, or you can unwind on your patio. The award-winning Palm Restaurant is also located at the hotel, which offers views of the falls. Keep an eye out for local wildlife—warthogs and impala are known to graze on the hotel's lawn.



NEHIMBA LODGE

Hwange, Zimbabwe

Days 2 to 3 (2 nights)

Raised thatched tent chalets arcing around a watering hole make Nehimba Lodge a spectacular place to witness elephants and other animals drink and play in northern Hwange National Park. Whether you come during the green or dry season, Nehimba's location within the park offers fantastic opportunities to view a wide variety of birdlife like giant eagle owl, Burchell's sandgrouse, and red-billed francolin, and possibly see the famous elephant hunting lions that prowl this part of the park. Private, enclosed outdoor showers are attached to each chalet, and all have beautiful open-beam thatched ceilings and verandas overlooking the watering hole. For a refreshing dip, relax at the lodge's pool, and with luck, have an up-close encounter with elephants—they're known to come right up to the pool's edge!



BOMANI TENTED LODGE

Hwange National Park, Zimbabwe

Days 4 to 7 (4 nights)

Bomani offers nine spacious tents set on wooden decks overlooking the Ngamo Plain and the lodge's waterhole. All have private en suite bathrooms, hot running water, and electricity by diesel/solar generator. The main lodge overlooking Bomani Pan has an open-air dining room and bar built on a spectacular viewing platform. Bomani is community-based, helping support local schools and water projects, and the lodge's atmosphere achieves the perfect mix of luxury and "wildness."



VICTORIA FALLS RIVER LODGE

Victoria Falls, Zimbabwe

Days 8 to 9 (2 nights)

Set on the banks of the Zambezi River near magnificent Victoria Falls is the elegant Victoria Falls River Lodge. This property is actually the first private game lodge to be built within the Zambezi National Park, and its legacy still stands as one of the best locations for nearby activities and game viewing. Friendly staff welcome you in the open-air lobby and guide you to one of the lodge's meticulously designed thatched tents that are spread around the property. The thatched tents are constructed of canvas, glass, and timber, and each suite extends out onto its own private deck with a plunge pool and uninterrupted views of the Zambezi.

Why Travel to Zimbabwe in the Green Season?

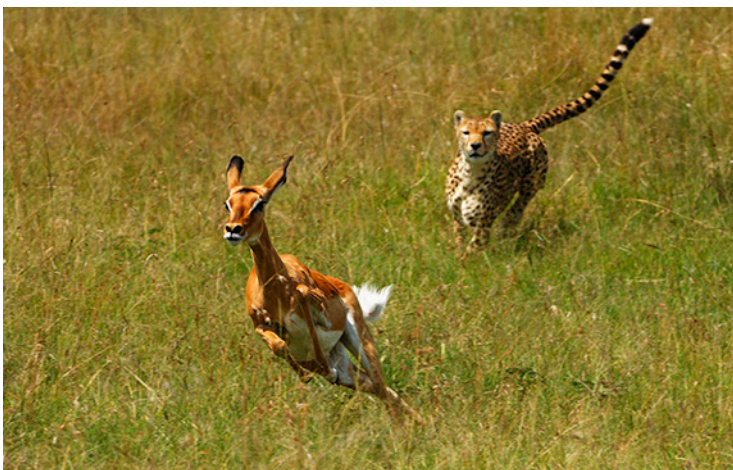
What will you experience in the “secret” season? Far fewer travelers, for starters. Most safari-goers throng to high-season departures. Travel with us in April, and you’ll have the grasslands and wildlife to yourself—and it is stunning! By traveling to Zimbabwe after the rains have transformed the landscape into a lush garden, you’ll see the photogenic baby animals born at the end of the dry season. The predator action is thrilling at this time as lion, cheetah, and leopard pursue the young antelopes and zebra.

You don’t have to be a birder to enjoy the experiences during Zim’s green season. Major species are in their full courtship plumage and displays as they enter breeding season. It is spectacular, and the grasslands are brimming with migratory species taking advantage of the abundance of nourishment. Flowers in bloom, grasses flourishing, dramatic skies and breathtaking sunsets—this is prime time for photographers as well.

Prices are phenomenal, not only for your safari, which can be \$1,000 less expensive than traveling during the height

of the season, but for your airfare too. You get all of the great safari experiences, but without the crowds, and at an extraordinary price. Join us!

What the Trip is Like

TRIP LEVEL

This trip is Level 2+ (Easy to Moderate) according to our trip grading system. It can be enjoyed by anyone in reasonably good health. Optional game walks are available.

Average Walking Day

- 1-2 hours, total
- 1-2 miles, total
- Flat terrain
- Optional horseback riding

How Tough is This Trip?

While we do not see major elevation gain or loss, you need to be able to walk on uneven surfaces and feel comfortable on your feet for up to 2 hours a day.

WEATHER

Generally, Zimbabwe has a mild climate because of its altitude (about 3,000 feet above sea level). In April, temperatures are comfortable (75°-85°F during the day, 45-55°F at night), but warm jackets and insulating layers are necessary on early morning game drives. We may experience occasional showers and muddy terrain, so a light rain jacket and shoes with good traction are also advisable.

ACCOMMODATIONS

Each of our safari lodges and camps has been meticulously designed to offer all comforts, a splash of luxury, and an exciting dash of African charm. On top of this, our locations have been carefully selected for two vital reasons; the local communities' dedication to our conservation partnership and their proximity to some of nature's most impressive wonders, from the famous Victoria Falls, to the mighty Zambezi River and Hwange National Park, famed for its thousands of elephants.

CUISINE

While on safari, breakfasts and evening meals are served at the lodge you are staying in. Lunches while traveling between destinations will be served picnic-style en route. Bottled water, soft drinks, juice, house wine, and beer are included throughout the trip. All vehicles are equipped with a fridge or cool box stocked with bottled water. Tea and coffee are offered by all accommodations free of charge with meals and at afternoon teatime.

TRANSPORTATION

On safari, there are long driving days over rugged dirt tracks, we can be in and out of the vehicles all day long, usually only driving approximately 2 hours at a time. We will be in a 7-seat open sided 4WD vehicle with a roof for sun protection. We sit 6 people max per vehicle to optimize everyone's view and provide wool blankets for early morning and evening game drives.

This is a truly unique safari in that we will be traveling by many different forms of transportation—we will take a vintage train car, a sunset boat cruise for 2 hours, and an optional canoe ride for 2 hours.

SAFETY

During drives and game walks, we can get quite close to wild animals at times. Being very quiet improves everybody's chances of observation.
